Happy New Year to One and All.

It would appear that the usual incidents are being reported in the contributing counties as we had last year.

It will be best to assume that equine crime is and always will be prevalent throughout the country but we will not always get to hear about it. As and when we do, through the UK Horsewatch Alliance we will circulate to inform you.

Mane plaiting. This is a continuing % problem +. The reasons behind the plaiting have been discussed previously and we are still no further forward in getting a resolution. If the plaiting is a sign for possible theft then it is reasonable to believe that we would have an increase in horse thefts because horses whose plaits were not discovered would have been stolen and we would have seen a surge of numbers taken. However this is not the case.

This does not mean horse owners drop their guard. They should always remain vigilant and continue to report any unusual activity concerning their horse. It would be useful if owners took photographs of the plaits when they are discovered.

Horse thefts

In this bulletin there are reports of some stolen horses, the small %ariety+. Those easy to remove!

Two were stolen from Surrey police area but have been recovered. I have left their details on the bulletin for interest purposes.

Three were stolen from West Mercia areaõ two have been recovered but one remains outstanding.

Always remain alert and on the look out for horses that suddenly appear in fields, close to roads, and other places that keep horsesõ .. that werenq there before. If you have doubts about them look on the stolen horse register to see if they are there or report the sighting to your local Horsewatch and the police.

Recently several horses that were stolen have been found in fields through the vigilance of other horse owners and landowners.

Horses are stolen on the continent on a fairly regular basis. Some are making their way over to this country. As always be very careful when considering buying a horse. Look to get any potential purchase scanned for microchips as horses on the continent are often chipped. If a horse is microchipped look to enquire with the company that supplied the chip. It is not unknown for stolen horses to be given a horse passport with the stolen chip entered on the detail and everyone will assume that all is correct and above board. As a potential buyer take nothing for granted. Enquire about the horse even if it takes time and puts you out!

As with any horse purchase take precautions. Get advice. Remember a horse passport is not proof of ownership

The same applies to any property, check it out thoroughly, õ õ õ .. horse trailers, saddles, tack etc

Remember stolen property remains the property of the person from whom it was stolen even if you

bought it in good faith. It matters not where the property was stolen.

For interest I have copied S24 of the Theft Act 1968 which refers to the where property is stolen from õõõ

24.-(1) The provisions of this Act relating to goods which have been stolen shall apply whether the stealing occurred in England or Wales <u>or elsewhere</u>, and whether it occurred before or after the commencement of this Act, provided that the stealing (if not an offence under this Act) amounted to an offence where and at the time when the goods were stolen; and references to stolen goods shall be construed accordingly.

Post Coding

The same appeal for 2010, as in 2009, goes out for horse owners to post code their tack and other property. Make you property uniquely identifiable to <u>YOU</u>.

As always be very careful with whom you deal with on the Internet. Best practice is never give your personal details and your financial information unless absolutely 100% satisfied of the other party authenticity and even then double check!

Heartless intruders target Canterbury Horse Rescue

Staff arrived for work on Sunday morning to find a state of chaos and very distressed horses greeting them, for over night heartless intruders had broken into Canterbury Horse Rescue, Boundgate Farm Centre and vandal ized a member of staff**q** car and smashing the end of a tap causing water to flood all over the yard and into stables.

Staff and volunteers had to spend a very wet and cold day carrying out emergency repairs and drying out soaked stables - all of this on one of the coldest days of the year. Fortunately none of the horses suffered injuries although several were quite distressed by what had happened, but after being tucked up in fresh warm beds and given loads of TLC from the staff they quickly recovered from their ordeal.

Canterbury Horse Rescue is at the moment attempting to raise funds through an appeal to purchase a new operating centre and has launched an internet appeal which has been gaining support from all over the country, details of which can be found on their website <u>www.canterburyhorserescue.org</u>

This callous incident diverted resources away from the appeal as well as causing vital funds to be used for repairing the damage which resulted from the flooding. The information below is relevant to Sussex. Other counties may well have a different approach and advice



What should I do if I think I have seen a stolen horse?	You should contact your local Police Force and the local Horsewatch co-ordinator.
How can I contact Horsewatch in my area?	Either check the links on the 'Horse watch groups nationwide' page or email us with your details, stating which area you live in, and we will find who your co- ordinator is for your region and ask them to contact you.
What if there is not a co-ordinator for my area?	We will find the nearest coverage for your area. There will always be a Horsewatch co-ordinator caretaking your area.
How can I check if a trailer I have looked at is stolen or not?	Check with the manufacturer making sure that you have the model and serial number for them to check. Always make a note of the vehicle registration number shown on the back of the trailer. If the trailer proves to be stolen it will be vital information for the Police.
How can I check if a horsebox is stolen?	Check the engine number matches the chassis number and all details on the plating certificate. Ask to see the vehicle log book and check you have a written note of these numbers. Check the vehicle with DVLA Swansea providing the above information.
How can I be sure the horse I am buying is not stolen?	It is a legal requirement for all equines to have a passport. Ensure you have sight of this and the details match the equine for sale. The National Equine Database will have details of all horses now. If the horse is not on there, treat as suspicious, you can also check that the horse is not out on loan and NOT FOR SALE. If the horse has a freeze brand, check the mark with all freeze branding companies. Also check the Stolen Horse Register at www.stolenhorseregister.com . Although there are a large number of horses described, it cannot be treated as complete. It is not linked to the Police national computer.
What can I do if I see an ill-treated equine?	Take the location details and a detailed description of the equine in question plus the detail of the complaint and

want to cause a fuss - what should I do?	by phone, via their websites or by email and we will investigate your concern. We go on many 'wild goose chases', some of which are fruitful and can lead to useful information adding pieces to a jigsaw. We need and appreciate your help, and will not judge you as alarmist if you are trying to help.		
Where can I go to find my stolen tack?	Unless your tack was identifiable by serial numbers, postcode, microchip or other visual method, it is unlikely to be recovered. If the Police recovered a hoard of tack without any form of identification they do not know who owns it and therefore cannot return it. Therefore, it cannot be identified as stolen and will be returned to the thief as no proof of ownership can be substantiated.

<u>Horse Tail Cut</u>

Location: Clifton, nr Brighouse, Huddersfield

Premises are a stable block accessed along a private road where entry can only be gained via a locked wooden gate. Offenders attended the premises in a vehicle and used this vehicle to ram the gates open before driving along the road to the stables.

One of the offenders alights from the vehicle and approaches a black horse in the field. Using unknown cutting tool removes a large amount of tail hair from the horse-before being disturbed by the owner.

The offenders reverse at speed along the road being chased by the aggrieved.

Similar occurrence in Birkenshaw area prior to Christmas 2009. Other incidents have occurred in the past before Horsewatch officers were pro-active.

Theories for these thefts are:

To sell horsehair to wig makers for Barristers/Judges wigs. They are made from 100% horse hair and cost anywhere from $\pounds 800 - \pounds 2,500$ each

To use in certain types of womens wigs/hair extensions

To use on handmade Rocking Horse, which advertise the use of real horse hair on the horses - some rocking horses cost from £2,000 upwards.

There is no evidence to support any of these theories. This is purely supposition.

The offenders above went to a lot of trouble to get to this horse. It maybe that many horses are inside due to the weather and this horse was seen from a main road/motorway.

Please remind your members to be vigilant.

Please be aware of the following incidents which have occurred at farms in South Warwickshire over recent days.

At around 11.45am on 27 November the resident of a farm premises in Roneys Lane, Alvescote was alerted by his dog barking that two males were hitching up his trailer to a Nissan Primera.

The resident went out to confront them and as he did so the trailer hit him and caused him to fall to the ground. The offenders then managed to make off with the galvanised steel 3.5 tonne flatbed trailer.

It was later discovered that the offenders had tampered with the electric gates to the premises.

At just after 8.30pm on 1 December offenders smashed the kitchen window of a farm premises in Alcester Road, Beoley and entered the house. The offenders then conducted an untidy search before locating the log book and keys to an Audi TT along with a gold and platinum watch, a divers watch, a passport, and a quantity of Euros.

The vehicle was not taken. The offenders were then disturbed by a neighbour and made off after telling the witness that he had a gun although no weapon was seen.

The males made off over fields and were chased by a dog towards Gorcott Hill where they got into a dark green Rover Saloon vehicle with a part registration of GJ03 and headed on M43 towards Birmingham.

The offenders are described as 3 black males.
