And now for something different

The below was received and copied below for your information:-

You have probably heard by now about EIA (Equine Infectious Anaemia) found in 2 horses in Wiltshire. Please see below some advice from the BHS about the outbreak for your info.

You may have heard by now that two horses in Wiltshire have been humanely destroyed having tested positive for antibodies against Equine Infectious Anaemia, or Swamp Fever. Obviously this is bad news but it is important to keep it in perspective and not worry unnecessarily. There is already a lot of unhelpful and incorrect speculation flying around on the internet so the BHS felt it would be helpful to provide a few facts.

EIA is spread by insect vectors (or potentially contaminated veterinary equipment) NOT by close contact between horses. The cold snap will have ensured that insect vectors are few and far between and those that have survived will not fly far. Standards of veterinary hygiene are such in this country that contaminated veterinary equipment should not be an issue. Hence, transmission of the EIA virus between horses will be very difficult.

The two animals that tested positive were imported into this country. There is absolutely no evidence to suggest that EIA has been successfully transmitted within the UK. The horses have now been destroyed so they are not acting as a reservoir to potentially infect others.

It is extremely positive that these horses were identified (they were not displaying clinical signs). This goes to show that import checks are working.

The premises at which the affected horses were identified are under restrictions and Defra are conducting a full epidemiological investigation.

We are not seeking to downgrade this outbreak or denigrate anybody's fears, this is obviously very serious news. However, it is exceedingly likely that this outbreak will be contained and the threat to other horses really is small. The best advice that we can give is to read up on Equine Infectious Anaemia and familiarise yourself with its clinical signs. Remain vigilant and if you have any concerns contact your vet immediately. There is useful information

Full description of the harness that was stolen, including some identifying features. It was certainly marked in indelible black ink and can be identified if found.

- 1. The 4 sets of working harness were from www.aaronmartin.com and was no. 295 team leather work harness with no. 510 working haymes. The harness is easily identified in that it has an indelibly marked initial of each horse on it which has been well-oiled in over the past three years and would be difficult to disguise. Also, the saddles on the harnesses have had the rivets removed which have been replaced with bolts in order to carry bells. The collars were adjustable leather field collars no. 72a again with indelibly marked and oiled in initials of the horses. The letters used for the initials are O, S, J and R. All the leather harness is black and has silver pieces.
- 2. The 2 sets of lightweight competition harness was also from www.aaronmartin.com, no. 250010 and was double marathon harness made to order in granite (which was like a dark brown synthetic material fairly distinctive most harness I've seen is black). It also has indelibly marked initials, R and O, and also on the outside horse tracer a label, SUFFOLK (which may have been removed if the thieves thought about it)
- 3. The 4 bridles were black leather with silver studs across the brown and silver disks on each side. The Myler bits were 2 in size 32" and 2 in size 36".

Information sought

Verderers in the New Forest are offering a reward of £1,000 for information after an emaciated horse was found dumped last week.

The dead horse was found on Monday 11 January by the agister for the Ocknell area of the forest.

The **coloured cob** is thought to have been about **three years old** and was reported by the police to have been in **an "appalling condition"**.

The mare was emaciated and police suspect she may have been suffering for some time. There was **blood around** her head.

Tyre marks found in the snow near to the dumped horse indicate that the vehicle used to transport the animal had double wheels on the rear axle.

Dumping any animal in the Forest, whether dead or alive, is an offence, punishable through the magistrates' court.

The Verderers have decided to offer a reward of up to £1,000 for information that leads to the successful conviction of the person responsible.

Dear all,

Please find attached some recent info re farmwatch.

The past month has seen mixed blessings. The period of snow was good for crime figures as even the criminals dong like the cold and also cang move freely around.

However, since the snow has gone they seem to have been trying to catch up on lost time. We have had a larger number than usual of outbuilding break ins mainly at residential homes. Please do re check your security and make a note of what you have and record serial numbers and markings on stealable items.

Our main problems have been a rise in thefts of 4x4 vehicles of all makes from Suzuki¢s to Landrover¢s. We have also had a rise in theft of trailers, specifically Ifor Williams. Since the 7 January five trailers have been stolen across the whole area.

Again calls we have received have related to vehicles touting for scrap? Adjoining Police forces have reported thefts of diesel and heating oil. These have been from Sussex and Dorset but we have had a similar incident in South Warnborough.

On a better note we arrested 3 males attempting to steal a digger from Hartley Wintney. We recovered the stolen digger, a stolen low loader lorry and a stolen BMW car. We have also linked these males to burglaries in the Berkshire area.

Also a stolen trailer with a 4x4 on the rear was recovered by Police 2 miles from where it was stolen in Hartley Wintney. On going enquiries appear to link to a potential known thief.

If we do not have your mobile phone number or you have changed it please let us know so that we can keep you in the loop. The number, as with all your details, is not shared openly.

HorseWatch Meeting

Thank you to everyone who attended the meeting on Tuesday 12 January at Queensbury Conservative Club despite the bad weather (Current membership 222). The next Horsewatch Meeting will take place between 7.30pm-8.30pm on Tuesday 23 February at Queensbury Conservative Club.

Road Safety Signs

Six new triangle horse signs have been promised by Bradford council for the Queensbury area as Horsewatch members get involved with the Police Speed GunqDays of Action. Sergeant Roger Moore says cone of our local priorities is speeding, dangerous driving and inconsiderate parking. Public confidence is raised when members of the public see us out and about on high visibility patrol. We are working hard to combat these problems by involving members of the public and local children in Speed GunqDays of Action. Officers will be outside schools and local communities it is a great way to encourage drivers to slow down and take responsibility.

Using the Road

Motorists and horse riders both have a right to use the road. They also share a responsibility to consider the needs of each other. When you are riding on a road you should:

- Wear protective headgear to current approved standards;
- Give clear and decisive signals;
- Read the appropriate section of the Highway Code;
- Keep away from busy roads;
- Ride on the left hand side of the road;
- Wear a high-visibility hat band or cap cover and a high-visibility waistcoat or tabard;
- Use reflective leg bands on your horse. Because they are constantly moving they attract driversqattention. Ideally use them on all four legs, but if using two put them on the outside legs nearest the road;
- Use either a tail guard or fluorescent rug at the rear of the horse as this is the most vulnerable area;



- Do not ride more than two abreast and go in single file on narrow or bending roads;
- Avoid riding after dark or in foggy conditions:
- Do not take a mounted group of more than eight riders on the road;
- Pass pedestrians and cyclists slowly and take extra care passing walkers and dogs.

Further Safety Hints

(incorporating information from around the country)

- "Ensure your riding hat is to standard PAS 015 or BSEN 1384.
- "Before Riding it is important to carry out routine checks of your saddle and tack, not only for the benefit of your horses comfort, but also to ensure safe riding. If your saddle or tack fails any of the checks below then have it repaired or replaced before you ride:
- _ Check the saddle for any weaknesses or wear, including cracking
- _ Check the tree of the saddle is in good shape by squeezing the sides of the saddle together—there should be no movement. If there is, this indicates damage to the tree which could seriously damage the horses back.
- _ Check the girth straps under the saddle flat to ensure that all straps and stitching are secure. Ensure that all stitching around the girth buckles are secure and that the buckles themselves are not damaged or bent. Check for any signs of wear and tear.
- _ Check the bars which hold the stirrup leathers to make sure they are secure.
- _ Check the stirrup leathers for wear and cracking.
- _ Check the bridle for any weakness in the leather such as wear or cracking. Check all stitching is secure and that all buckles are secure and not bent. Check the reins for weakness, wear or cracking and again ensure stitching is secure. Check the bit for any dirt or rough edges that may damage the horseqs mouth.

Tail cutting. Clifton Area

A further tail cutting incident took place recently in the Clifton area where one of the suspects alighted from a vehicle and approached a black horse in a field. Using an unknown cutting tool he removed a large amount of tail hair from the horse before being disturbed by the owner. The offenders reversed at speed along the road whilst being chased by the owner. It takes up to three years for tails to fully grow back we would ask that people please report any suspicious incidents.

Stolen trailer- an update

Unfortunately there is still no news on the missing trailer taken from the Low Moor area. The trailer is a Cheval Liberte 2003 in light grey with a white roof, registration DE 1960. The jockey wheel is buckled and it had 30 bags of shredded paper inside. Please be aware that the trailer is broken and horses should not be put in it.



Feed stolen- Tintinhull

Approximately £200 worth of feed was stolen from a farm in Marsh Lane, Tintinhull. Other items stolen included 6ft x 4ft rubber stablemats, 2 chains (used with lead ropes), 2 lead ropes and a quilted blue rug. We are currently awaiting details of any further items.

Food bins stolen. Martock area

Food bins have been stolen from a location in Foldhill Lane, Martock. Other items also stolen include an electric fencer, a horse rug, 2 buckets, wheelbarrow, pitch fork and 2 head collars. The property from which they were stolen is a stable block accessed along a private road from where entry can only be gained via a locked wooden gate. The offenders attended the premises in a vehicle which they used to ram the gates open to gain access.

Suspicious vehicle seen in Halifax area

A black Nissan Navarro, part registration number ???SAM, has been seen in the Halifax area. It was driven into a livery yard where the suspects asked for prices on the livery. The boot of the vehicle was already open ready to take the items, but the men made off when confronted. Both men had Irish accents—the first male was described as white with blond hair of slim build and gaunt appearance; the second was described as larger build and around 5ft 6in in height.

Accident caused by loose horses

Recently a man driving a van through a Bradford Estate was confronted by two loose horses which had run from a main road towards his vehicle. One of the horses skidded and dived on to the front of the van where its foot went through the windscreen narrowly missing the driver. The horse broke free and ran away in a distressed state. Police and Horsewatch members are working hard to combat the problem of loose horses, particularly in the

Holmewood and surrounding areas. Loose horses can be a danger and can cause major collisions so we advise that fields and fences are properly maintained and that gates are securely locked. Remember your horses are your responsibility. If you want to stop tethering, a list of grazing land available to rent is obtainable from local councils-please ask for details. All bids have to be in by February 2010.
