Use of mobile phones whilst driving and riding

As you are all aware, the use of mobile phones whilst driving and in control of a motor vehicle is not permitted for any reason. Yet everyday drivers of motor vehicles can be seen using mobile phones to talk to others and to text. These people are undertaking anti social behaviour and as a consequence their actions could result in a collision, at the worst a fatality õ .by which time it is too late to be sorry!! From an equine perspective there can be nothing more disturbing than seeing drivers of horse boxes, trailers using mobile phones whilst driving on the roadsõ õ ..and yes, it does happen.

Remember no phone call or text is that important to make or receive whilst driving a motor vehicle on the road. Equally, the same can be applied whilst riding a horse.

Be a responsible person and use your mobile phone only when it is safe and legal to do so.

This is a Community Message from Helen Evans, Horse Watch Liaison Volunteer to all members of Horse and Country Watch on Friday 9 July 2010.

With the possibility of hay and straw being in short supply and therefore more expensive, in the coming months, please think about ways of securing your hay, straw, bedding and forage.

Cutting the string of small-bale hay or straw will make it virtually impossible for anyone to walk off with it. Marking bales of haylage, bedding and feed with pray paint or permanent marker will make it identifiable and less attractive to thieves.

Hay is a difficult commodity to secure in closed barns, due to its combustible properties, but securing the area around the buildings should be a priority, using the best technology you can afford. Use lockable, metal feed bins to store your bags of feed. Review your security now by imagining how easy or difficult it would be for someone else to gain access to your belongings, and take steps to make it more difficult for thieves to help themselves.

Be wary of anyone calling on the "off chance" or looking around the property. Take note of them and the registration number of any vehicle used. If you are at all suspicious, report the incident to the Police using the non emergency number.

FARMWATCH UPDATE - 'CESAR'

Hello all.

have just attended a presentation for the CESAR scheme (Construction & Agricultural Equipment Security and Registration). Some of you may have heard about the scheme through Police or as discussed at the Farmwatch meeting earlier this year. I have put together this letter to highlight the advantages of the scheme.

As I am sure you are all aware theft of construction and agricultural machinery is a widespread problem in the UK. It is actually a highly-organised world-wide problem that sees offenders getting away with millions of pounds per year. In the UK last year £750 million worth of machinery was stolen, and £4.5 billion worth was stolen throughout Europe in the same year.

The Plant Theft Action Group (PTAG) - is a Home Office advisory group reporting to the Government Vehicle Crime Reduction Strategy team and attempts to reduce the impact of theft that organized criminal networks have on the Construction Industry. PTAG have worked with Police to introduce a National Equipment Registration and Marking Scheme.

DATATAG has been protecting property and machinery for over 15 years and have now produced £ESARq DATATAG are ACPO and Home Office approved and as such Police Forces have been getting up to speed with the scheme and its benefits for preventing and tackling crime.

A common problem with machinery is that with many of the larger companies, for example; John Deere and JCB, one key can be used with all vehicles. This clearly makes the vehicles easier to steal. Some major machinery companies have now started to include unique keys for their new machines. The CESAR scheme boasts 5 unique ways to identify a piece of machinery through state-of-the-art technology. PANUI (Plant & Agricultural National Intelligence Unit) has reported that, with CESAR, machinery is **4 times less likely to be stolen** and **6 times more likely to be recovered**. Machinery manufacturers have begun to include CESAR with all new construction and agricultural equipment. adding to the growing database.

The product is marking/tagging technology secured in and on the machinery, combined with a database which holds information of the piece of equipment and its owner. Portable scanners have been sent to all UK Police Forces; enabling them to scan vehicles to get a confirmed ID. The CESAR system includes the following:

Unique Plant Identification Plate

These tamper-proof plates carry a unique plant identification number ensuring that your equipment can be easily identified and concealed within a machine.

Glass Tag

This transponder is about the size of a grain of rice and is easily installed. It contains a unique code number which is permanently programmed into its integrated circuit which cannot be altered or deleted.



Self Adhesive Tag

This transponder is a flexible self adhesive tag which also contains a unique code number and is permanently programmed into its integrated circuit. The number cannot be altered or deleted and will withstand any attack by electric shock and magnetic waves.



Datadots ®

A superior microdot identification system developed for ease of use. The Datadots can be applied to any surface, thus making it virtually impossible for the criminals to locate and remove them all.



Datatag "DNA"

A unique forensic "DNA" solution and the latest advanced ID technology to be introduced by Datatag. Each piece of plant or machinery will be protected with an invisible unique "DNA" code and criminals will have to be confident they have removed every molecule.



How much will it cost?

A typical piece of machinery will cost £110 - £130 to have the scheme installed. CESAR is fitted by an approved technician at a specific location. There are many sites throughout the UK . please see the £Dealer Locatorqsection of the website to find your nearest site. DATATAG has explained that they can do 2 or 3 items at a time; which would work out cheaper.

Another advantage to being on the Database is that you can report property as stolen instantaneously. Unfortunately, the Police National Computer sometimes does not fully update immediately from time to time. This can obviously be a factor if your machinery has been recently

stolen and making its way to mainland Europe. By filling out a Stolen Property Report Form on their website owners can instantly update DATATAG increasing the likelihood of their machinery being recovered.

The CESAR website provides concise and informative information about the scheme and I recommend you have a look. From the presentation it seems that this is a very worthwhile scheme and financially practical considering how much the machinery costs. The CESAR website is:
