Stolen property turns up anywhere. At New Forest Pony Sales in the New Forest Equine Liaison Officers have recovered stolen trailers, and on one occasion a stolen horse. All property was returned to the owners/insurance companies. The person in possession may have unwittingly bought the items not knowing they were stolen but at the end of the day the property was seized. The horse owner to say the least was overjoyed to have her horse back.

If you feel that a visit to these Fairs could realise the recovery of your property you are strongly advised to contact the police in the area where the Fair takes place before going in order to get advice.

Three years ago a lady identified her stolen Shetland at Wickham Fair. She had to seek police help in recovering it. That pony was micro chipped which significantly assisted in proving ownership.

Good news just before sending out the bulletin the owner contacted Hampshire Horsewatch to say her horse had been found in a field several miles away. There is little doubt the horse was stolen. The owners robust lines of enquiry in the 24 hours after the theft was discovered ensure the horse was returned.

Tack Theft from Stables

Crime Ref: 44090172666 - Burglary non-dwelling - 'Finches Hatch', Forest Road, Hale. Date 1800 21st April 2009 and 0800 22nd April 2009. Persons unknown have cut a metal chain on a large metal gate

which gives access to a field. These persons have then forced entry to a set of wooden framed stables by forcing a door lock with a unknown tool and cutting a padlock bolt. **Various horse tack and equine equipment has been taken including saddles, bridles, whips and blankets. These persons have also gained entry to an insecure horse box and removed various horse related equipment.** The cut bolts, chains and padlocks have been left on scene. An untidy search has been completed in both areas.

Stolen lfor Williams horse trailer.

RMS 44090171735 refers. Date Between 1000 -1730 21st April 2009. Wickham area

This model was about 14 years old and painted blue. A blue Landrover discovery was seen driving at speed towing a similarly described horse trailer through Wickham on this date. The vehicle and trailer negotiated the small roundabout in Wickham near the Shell garage and nearly turned over and travelled in the direction of Fareham on the A32.

A blue Discovery has been seen in other local areas to Wickam in what may be termed suspicious circumstances. Stolen: Two Saddles

Attempted Horsebox Theft

Location Woodlands Farm, Spring Lane, Cookham Dean, Berkshire, Crime reference number: LC3315401-09.

Sometime between the morning of 8th April and the morning of 9th April an attempt was made to steal a horsebox. The driver's door had been opened, the steering wheel stop-lock had been removed and the battery isolator switch had been broken off and jump leads connected up to the isolator and batteries. When the owner tried to start the lorry, the keys would not go in to the lock and it looks like the thieves broke the ignition barrel. Again there is no sign of any damage to the steering column although the cover underneath the steering wheel appears to have been removed and replaced. There is every possibility

the horsebox was probably being stolen to order. All owners of horse boxes and trailers are reminded to immobilise their vehicles in order to reduce the possibility of it being stolen.

Attempted Trailer Theft

Attempted theft of a horse trailer at 9pm on the evening of 20 March in village of Mentmore, near Leighton Buzzard. Thieves made a serious attempt to steal the trailer but were thwarted by security measures put in place by the owner.

The owner did see a silver saloon car (like a Vauxhall Vectra type) in the gate entrance opposite her yard. This was unusual, as nobody has ever parked there before. The car pulled away a few minutes after the owner had entered the premises.

They left a three-metre long metal bar behind which it is believed they used to lever the locks off. They removed the hitchlock with force, wrenching it open. They let the air out of one of the tyres making it smaller, then with the bar made the three-point wheel clamp larger, and removing it from the wheel. That was two of the locks gone.

The third lock was an SAS wheel clamp, which just covered one wheel nut and appears this is where they came unstuck (or stuck). They managed to remove it from the wheel nut and somehow it ended in getting the other side of the wheel and jammed between the chassis and wheel. They never tampered with any of the actual key locks themselves, just used brute force alone. They even managed to move the trailer about 6 feet forward and about 3 feet to the side. No vehicle was taken on the premises.

Shropshire Division is divided into five Sections, each aligned with District Council boundaries. A quarterly news letter is produced for each Section by a small team of volunteers based in Monkmoor police station.

We would welcome suggestions and requests from Rural Watch members, which would help to deliver an improving service from the Shropshire Community Messaging service and the newsletter.

Shropshire Community Messaging. Also known as Ringmaster is an automated messaging service that will alert participants to incidents in their geographic area or particular type of business area (for example, farms). The alerts can be sent out via e-mail, text messages and voice mail. Rural Watch members automatically subscribe to Ringmaster.

Rural Watch membership Shropshire Rural Watch was successfully piloted in Bishops Castle at the beginning of 2008. With the introduction of the Shropshire Community Messaging service (Ringmaster) late last year, it was decided to expand Rural Watch to all of the Shropshire division. This has been very successful with over 400 members signing up so far. The membership includes schools, post offices, pubs, businesses, farms and residents. As one of your local police officers states, *'We are establishing a ring of eyes and ears around Shropshire that is helping to protect the rural community from crime'*

Trends in Crime in Shropshire: Detective Chief Inspector Neil Jamieson said the decrease in domestic burglaries was encouraging, especially after an early summer increase last year, mainly in the Oswestry, Market Drayton and Shrewsbury areas. He said police had been successful in dealing with individual offenders who were responsible for these localised spikes. Two of those arrested were from outside Shropshire, coming into the county from Merseyside and the West Midlands.

- 15 of these were committed during the day time.
- An operation was put in place to tackle day time break-ins across the section and bordering areas and arrests were made as a result.
- No similar offences have occurred since these arrests.

Several people have recently been arrested and remanded in custody from both the West Midlands and Liverpool in connection with house burglaries in Shropshire. Detectives are continuing to investigate crimes associated with individuals from these areas

Burglary non dwelling: There have been a number of offences since the beginning of the year across rural areas of the section.

- Over half of these offences have been at farm outbuildings or to sheds.
- Power tools appear to be the main property targeted although tractors have also been attacked and there have been a number of motor cross bikes stolen.
- Offences are spread right across the section and there doesn't appear to be any particular pattern.
- Method of entry appears to be either via insecure premises or cutting padlocks.

Vehicle Crime: There have been 28 vehicle crime offences since the beginning of the year.

- Although these are mainly in Shifnal Town, there have also been offences around the more rural locations.
- These include 5 incidents where lorries have been targeted for fuel and their loads on the A41 at Tong, Shifnal.

Theft: Almost half of the Thefts reported were at farms, where items are left on view on farm land or in yards. the main property targeted appears to be trailers.
