The value of post coding

The below information comes via Warwickshire. Time and time again crime prevention advice including the good practice of post coding uniquely identifying property is given out. (see further below in this section). The news from Warwickshire demonstrates that the practice does have value and can not only get property returned but can lead to other offences being identified.

At 1430hrs Saturday 3rd December 2011 a white van was stopped in the village of Honington by the local Policing team and searched for stolen property. In the rear of the van Police located an electric fencing unit which had a name and mobile number written on it in permanent black pen (Very good idea - makes the unit very traceable and life a lot simpler for Police). Police rang the phone number and were able to confirm that the unit was stolen last week from the local area. The driver was arrested on suspicion of theft. The vehicle was seized as used in crime and the fuel tank was dipped resulting in red diesel being found, the van has now been handed over to Custom and Excise who will deal with the man for fuel offences.

To All Members – Metal Thefts

You cannot have failed to read in the papers or seen reports on the television that there has been a staggering increase in the number of metal thefts in the last year. I would encourage ALL Neighbourhood Watch and Home Watch members to sign an online e-petition, which would cause a parliamentary debate on the subject of moving towards a cashless business model for scrap metal dealers. Many of these crimes would stop overnight if there was no ready market for their ill-gotten gains. Ninety per cent of transactions in scrap metal yards are by cash. Record-keeping is non-existent and no questions are asked. Existing legislation is very weak and goes back to the Scrap Metal Dealers Act of 1964. Maximum fines are very low. A cashless model would be another step on the route to effective legislation.

There will be exceptions to every model, but legislation which gives robust powers to police and local authorities, accompanied by powers of temporary closure given to Police Superintendents and powers of closure and confiscation of assets given to magistrates, will give legitimacy to genuine businesses and put the cowboys out of business.

These heartless crimes have involved plaques from war memorials and gravestones and the roofs from churches, as well as crimes which have a huge impact on our everyday life, ranging from theft of Network Rail cables, which cause massive disruption to the travelling public, to BT cables which have caused the loss of emergency care lines to sheltered housing schemes and the interruption of communications systems to the fire, police and ambulance services as well as the coastguards and RNLI.

Neighbourhood Watch and Home Watch members have a very important role to play in tackling this abhorrent crime, by being alert to every suspicious incident in their street and reporting these incidents to the police. Those members who live in the vicinity of Scrap Metal Dealers' yards should be extra vigilant and report all suspicious movements.

Christmas Trees

Sussex Police request your help when riding out. It is at this time of year when the majority of Christmas trees are stolen for sale by dubious traders. Please keep a look out for this type of activity and if you spot anything dubious or suspicious please make notes of what you have seen, and the description of all people together with any vehicles. If something of suspicion is in progress telephone 999, if not dial 101.

Crime Prevention Advice from Kent Horsewatch

- Electric Fencing:- If you are not using the unit and fencing for sometime, eg; over the winter months, remove it all and store in a secure place. At very least you should mark your energiser unit with your postcode by either engraving or using an indelible marker pen or paint. Think also about adding your name and telephone number. It is also possible to purchase a specialist box, which may be locked and electrified. To deter vandals and opportunistic thieves, the box can be connected to the energiser, making the energiser box itself live. Access to the box is gained using an insulated key.
- Freight Theft:- It is a recognised trend that the number of offences increase in the period before Christmas, a trend of which road freight drivers should be aware. With fewer daylight hours as winter approaches, drivers should be extra careful on their travels and where possible drivers are advised to stay alert, not to leave keys in their cab's ignition and to always

lock their vehicle, both while driving and even when it's left for a split second.

Additionally, although we understand the difficulties with parking areas, we should always encourage drivers to use secure parking whenever possible. Lastly if drivers see anything suspicious whilst driving or parked up, please inform either the local Police or Truckpol as often those small pieces of information can prove to be the vital link in an investigation.

A high number of electric fence energisers and batteries are being stolen and there has also been 6 stolen from Tonbridge Kent. Please, please be aware and if possible put the energiser in a locked building and connect to the fence via an electric cable.

Bogus Police Calls

Bedfordshire Police is warning residents to be extra cautious regarding the information they give out over the telephone after receiving reports of a bogus telephone caller.

So far six reports have been received over the last two days from residents in the Dunstable and Houghton Regis areas of the county.

A man has contacted the residents posing as a police officer and told them that a warrant is out for their arrest and their house will be raided. Although confused and concerned about the threat luckily the residents have not given out any personal details and contacted the police who have confirmed the calls are a hoax.

Officers would like to urge other residents who have received similar calls to report the matter to the force so action can be taken to trace and stop the hoax caller.

Police are taking this opportunity to remind members of the public not to give out any personal information over the telephone or to any! one who calls at their home unsolicited. Residents are also reminded that they should always check the identification of any caller who visits their home before letting them in, and remember, a representative from any bona fide organisation, including the police, will be happy for their credentials to be checked.

These Scams are Nationwide - Please Don't be Fooled

This is a message from North Yorkshire Police - a male stating he works for Lloyds bank has phoned someone up stating he has a new debit card for the customer, they have confirmed bank details over the phone and then a male delivered and swapped cards at the customers home address, then used the old card to obtain money out of the cash point. We understand from other police forces that there is an emerging trend of the organised theft of GreenStar tractor navigation systems. If you use these systems please consider additional security measures to reduce the risk of theft, a low cost option could include visible security marking the postcode and farm name on the equipment to reduce its value for selling on and therefore make it less attractive to steal.

Theft of power tools is an ongoing issue, particularly garden machinery such as lawn mowers, hedge trimmers, chainsaws etc. Please ensure that you take care to secure such items out of view, and that any sheds etc are securely locked. Please take some time to record the serial numbers for such items, and if possible, security mark them with your post code and photograph the items.

There have also been a few instances of tack theft in the Hampshire area. Again, please take a few moments to record any serial numbers on your tack, get it security marked and photograph it. If you wish to enquire about getting your tack post coded please contact the Country Watch Team or Hampshire Horse Watch who will be happy to assist.

There have been reports recently of the theft of Dogs, particularly in the Thames Valley Police area. We have recently received a couple of reports in the Hampshire area of similar offences. This is a particularly distressing offence due to the emotional attachment people have to their dogs. Please be aware when exercising your dog, that you keep it within view and under control at all times. Please consider getting your dog micro-chipped if you have not already done so. Your Vet or local dog warden can give you advice on this.

Marking your property and recording the serial number may not only act as a deterrent to thieves but will greatly assist the Police in their investigations should your property be stolen. On occasions we recover property which we suspect is stolen, but without anything that can positively identify the items we cannot prove this. This means that property cannot be reunited with its owner and we lose valuable evidence that would assist with the prosecution of offenders.

NORTHERN COUNTRYWATCH WEEKLY WITH YOUR HELP

Recently a JCB3CX digger was stolen from the Fleet area of Hampshire. This vehicle was fitted with a tracking unit and the signal was picked up by Surrey officers and tracked to an isolated property. The stolen JCB was recovered along with further stolen property to the value of £120,000, also located at the premises was an illegal drugs factory. The Regional Police Liaison Manager from TRACKER said 'This just shows how those involved in vehicle crime are involved in a wide range of other criminality, this time involving the production of and, no doubt, the distribution of controlled drugs. This was a great result!'

A cross border operation was run on the 15th November 2011 between Hampshire Country Watch officers, Wiltshire officers, Ministry of Defence Police officers and Thames Valley officers. This took place in the Rural area of Andover and adjoining force borders to tackle rural crime and travelling criminals that operate in this area.

Hampshire Police have followed the Social Media websites in order to locate a rave in the early stages of development at a disused industrial unit in the Andover area. During the night around 70 officers were mobilised from around the County in order to disrupt people travelling to the rave. Police used the powers under the Criminal Justice and Public Order Act to prevent an escalation of the event and also seized the sound equipment to gather evidence and build a case for prosecution against the organisers. Police were in attendance for over 6 hours concluding the incident safely with a number of persons arrested including the organisers.

In all probability this trailer was being stolen to order, meaning that it was not an opportunist crime in action. There would have been a visit prior to the yard prior to the theft allowing the thieves to see what was on offer to steal.

Thieves travel and at this time there is no indication if those responsible were from Hampshire, Dorset Wiltshire or elsewhere. Given that the thieves were prevented in this attempt theft they may well chose another target and that could be your trailer.

Please review your trailer security immediately. Even with Christmas approaching and money being tight it will be worth investing in security for your trailer. £100 £200 invested versus £2000 - £3000 plus trailer being stolen

Things to consider:-

- Good quality wheel locks
- Hitch locks
- Block your trailer in to make it difficult or impossible to move
- Can you immobilise the trailer via the "A" bar.
- Thread good quality chain and padlock around and through the wheels
- Invest in crime prevention, deterrent signage to be place on the sides e.g. Data Tag (there are other products available....go onto the internet to find out)
- There are security firms who can advise on tracker type devices.
- Personalise your trailer i.e. post code, put a logo on it
- Tell friends, users of your yard, neighbours what to do if they see your trailer being towed away by someone other than yourself. If they think it is being stolen treat it as crime in action and call the police on 999. The caller should be in possession of details of the trailer, towing vehicle and direction of travel.
- Trailers can be stolen at any time. In most cases no one is any the wiser if the horse trailer they see on the road is stolen. Be suspicious of all trailers. If the trailer and towing vehicle and its occupants don't look right then take details (if safe and appropriate to do so) and report what you saw to the police/Hampshire Horsewatch.
