Getting it right

It is stressed time and time again.....but if you see a vehicle in circumstances you are unhappy about, think the occupants are acting suspiciously then if humanly possible record the registration number and report it to the police or your Horsewatch scheme

A thought?

This week a report was received that a horse had been stolen in Guildford, Surrey and the next day it was found abandoned near the port of Hollyhead in Wales.

The horse was microchipped and never found its way into the dock area. Presumably those that stole it decided not to continue with the theft process. Horse is now reunited with its owner.

The thought is thiso .. those from Horsewatch groups who can spare the time and live close to ports of departure to Ireland and the continent could keep an eye out for vehicles transporting horses and where appropriate record the vehicles details and pass the information to your Horsewatch scheme or police.

As we all know and suspect stolen horses have to go somewhere one but where? They either stay within Great Britain or are shipped out. The shipping out process is theoretically policed and monitored at the port of departure but it may be that some extra attention is required. In passing if you see a trailer or box heading towards a port of departure then record what you see and report ito of .you never know what you see may prove useful and informative.

Stolen donkeys

Dong forget there are still two donkeys outstanding from the recently reported theft of 11. Have you seen any donkeys in a field recently that have recently arrived? Look up old copies of the bulletin for detail www.ukhorsewatch.org.uk has back copies in its media folder

Help defeat the thief and handler by post coding, marking in anyway your property. Do it todayo .not tomorrow, it may be too late!!

If you have coded all your property and are unfortunate to be a victim of a theft then you can have sympathy and the Horsewatch community, the great and good can look for it because they have something to look for!

On the other hand if it is not coded then the sympathy vote may not be forthcomingõõõõ

Defeating crime is in your hands.

The seizures of tack in Hampshire and Sussex only too readily demonstrates the failure of people not post coding or marking their property. A lot of police time is wasted because the saddle, rug, trailer, (oh yes the horse) is not coded or marked.

Be a responsible person and get your property coded/marked.

Horse attack

A HORSE owner today said he had been "sickened" by a crossbow attack that could have killed or paralysed one of his animals.

Daisy, a 16-month-old filly, was found wandering in a field in Hebburn with a foot-long metal bolt embedded in her neck. Its tip missed her spinal cord by less than a centimetre.

The injury was discovered by owner Stephen Bothick's father, who had gone to check on the animal on Friday morning and found her caked in blood. She was rushed to specialist vet in Yarm, North Yorkshire, who painstakingly removed the arrow. She now needs daily injections to combat infection.

Mr Bothick, 35, who keeps six horses on the field near Lukes Lane, today put up a reward in a bid to catch the person who shot Daisy. He said: "She could have been killed if the arrow had moved just a couple of millimetres forward. "It's left the whole family shocked. We've had problems in the past with people letting horses out of the field, but no one has ever attacked one of them."

The father-of-two, of Calf Close Lane, Jarrow, added: "It's hard to understand why anyone would do that to a defenceless horse. It's just sick."

Daisy, who is worth about £2,000, has been transferred to allotments nearby, where she has to be kept indoors. She could still be put down if the wound becomes infected.

A spokeswoman for the Horse Trust charity said: "The arrow could have quite easily hit the spinal cord, which is also up by the wither (the ridge between the shoulder blades). "But even hitting the muscle could cause problems for the horse in the long-term."

As revealed on our website on Saturday, the incident happened some time between 8pm on Thursday and 10am on Friday.

Editors note:

How would you prove a saddle is yours if it was recovered following a burglary?

Picture the scene . the police have stopped a vehicle full of saddles and suspect that the contents have been stolen. The items are seized and the Police contact people who have had tack stolen in recent burglaries and ask them to attend the Police Station to see if their equipment is amongst that held.

If you were one of the burglary victims, would you be able to prove that the brown leather, 17inch medium fit Jefferies saddles was yours, especially if someone else claimed the same?

In this scenario the police would have to be satisfied that that the claimant is the owner of it or has a right to possession of it.

How to help yourself

Mark all your tack, rugs etc with your postcode or other identifiable mark.

Saddles .

Ideally the leather should be stamped with an identifying mark. Suffolk Horse Watch has a list of tack shops and saddlers who are able to offer this service for a nominal fee. Please contact us if you want more information.

Saddles can also be microchipped - here are various companies offering this service. Also consider engraving a mark on the stirrup bar, this is particularly useful for synthetic saddles that cand be stamped.

Bridles -

The headpiece on a bridle can also be stamped with a mark. Caution should be used using this method of marking on other bridle parts as the stamping could weaken thinner pieces of leather.

Rugs -

Use an indelible marker pen, but remember to check that the mark is still readable following cleaning and reproofing of the rug. Also check form time to time that it hasnot been worn away.

Compile an inventory

Do not forget to make a comprehensive inventory of tack and equipment. Include relevant descriptions (colour, size, etc.) serial numbers and details of security marking or post coding. The list will also be of great use when making insurance claims. The keeping of receipts is also a useful practice to follow.

Photograph your equipment, in particular your ID marks and any other distinguishing features

KEEP ALL RECORDS SECURE to ensure they do not fall into the wrong hands, and they are readily available when needed.

Use Immobilise (www.immobilise.com)

Items which are identifiable by a serial number or other means can be registered on Immobilise. Immobilise is the world's largest FREE register of ownership details and with its sister site CheckMEND (www.checkmend.com) the largest database of stolen property and blocked mobile phones.

Immobilise is linked to the National Mobile Property Register (NMPR) www.thenmpr.com (This is a secure database - members of the public are **NOT** able to access the information on it). It allows officers to search for property by serial numbers etc to identify the registered owners and whether an item is stolen. They can then contact the owner to return stolen goods and investigate any criminal activity relating to the property.

Prepare your horse for Bonfire Night

Some animals seem completely unperturbed by loud bangs and fireworks. However as the firework season is almost upon us, it makes sense to make arrangements for your horses and ponies who may get distressed over the next week or so.

- Keep your horse to his normal routine and with his usual companions.
- Check your field and stable for objects that could cause injury if your horse becomes frightened.
- If possible horses should be stabled while fireworks are being let off, ideally where the fireworks are not visible. You may need to shut the top stable door. This will obviously depend on the individual horse.
- Leave a radio on near your horse's stable to lessen the noise of fireworks.
- Give horses plenty of hay to keep them occupied.
- Sometimes cotton wool in the horses' ears or ear covers may make a difference.
- If you know your horse reacts badly to fireworks, it's worth speaking to your vet about sedation in advance.
- Stay with your horse if you are unsure how he will react to the noise. Your presence should have a calming
 effect. Even if horses seem relaxed, check them throughout the evening. If you are leaving your horse in the
 care of someone else, leave clear instructions and contact details for you and your vet should any problems
 arise.
- Check you have adequate third-party liability insurance if your horse is frightened and escapes, causing an accident, then you could be held liable.
- Be proactive · wherever possible, you should tell your neighbours and local fireworks display organisers there are horses nearby, so they can ensure fireworks are set off in the opposite direction. Ask them to inform you when and at what time fireworks are due to be launched. Check the local press, shop and village noticeboards, and listen to the radio to find out where and when displays will be held in your area.
- Check you have fire precautions in place. Check any fire extinguishers are in working order and consider having sand and water nearby in case of a fire around the stables.
