Editorial Comment

**** Winter Awareness - Be Seen! ****

There have been some incidents whereby Horse riders have been sighted not wearing High Visibility garments at times of early mornings and evenings whilst exercising horses.

Please advise Horse riders to try and be as visible as possible, especially during the winter months.

Countrywide Alert

North Yorkshire Police section includes information about theft of metals from roofs and other buildings which is relevant across the Country and definitely worth a read.

Every week and month there are the usual reports of saddles and the usual accompanying tack being stolen. The message is still not being taken onboard to get property post coded or uniquely marked so it can be identified and traced back to the victim of a crime.

We received a list of property including saddles stolen from Yorkshire. The owner had taken the trouble to photograph the saddles but sadly not post code them!! Pictures of property are nice to look at but without post codes they are just that.

Given the fact that police time and resources will be greatly impacted with the soon to be imposed financial cuts it has to be anticipated and expected that officers and police staff are not going to be afforded the luxury to investigate or try to re home unidentified property that comes into their possession.

Now is the time to take a positive step in crime prevention. Arrange to get your property post coded or take other steps to uniquely identify what belongs to you. It is no use putting off the need to do it. As they say at Sales time..."once its gone its gone". If you can afford to have you property stolen, not interested in getting it back, happy for the thieves, handlers and buyers of stolen property to enjoy your loss then don't report it BUT if you can't afford it do something about it. Take positive action...now, before it is too late!

Most, if not all, Horsewatch schemes and Police Forces will have tack marking equipment which they can use on your property or perhaps lend out.

Crime prevention and methods to use is not rocket science. To get ideas and advice contact your Horsewatch schemes or your local police.

There are several internet sites that assist with crime prevention. One such is the National Equestrian Crime Database (NECD) www.necd.org.uk At present NECD is offering a year's membership for £10 but this will finish on the 31st October 2010. It is worth going online and listening to the 4 minute introductionary video. Once you have listened to the video you can decide if it is for you. If you still have doubts give the NECD freephone number a call 0800 0199044 and speak to one of the team.

NECD is supported by the UK Horsewatch Alliance.

Remember this Bulletin contains only a snap shot of equine related crime in the country. Not all crimes are reported. We don't get to here of everything that occurs. There are several counties that do not forward information. Regular readers of this bulletin will be aware of who they are. Although I expect that crime related information is circulated within smaller county schemes and may never break out into the wider world. There scores of web sites with chat forums which contain information about occurrences and crimes and these are a useful source for understanding what is happening within the counties.

Scams are something else to be aware of, especially with Christmas approaching or in fact at any time of the year. Scams come in different disguises, whether you are going to buy goods or donate money before you part with your hard earned cash examine very carefully and question in your own mind who and what the cause is? Who is this Company or organisation? With the internet being world wide Questions you should ask yourself?

- Is the "cause" reputable?
- Have you heard of it before?
- Has anyone else?
- If in the UK does the scheme have Charitable Status? Is it a registered Charity with the Charities Commission?
- If it is a Company selling goods or a service...does it check out?
- Is the Company well known?
- If the Company is internet based, does it have a registered office, can you speak to a person within the Company to ask questions?
- Do you know of anyone who has made a purchase from the Company and received goods?

The list of questions can be endless. At the end of the day it is your choice to buy or donate. Just be careful when you make that decision. It pays to be cautious.

Plaiting

The plaiting of manes continues to be reported. The usual advice is to report the matter to the police and your local Horsewatch, take photographs of the plait and of the horse in full profile showing its mane with the plait in place. This is so it can be examined by independent "eyes"

There are a few occasions where the plait may have been "man made" but invariably the cause can be attributed to natural causes.

1. Success of Operation Migrate: Hare Coursing Update

Thieves will undoubtedly steal under the cover of darkness but will need a vehicle to remove the metal which makes them vulnerable to be seen.

If you see or hear something unusual at night and you know there are buildings close by that contain metals worth stealing then if you can investigate and if appropriate to the circumstances call the police. If you see vehicles (these can range from any make or model) on the road with a load of metal on board or heavily laden then take a note of that vehicle registration number, take note of the vehicle's occupants descriptions and report it to the police...think community information...you have done your bit now let the police follow up that information.

Metal Thefts - Selby District

We are still experiencing metal thefts across the Selby District from Tadcaster, Sherburn to Whitley Bridge. The latest incidents reported are thefts of lead from school roofs in Sherburn and Hensall.
