Strange happenings

It has been reported that several horses in the Clanfield, East Meon are of Hampshire have had plaits woven into their manes. These plaits are small and secreted. Also a horse has had its tail cut almost to the bone.

These incidents, although not regular occurrences, do happen. Owners must remain vigilant as to their horses condition.

Such interference could be linked with identifying future theft of horses or they could be linked to pagan or similar groups and their rites of passage in life.

As a suggestion any interference with your horse should be reported to the police or Horsewatch so incidents can be linked. Take photographs of the interference, i.e the plaits or whatever, so there is a record.

New Horse Market

Just to make you all aware that Salisbury Livestock market are now having horse and tack sales on the first Friday of every month. It is apparently being run by a chap from London who is hiring out the venue and not by the usual auctioneers. If this continues then it is a place that should be considered for visits in respect of a possible place of disposal for stolen horses and other equine related property.

Attention to our farmers and landowners in the Tandridge area

As many local farmers are well aware, there have been on-going incidents involving damage to farm gates and thefts across farmland and around farm compounds. This has not been exclusive to the Tandridge area but also in the West Kent area. Many farmers have become very disheartened at the perceived lack of action or slow response by Surrey Police.

There is a need to show a Police presence around the rural locations. This sounds simple but as you are well aware we (the Police) are being pulled and stretched in all directions. Local Police officers are the best resource to deal with issues around the rural locations, as they know better the area than their colleagues on TPT (Targeted Patrol Teams). With this in mind I have spoken to the local Police officers and Police Community Support Officers (PCSO's) at Oxted and Lingfield and we plan to carry out targeted patrols around the areas being hit.

Many incidents are on-going after 9pm at night when field gates are being rammed by vehicles and the occupants are driving across fields causing damage, involved in hare coursing or stealing property such as pheasant pens, feeders etc

And finally ...

At around 9pm on 11 September.. a Police patrol near Broadham Green (Hurst Green) stopped a vehicle, a search revealed scaffolding poles and other items ... 3 males arrested (the Police officer involved was driving around the country lanes looking for offenders causing farmers problems)

Also at around 11am on the same day another officer, whilst on patrol checking properties around the Ridge Woldingham, arrested a male caught removing copper pipes and like items from a house

It is unclear if the callers' thoughts are right. The horse has eyesight problems and hearing problems so although the gate was opened it maybe that the horse ran off startled and obtained the injuries prior to being found.
