Editor's Welcome

Dear Horsewatch Member

Stolen horses are a horse owner's worse nightmare. The incidents below highlight the fact that thefts are occurring and at present thieves are targeting Shetlands or perhaps similar in size. References to the thefts will also appear in individual sections within the bulletin.

Theft of horses is very difficult to prevent for all the obvious reasons. However, there are deterrents to prevent thefts and importantly identify horses to owners and this is freeze marking. The decision to do so is with YOU the owner. As with all stolen property the item taken is invariably only worth something if someone is prepared to buy it. So as horse owners or someone thinking of buying one only do so if you know who you are buying from.

YOU - the community have it in your power to prevent many horse thefts by closing down the possibility of a sale. YOU know that at present Shetlands are being stolen.....if you know someone who is selling, advertising Shetlands for sale, make some enquiries and if needs be report the matter to the police. Genuine sellers of horses have nothing to fear. YOU, the community, are best placed to enquire and investigate on behalf of your fellow horse owners who may be the victims of a horse theft.

Always remember never to put yourself in any danger if enquiring into any matters. Gathering information and passing it on to the police or your county Horsewatch will be just as useful.

Another worrying trend following on from the theft of horses is that the thieves will contact the owners of the horse saying they know where the horse is or can arrange for its recovery. The owner is only too grateful to recover the horse that they will gladly give up money as a reward! If YOU should be in this position seek advice from your police. Always make sure YOU know who your investigating officer is so you can keep him/her informed.

Subject: stolen Shetlands

There has been a run on stealing Shetlands in the past week or so. 7 have gone missing to date. At a recent sale this type would make up to £1000 each so are a quick and easy way of making money. Please be on the lookout for new ponies in your areas and guard against the theft of your equines. Remember that the only visible deterrent against theft is a freeze brand. This also makes the horse instantly identifiable to anyone and much harder to sell on.

<u>Hertfordshire</u>

Little pony stolen from stables. The pony is believed to have been loaded into a van. A Shetland pony which stands just 32ins tall (81cm) has been stolen from stables in Hertfordshire. The nine-year-old pony, called Cotton Candy, is Palomino or cream-coloured, and has whirls on the centre of the forehead and back. It was stolen from stables on the Lower Luton Road in Wheathampstead between 19 and 20 October. Those responsible are believed to have loaded the animal on to a van and police have appealed for witnesses. PC Andrew Yuill said: "This incident has been extremely upsetting experience for the owners of the pony and has caused much inconvenience and unnecessary distress."
