#### Theft of horses/ponies

From reading reports received there appears to be an increase in the theft of horses around the country. Mares and stallions are being targeted but equally if the reports are correct others are being taken

The thefts are not large in number but in cases where Shetlands or similar are taken within short distances it has to be considered the work of the same individual or syndicates, in other words organised crime.

Think crime prevention o o o o o o read below.

Details of horses reported stolen appear below. Also your attention is drawn to websites such as Stolen Horse Register, National Equine Database for details of stolen horses. Search the net for other sites.

#### **Crime Prevention**

Everyday members of the equine community and others in the rural communities are experiencing the loss of their property invariably because thieves have stolen those items.

Sadly there is no hard and fast way of stopping thieves who, if determined enough, will commit the crime. However, there are many means and ways in which the community can prevent and deter crime.

In all probability, you know the obvious ways and means to put simple and, more than likely, inexpensive crime prevention and deterrent measures in place around your livery yard/property, but do you actually make the effort?

Rememberõõõõõõ. Apathy is the thiefs best friend.

Take time out to research your needs and seek out advice. Security companies and organisations will offer guidance and advice, usually for freeo ...after all they want your business. At the end of the day you set your budget and work to what you can afford.

Crime prevention and investigation is not the prerequisite of the police. Communities and individuals have to get involved and take positive action. Post coding, uniquely identifying property with a number or other mark is a positive way forward. Examination of property, knowing is history, being suspicious is a way in which crime can be deterred, evidence gathered, stolen property recovered.

Crime prevention is not rocket science. Like setting off fireworks you need to adopt safety precautions with your property in order to make sure you dong become a victim.

All Horsewatch schemes repeatedly remind their equine communities of the need to take positive action with regard to their property.

Without any apologies, we are again referring you to the National Equestrian Crime Database (NECD). There are other similar databases that can be used. NECD is supportive to many equine organisations and offers the equine community an easy to use system. The NECD provides a searchable database for stolen property which is available to all.

The National Equestrian Crime Database (NECD) is a means by which individuals can do something positive to prevent and deter crime. The database when heavily populated with uniquely identifiable property can provide the means for individuals to search the Check It+database for stolen property using identifiable numbers, letters, codes as the search medium.

Below Adrian Keeling the CEO of NECD sets out reasons why individuals should join NECD.



What is the National Equestrian Crime Database and why should I Join?

Crime in the equestrian community is on the increase, with horses, tack and trailers/lorries costing many thousands of pounds and much of this unidentifiable once it has been stolen. There has for a long time been a pressing need for a reliable, secure solution.

The NECD is an internet based system that allows you to upload serial numbers, microchip numbers, passport numbers, chassis numbers, post codes and if your item does not already have a number, it will generate a unique 5 digit serial number which can be stamped into the leather or painted on to your item. You can also upload pictures and a description of your horse, tack or other item.

Once registered, your item can be searched on using a web enabled mobile phone or the %Check-It+box on the home page. This is completely free of charge and you do not need to be a member to search on an item. The police, port authorities, auction houses, in fact anyone anywhere in the world can instantly establish if the item has been stolen. If it has, they will be told the date of the incident, the phone number of the police station dealing with the crime and the crime reference number. If it has not been stolen, they will be informed that the item is for example a brown Jaguar Dressage saddle and that it has not been reported as being stolen. They will NEVER be given your address or contact details. If they need to contact the owner, they can do so via the NECD by asking us to pass on their contact details.

The NECD system also allows members to send alerts via text message to all registered members within 10 miles of their location to warn about criminal or suspicious activity in the locality or such things as loose dogs, slippery roads etc. This service is completely free of charge.

## <u>FAQ</u>

Are the police aware of the NECD?

Police Forces in England, Wales and Scotland were consulted in the build program of NECD and are supportive of the aims and objectives of the scheme. Like anyone else, officers can use the "Check It" search section of the database to see if marked property is recorded as stolen.

How secure is my data? The system is highly secure and is certified to ISO 2701-

2005 which is the highest data security standard available. All of the data resides in a secure commercial data centre and it is NEVER downloaded to any form of portable device such as a laptop. We do not hold your

credit card data, it is all held securely by PayPal.

How much does it cost to join? Membership is free for the first year and then £10 per

year thereafter. You will need to enter your credit card or PayPal details when you subscribe, but no money will be taken for the first 12 months. You can unsubscribe

at any time with no penalties.

Are there any additional or hidden costs? No, £10 per year is all you will ever pay.

Can anyone else see my data? Not only you can see your data (so long as you keep

your password secure!)

If every equestrian uniquely marked their equipment then registered it and their horses, thieves and handlers of stolen property would find it difficult to dispose and sell stolen equestrian property. National Equestrian Crime Database provides the means to prevent and deter equestrian crime.

## 1. Suspicious Ford Transit

When told there was no scrap, they left the premises. Note: there is no vehicle registered with the above VRN, but our informant is adamant that he noted it accurately, so presumably they are false plates.

## 2. Spaniel puppies return home

The 2 x six week old Springer Spaniel puppies stolen from a yard in Hurst, Berkshire on 3 June (Dogwatch 647) have been recovered at a veterinary practice in Fleet, Hampshire. It is believed that they had been brought into the vet as abandoned. They have now returned home safe and well. The moral of this happy story is that if you are selling anything from your home; always note the vehicle make and registration number before doing any business.

For those that are newly added greetings and just to let you know this is now the email address for East Kent Horsewatch. <a href="mailto:diane.leslieveal@btinternet.com">diane.leslieveal@btinternet.com</a>. This account is generally checked daily.

Also to update everyone, I have now started to mark tack. Each saddle is marked with a unique number and then registered on a nationwide database which is used by police forces across the country. I charge £5 plus something toward fuel if it is a long journey to your address. I also have the means to be able to postcode your saddles. However if it is likely you will change your saddle then this isn't such a great option as the postcode remains with the saddle for the rest of its life. I have designed a 'saddle passport' which can be transferred over to new owners etc. Its nothing fancy but just a great way for you to have the details of your saddle written down somewhere safe.

I am now running East Kent Horsewatch as an individual and in my own time rather than from work, I'm always happy to help with crime reduction advice should you wish to email me.

Please continue to send me details of suspicious vehicles, incidents and people as I will still be submitting intelligence reports into the police systems.

#### Scrap metal thefts

We are still suffering from a great deal of scrap metal related incidents where vehicles are driven onto

yards and farms and the occupants then state they are looking for scrap metal. The scrap metal market is currently offering good prices so anything and everything is being stolen. It also gives offenders a good excuse to have a look around to see what else may be available for them to steal.

#### Fuel thefts

Another big problem continues with heating oil thefts and on some occasions they are completely emptying the tank without the knowledge of the owner. It only comes to light when they go to use the heating. There are some alarms on the market which can be activated if the fuel goes below a certain limit and just recently I have found a padlock which encompasses an alarm.

#### Yard thefts

A worrying trend of late is the theft of everything from yards and I mean everything from brushes and headcollars right up to the doors and windows. On one occasion the thieves had the fortunate foresight to put the chains across the stable doors before they stole the actual stable door! However they haven't been quite so thoughtful with thefts of metal gates as they don't seem to care about the livestock in the fields.

#### Feed and hay thefts

I am sure you will all be aware that with the driest Spring on record hay harvests are not likely to be too fruitful. This means hay prices will go up so, sadly, will hay thefts. Please try to store hay in areas that are inaccessible to 'visitors'. This also applies to feed stocks.

#### Catalytic converter thefts

There has also been a run of catalytic converter thefts. It takes around 3-5 minutes for a seasoned thief to remove it from underneath a vehicle. You can buy marker kits specifically designed for this.

#### Thefts from motor vehicles

With the competition season well and truly underway please think about your property when you are at shows. Remove anything of value from your vehicles, don't take the chance that they will be safe and someone will see someone suspicious, its amazing what people choose to ignore. Sat Navs, stereos, bags, wallet, purses etc are all regularly stolen from vehicles when people are at events. The offenders know minds will be elsewhere and maybe not thinking about security. And please don't do what I saw last season and leave your saddles in the back of an open vehicle!!
