This was done discreetly, no forced entry to field, to look from the gate/field it was taken from an area that unless you went up to the pen, it would look like all was there. I had energiser, battery and solar panel all hidden in bushes and out of view, so my guess is that it was somebody who had access to the field and knew it was there.

I hope they feel proud of themselves, I had all this for the health of my child's pony - pony got injured in field back in June, lack of work/injury caused laminitis for the very first time. The pony is still suffering now, fence needs to be electrified to keep animal in pen out of danger, or animal will go through fencing. Pony mainly stabled now, as I refuse to buy more equipment - under two years ago I had £300 worth of fencing etc stolen from a field at a yard in Clanfield, now I have just had £200 worth stolen. I am going to give up horses for definite now, I have lost the will.

I was trying to sell my little pony, whom we all love dearly, she is as safe as an animal could possibly be and has been with us 4 years and is an absolute angel, then she got injured (over £1,000 vet/physio bills later and still awaiting xrays for pedal bone etc etc). She is still walking sore (not lame) I need these items to keep her safe. My beautiful pony is worthless now she has had laminitis and is suffering (albeit mildy). I have hopefully now found a beautiful permanent home for her if she can become sound - I do have to give her away, with all her wardrobe etc but her welfare is my biggest concern and I will happily re-home her with a full wardrobe for nothing, than see her go to somebody and be passed from home to home, my little 10.2hh deserves it!
