As you will see from this week's bulletin, some areas are experiencing significant levels tack thefts.

Some of them are opportunist crimes, committed by offenders who take advantage of your momentary lapses in attention to security to steal your belongings. Help protect yourself against these criminals by ensuring all your property is clearly security marked. Clearly post-coded rugs may look a little unattractive but not half as unattractive as your cold wet horse shivering in the field at night!

Other equestrian related thefts are well planned, with thieves obviously arriving with vehicles large enough to transport their haul. You can help deter these professionals by varying your daily routines, try not to be too predictable with your arrival/departure times – it makes planning their crime too easy if you do. Remember your old Pony Club District Commissioner's mantra to "Check your Fencing Regularly" – you could discover the wire has been cut in readiness for a crime against your neighbours or yourself.

Finally, I know we live in a Health and Safety society but please don't feel obliged to save offenders' backs from injury by leaving your wheelbarrows out for them to wheel away your belongings to their car!

Hi

A rather full list of crimes to bring to your attention over the last week, and various other incidents. It would seem the Christmas crime rush has started earlier than previous years!

First, there have been several attacks on pheasant pens around the Tandridge Lane (Lingfield) and Oxted area and more damage caused to items such as farm gates, plus some nasty incidents involving a 4x4 type vehicle ramming vehicles on the highway.

Vehicle incidents

Around 2145hrs on Tuesday 25 November a vehicle was rammed several times whilst driving along the A25 from the **Moorhouse area** heading towards Oxted, the offending vehicle was a 4x4 type vehicle which did not have its headlights on.

Around 2010hrs on the same evening a vehicle whilst waiting at the junction of **Miles Lane with Tandridge Lane (Tandridge)** was struck from behind by a Mitsubishi 4x4 vehicle contained 4 occupants, male driver mid 30's fair/ginger hair, this vehicle was not displaying headlights and drove off without stopping towards Oxted.

I understand there was another incident involving a Mitsubishi 4x4 in the Horley area during the same period (unable to locate details at present).

Around 2110hrs same evening a vehicle parked in a field off **Crowhurst Road** (opposite the Crowhurst Village Hall) was set on fire.

Index plates of parked and unattended vehicle stolen between 9-6pm on Monday 24th November whilst parked in **Station Road**, **Lingfield** ... the index plates were obviously put on another vehicle

Another set of index plates were stolen from a vehicle parked in **St Piers Lane, Lingfield** during same period as above.

Rural crimes around the Tandridge area

Overnight 24th/25th November offenders cut padlock to farming field gained access to field, went to secure barn, forced access, nothing stolen. Premises located along **Flower Lane, Godstone.**

Offenders gained access to farm premises in **Popes Lane, Merle Common (Nr Oxted)** by driving through farm gate taken fuel from vehicle then caused damage to machinery.

Incident happened between 1500-2215hrs on Sunday 23rd November.

More reports of vehicles (normally 4x4 type vehicles) driving across farm fields around the **Moor** Lane & Starborough Lane area of Dormansland/Marsh Green.

Equine issues

Overnight 21/22 November offenders gained access to feed room of stable block located in grounds of dwelling along **Brickhouse Lane**, **South Godstone** nothing stolen but various items thrown about.

Offenders attempted to steal battery for electric fencing in field off **Kings Cross Lane, South Nutfield** overnight 15/16 November, unable to cut padlock/chain which was securing items.

Burglary at stable block located off **Nutfield Marsh Road**, **Nutfield** overnight 10/11 November various saddles and power tools stolen.

Between 1830-2130hrs on Monday 17 November offenders gained access to stable block at livery stables in **Rogers Lane, Warlingham** damaged caused but nothing stolen as offenders unable to gain access to secure tack room.

Bogus caller incidents

This is still an ongoing issue and there have been many incidents in the Epsom and Staines area.

The lowlife involved target the elderly with the waterboard story (other stories are used) to gain access to their property and steal their cash.

There have been other incidents involving large sums of cash taken from vulnerable people where the offenders have stated urgent work needs to be carried out on their roofs.

Please speak to your elderly relatives and friends regarding these incidents and also please keep a eye out on your elderly residents in your community
