With many farmers now looking to store ammonium nitrate fertiliser, it is timely to remind you that certain extremist groups have used it in the manufacture of explosive devices. We understand that in modern farming it is unusual to have such chemicals hanging around in your yards before use or to order more than is necessary. Nevertheless for the time it is on your land it is potentially an easily accessible source of this chemical for terrorists.

The government has a web site offering advice on the storage of this product. www.secureyourfertiliser.gov.uk. This offers simple advice on what steps you should take to ensure the security of this chemical. If you do not have access to the web please take the time to read the following which is the most important information.

Ten point plan for fertiliser security

- 1. Do not store fertiliser where there is public access
- 2. Do not leave bags of fertiliser in the field overnight
- 3. Do not store fertiliser near to, or visible from, the public highway
- 4. Do not sell fertiliser unless the purchaser is personally known by you to be a bona-fide farmer user and is aware of the need to follow this guidance. (Be aware of the requirement to provide a copy of the detonation resistance certificate if you sell or supply relevant ammonium nitrate based fertiliser.)
- 5. Do record fertiliser deliveries and usage
- 6. Do, wherever possible, and with regard to HSE safety guidance, store fertiliser inside a locked building or compound
- 7. Do fully sheet fertiliser when stored outside and regularly check to ensure that the stack has not been tampered with.
- 8. Do carry out regular, frequent stock checks
- Do report immediately any unexplained stock discrepancy or loss/theft to the police
- 10. Do record any manufacturers code numbers from the bags and if available, the number of the detonation resistance test certificate

Stolen horse tragedy

Two ponies were taken from their field in Edworth Road, Langford, Bedfordshire late on Wednesday or early Thursday and were loaded into a stolen horsebox. The wooden bottom of the trailer collapsed during the journey, badly injuring the three-year-old pony. The other escaped unhurt. The pony's injuries were found to be so severe it had to be destroyed

Pony left severely burnt after being set alight in a field

Article in Horse and Hound by Amy Mathieson, H&H news writer 14 August, 2009

A pony has been severely burnt after she was set alight in a field in Nottinghamshire. Four-year-old grey Welsh pony Baby Boo was found by her owner at 6.30pm on Sunday 9 August in her field off Mill Lane in Stapleford. She had burns to her rump and had broken through a metal gate in an attempt to escape. Police believe she was covered with petrol before being set alight.

The pony was taken to a specialist veterinary hospital to treat the burns and will remain there for at least two weeks. The RSPCA and Nottinghamshire police are now appealing for information. "This was a horrific and calculated attack," said RSPCA inspector Sarah Gardner. "I can't imagine what sort of people would be capable of doing this, but clearly we need to find out who they are to prevent them from attacking other animals." Metal thefts are a problem countrywide and Suffolk has been experiencing thefts of many aluminium road signs; it is believed these are being stolen for their scrap value. We reported in the last Horse Watch bulletin of the theft of galvanised metal gates; although at this point the Police are not connecting the theft of the signs and the gates it would be simple act for the perpetrators of the sign thefts to steal farm gates whilst on their travels. Please take the following steps to avoid losing your gates:

- Make sure gates can't be lifted off of the hinges invert the top hinge or weld a plate to the top.
- Mark gates to make them unique to your farm or yard. We suggest your postcode is painted or (preferably) engraved onto the gate, so in the event of theft and subsequent recovery, your property can be returned to you.
- Gates that are locked with good quality chains or padlocks are more difficult to steal.
- Make regular checks to see if they have been tampered with. If you believe they have been tampered with, contact your local police.

Review your stable security

There has been an increase in theft of cobs, Shetlands and coloured ponies with horses now being stolen in the West Mercia area. These are the first recorded thefts for many years on our patch. I would urge you to take additional security measures.

- Double check fencing get registration numbers of suspicious vehicles; get descriptions of anyone hanging around your yard that has no reason to be present.
- Consider micro chipping or freeze marking your horse Your vet can help with a microchip and Mary Awre can offer advice regarding freeze marking. Her details are 01295 690090 or have a look at the website www.freezemark.biz
- Consider some CCTV or at the very least buy some signs saying %CCTV IS MONITORING THIS AREA+I think Countrywide have these on sale? Or try your local farm outlet.
- Mark your tack and trailers.

I can help with all of this and if you let me know I am happy to come to your farm or yard to advice. Finally, along with the usual thefts of trailers etco there have been thefts of young pheasants and partridge and the electric fencing outside their pens.
