What you read is from the owner

"Some time through the night, someone went to my field, which is 5 mins from the house, where my Arab stallion is running with his 2 mares, and cut through strands of high tensile barbed wire, tied back the fencing, and let him loose on the main Bransgore Road. Luckily all he wanted to do was get back to his mares so he didn't venture out onto the road, thank God.

Now, he would have had to have been led away from or herded out of the field to leave his girls, as you know no red-blooded male will leave his wives just to go wondering!!!. He has quite a few superficial injuries so God knows what has happened to him. Whoever did this went there with the intention of either stealing him or just letting him onto the road to be spiteful. They had the right tools to cut through the wire".

During the past two nights there have been attempts made to steal from cashpoint machines around the county by two, or possibly three males using an electric or petrol driven angle grinder to cut into the cashpoint machines.

They called between 10am and 11am saying they wished to "buy the field". They were told there was no field for sale and they left. They returned this evening circa 8.15pm on the same malarkey and again had the same response. They were told there was nothing for them to buy.

They became aware that, on leaving, their vehicle number was being taken down and at this they reacted badly and appeared to be going to cause some hassle. However, they left quietly. Apparently this is not the first time that they have been snooping around this area.

This is a metallic finish light blue transit van. The vehicle number is SJ08ZFW. The one occupant answers to the name of Sam and is the one wanting to do business.

It may be a suss for a theft or they could genuinely want to buy a field so that they can turn it in to a traveller site over a weekend when the Council are dozing.

Could react badly if forcefully challenged.
