Editorial Comment

This bulletin is overdue but other matters impinge on editorial staff time!!

What has made an impact is the amount of information coming through. I cannot imagine that it is the usual subscribing counties/police forces that experience equine crime. Counties that do not submit reports must be having the same issues. So what is being circulated is a small perentage of what is occurring nationally!

It is apparent that owners of horses are still not getting the message about post coding or uniquely marking their property. This is demonstrated by the reports contained within this bulletin and are always repeated. The below item also illustrates the difficulties faced by police officers investigating crime and dealing with recovered property......and it doesn't have to be equine property.

Equine Investigation

Hampshire Equine Liaison Officers are currently conducting an investigation code named Operation Jockey. The enquiry commenced last week. This investigation involves the theft of equine property on a grand scale. It involves, allegedly, people that live local to Hampshire and who have the means to travel......

When the officers are in a position to circulated descriptions and identify victims of crime (if they are lucky enough to find post codes) they will contact people.

There is no point, at this time, contacting Hampshire Police to ask about recovered stolen equine property. We will contact you......if not from a point of finding a post code then through crime reference numbers. We will be liaising with other police forces to get crime reference numbers.

If on reading this you realize that your property is not post coded I would venture the suggestion that you get it done very soon.

As we tell you...property that cannot be identified to an owner/victim of a crime is very likely to go back from whence it came!!!

If you have had tack stolen in the past twelve months you can e mail equine@ hampshire.pnn.police.uk with your details which will be logged. On the e mail include:-

- your full name,
- Address inc post code
- Contact telephone numbers
- Description of your property
- Whether it was post coded or uniquely marked in an identifiable way.
- Crime reference number
- Officer in Case name and contact details
- The fact as to whether you made a statement of loss to the police

To Note

The below was circulated as a media release by Hampshire Constabulary in respect of Operation Jockey There is one significant change. This relates to the method of contact which is highlighted in red and is re enforced by the above paragraph also highlighted in red.

On 24/10/09 Police from Hampshire and Thames Valley attended an address in Three Mile Cross and recovered a large quantity of tack which is suspected to be stolen. Thousands of pounds worth of suspected stolen horse tack has now been seized (saddles / bridles / rugs etc etc). A previous press release was issued on 22/10 however a further seizure has now been made.

If you have <u>recently had tack stolen</u>, <u>which is outstanding and identifiable please contact PC Stacy</u> <u>BEALE via equine@hampshire.pnn.police.uk</u> quoting operation 'Jockey'. Please ensure that you have your crime reference number (if out of force please provide Police Force name also), full descriptions of your missing property and a photograph if possible.

We are very keen to reunite property with its rightful owners and also assist with marking any new / replacement property that may have been obtained.

3 people have been arrested in connection with the thefts and are currently on Police Bail.

And now for something completely different!

Do you own a horse?

Do you know that NED can reduce the chance of your horse being stolen and if it is stolen, increase the chance of it being recovered? Two very good reasons to associate with your horse in NED!

What to do - step by step

find your horse on NED and check that the basic information provided to NED by your passport issuer is correct, complete and up to date

associate yourself with your horse by clicking on "associate yourself with this equine"

check that all your horse's security identifiers are correctly recorded; if a freezemark or microchip number is missing you can add it yourself

upload a clear photo of your horse

How does this help me?

If your horse is lost, stolen or goes missing on loan, being associated with your horse in NED allows you to immediately...

flag the horse as stolen or missing add some detailed notes that might help identify your horse if anyone sees it publish your contact details, so anyone with information can quickly let you know

Your horse will then also be clearly marked as lost or stolen on a NED Passport Check - so if someone is being offered your horse for sale – alarm bells will ring.

NED features the most recently reported lost/stolen horse with a photo on its home page for every visitor to see, increasing the chance of a missing horse being found as quickly as possible. This has happened several times already, enabling missing horses to be returned.

NED also maintains a lost/stolen register which missing horses can stay on free-of-charge for as long as it takes to recover them.

NED - helping to PROTECT horses, ponies and their owners

There are several things which you can do to minimise theft and prevent the chances of buying stolen property.

- 1. When advertising an item for sale (horse, trailer, etc) do not give a location has to where the property is kept. This may provide a potential thief with a location as where to steal from.
- 2. When considering to buy an item always insist on meeting the seller at their home or other address to which they are associated. Never meet a seller in a car park/location to which they have no association...i.e layby, motorway service area
- 3. When buying or selling have someone else with you to observe, take note of car numbers, descriptions. Remember some buyers may turn up and not make the purchase, only to return later....at night and steal
- 4. Don't get involved with any Internet sells or purchases (regardless of whether it is horse related or not) unless you are 100% sure of the authenticity of the person you are dealing with. Before getting involved seek advice from others. There are a lot of scams out there where people are ever ready to relieve you of your money.

Damage to horses?

Every now and then reports are received up and down the country from worried horse owners that their horses manes or tails have been cut. Additionally reports are received that manes are being plaited.

These occurrences are not unnaturally are of concern for us all. The reason for the occurrences happening are varied.

Manes and tails being cut could be for the hair to use in toys....rocking horses...? Equally the cutting could be vindictiveness......

Plaits in manes and tails could be an indicator or precursor to the fact the horse as been identified for possible theft. Equally the plaits could be part of a rite or ritual as practiced by a sect or group.

Equally what are perceived to be plaits are no more than the mane hair being twisted by the horses own motion and movement with bits of twig or straw etc being caught up in it. In Hampshire such "plaits" are known as tigs or "twazzles".

What ever the cause it costs nothing to report the matter to your local police and or your Horsewatch. The advice is to take a photograph of the plait so it can be evaluated.....BUT VERY FEW OWNERS DO TAKE A PHOTOGRAPH......!!

If your horse does experience any of the above report it, take a photograph.

Stolen Horse Found Thanks To Family's Dedication and High Tech Police Computer System

(incorporating information from around the country)

20th October 2009

A family has been reunited with its stolen horse thanks to a high-tech information system run by the police and the determination of his owners.

Tommy, a heavy cob gelding with distinctive markings, was taken from a field near Market Drayton overnight between September 4th and September 5th.

However, thanks to a country-wide campaign by his owners and the police's Shropshire Community Messaging (SCM), a computer system which allows information to be shared with a huge cross section of the community, he was found in a farmer's field in Alveley, near Bridgnorth on Thursday(OCT 8).

Tommy's details and information about the theft were distributed by Shropshire Rural Watch via SCM and then picked up by colleagues in Telford, who also passed the information on to their contacts.

The appeal was also distributed by his owners via the Shropshire Horse Watch scheme, which produced a poster that his owners distributed across England, Wales and even Scotland. They published information on the Horse and Hounds Forum, on social networking sites such as Facebook and the family spent hours tirelessly contacting every equestrian-related organisation and visiting as many auctions and shows as they could in the days following the theft.

As a result, when Martin Wozencroft, owner of Telford Saddlery received an email from SCM to say a stray horse had been reported in a farmer's field near Bridgnorth, within minutes he had contacted Tommy's owners to let them know, having previously put Tommy's poster at the business. The family drove down and were delighted to find it was their horse.

Within minutes of him reading the email, Mr Wozencroft had also received a phone call from one of his regular customers, who was also signed up to the system, to say she had received a text message about the found horse and wondering if it could be Tommy.

Tommy's owners thanked all those people, including friends, family, colleagues and even complete strangers who got behind the campaign to find their horse and said the response from everyone offering to help had been amazing.

David Riley, the community volunteer who co-ordinates Neighbourhood Watch and SCM in Shropshire, said it was a great example of how the rapid spread of information through such systems results in success.

"Between the police issuing the information to all those signed up to SCM and the family's determination and dedication to finding their horse, Tommy was found safe and well and is now back home," he said.

"Telford Saddlery is just one of a huge number of organisations and individuals signed up to Telford's Ringmaster system, which is linked to our SCM and this just shows how well it can work.

"We can get the information out across the county and beyond in a matter of minutes and it is possible that Tommy's details and picture were so widespread, that whoever took him simply abandoned him as a result, knowing they were likely to be caught.

"That is the message we want to get across to such offenders, that the results of crimes they commit can quickly become difficult for them to sell or trade as a result of such systems."

Formerly known as Ringmaster, anybody can sign up to SCM and choose to receive alerts via email, text message or voicemail, or even all three. Messages can be sent to all members or narrowed down to specific groups.

The good news first.....

Tommy the coloured pony from Bridgnorth has been found. This was due to a lot of activity from his owners who published his disappearance widely. They had good quality photographs and were very proactive. Horsewatch also helped to distribute the information as did ourselves. I have no doubt that these types of email lists help in passing information quickly and accurately.

I have received a message from Glospol (Gloucestershire Constabulary) informing me that several wooden gates at Batsford Estate (Bourton on the Hill) have been tampered with. This would have allowed them to be removed quickly and probably stolen. Please consider checking any similar gates that you have to prevent theft. You may also wish to visibly mark them which would act as a deterrent and make them unsuitable for re sale. Either your name or postcode would be suitable.

A white Transit type pick up has been seen recently on a couple of farms in Broadway and Bowers Hill. On both occasions the occupant was sighted having a good look around the premises. He has also made enquiries about any scrap metal. The vehicle index is similar to R950XV?. I am told it has an orange light on the roof and on the top of the tailgate was a black and yellow strip hazard warning strip. Please be aware that this vehicle may be acting suspiciously. It would be helpful if it comes onto your land if you could let me know times /dates and how many occupants are inside. I will then submit an intelligence report and be able to record its movements.

Why not mark them visibly with your name or post code. (Im sure your horse won't mind!!)
