Trading Standards - Charity Collections This is a Community Message from Dorset Police.

We have received various reports regarding door-to-door callers asking for email addresses and bank details in order to set up direct debit payments for various charities. While some of these may be legitimate, there have been complaints that heavy handed and aggressive techniques have been used. On one occasion an attempt was made to gain entry under the excuse of needing something to rest on whilst taking details. Most legitimate callers will have their own equipment and identification, however please remember not to divulge any personal details to strangers, however convincing they may be. Please pass this information onto friends and neighbours. Thank you.

Post Coding of Rugs Advice as provided by Horsewatch Scotland

There are several ways to mark your rugs depending on the material they are made from. For light coloured indoor fabrics a black permanent marker pen is a quick solution. Turnouts and thick quilted rugs can have your home postcode painted on. A neat way for marking by hand is to draw around a stencil with a ball point pen and just fill in the letters afterwards.

Iron-on lettering can be made from T shirt transfer sheets sold in stationers. Use the dark material type so you can match or contrast the rug colour. A good bright colour combination will make the postcode easy to see even when the rug is muddy. You can also add a freezemark to show the horse is protected that way.

Be sure to test that the rug will stand the hot iron needed to seal the transfer to the material, follow the maker's instructions carefully and only print with an inkjet (a laser printer will melt the transfer). Three postcodes will fit across an A4 sheet using PowerPoint or Word to set them out in your colours.

Suspicious Activity in Hertfordshire

The person in the field was dressed in Jeans and wearing a yellow jacket with no logo or markings.

When challenged by the owner of the horses who arrived very promptly the male claimed he thought he was in Felden and was looking for the 02 cell phone mast. He had no identification but it was noted that there was a sheaf of papers on the front seat of his motor vehicle.

He drove off towards the Bricklayers arms at just after 11.30 - driving a black Kia Carens, Reg number GF03 KZE. The registration number comes back to a keeper from Kent.

The incident may be innocent but the moral of the story is always remain alert and be suspicious. If you

On Wednesday 1st February 2012 the team conducted a Stay Under 40 speeding operation in the South East quadrant of the Forest. Twelve drivers were checked. Eight of them received a £60 fixed penalty ticket, together with three points on their licence. One driver already had nine points on his licence so another three points will result in a court appearance and a likely driving ban. Two drivers have been referred to a Driver Awareness Training Course, and one driver was given advice. It is disappointing that people continue to speed across the Forest, despite all of the publicity relating to animal accidents.

The game keepers amongst you will no doubt be breathing a sigh of relief now that the shooting season is over. We hope that you get chance to enjoy the brief respite before all of the hard work begins again!

1. Police Tackle Rural Crime

On the evening of the 18 January, police officers and landowners joined forces to tackle rural crime. Approximately 70 officers were dedicated to the operation and 35 landowners, farmers and gamekeepers spread out over South Oxfordshire, the Vale of White Horse and West Berkshire overnight. The landowners acted as spotters, reporting any suspicious activity to a designated operator who then deployed police officers. The aim was to detect and prevent crime as well as to gather intelligence on the people who are frequenting rural areas and committing these crimes. The crimes of concern range from theft of livestock, metal and diesel, to criminal damage on farm land, hare coursing and poaching. As a result, a male was arrested in West Berkshire, approximately 30 stop and searches were carried out and one vehicle was seized in Chievely. This operation emphasises police determination to tackle rural crime.

2. Poaching Successes

On Thursday 19th January, police saw three males with a lurcher dog chasing rabbits in a field at Longworth, Abingdon. The males were arrested for Hunting Offences and bailed until 11th March 2012.

On Friday 20th January, in the early hours of the morning patrolling police saw three males with lurcher dogs in a field in Ashbury. The males admitted trespassing and hunting for rabbits without permission from the landowner and were issued warnings not to commit similar offences in Oxfordshire.

3. Schnauzer Missing ----- SADLY FOUND DECEASED ----- (See Dogwatch No. 740)

At around 8:00 a.m. today 20 January a black giant schnauzer named Rosie went missing at Cholsey. She has an ear tattoo and was wearing a red collar with two tags. Any information to: 07710 172579.



Following on from my message last evening re the stolen rugs, not wishing to rub salt into the wound but sadly they were not marked. So please find attached again the details I sent out recently on how to mark your rugs. Unless there is some form of positive ID the police cannot do anything about it. It is no use you saying "that is my rug because I recognise a tear, a repair or whatever" that does not prove ownership. Rugs are not cheap, mark them, even the cheapest is over £40 and can cost £200, the other fact is that at this time of the years the most popular sizes will be sold out and you could well have problems replacing them.

Rug theft is on the rise across the UK, so please deter the thief, MARK THEM.

If you are the victim of rug theft, or any other piece of tack, look on E bay as a lot of stolen gear is moved on this way, specially if it is not marked.

I hope that I have now got the message across.

More Rug Thefts

Dear All

Yet another case of rugs being stolen off the backs of horses, it has been reported to me by a member that.

Last night Sunday 29th January rugs were stolen straight off the backs of 2 donkey's and 2 Shetland ponies in Yapton Road Middleton On Sea.

Also two sheds were broken into where hay and a green grooming box were stolen in Yapton Road Middleton On Sea, opposite Middleton Farm Shop.

I have spoken to my counter part in Hampshire tonight and he reports that there has been several reported cases recently in his area. A quick way to mark your rugs is to paint your post code in large figures onto the rugs, this will make the cost of removal more than the thieves can sell them for.

Post Coding of Rugs Advice as provided by Horsewatch Scotland

There are several ways to mark your rugs depending on the material they are made from.

For light coloured indoor fabrics a black permanent marker pen is a quick solution.

Turnouts and thick quilted rugs can have your home postcode painted on. A neat way for marking by

hand is to draw around a stencil with a ball point pen and just fill in the letters afterwards.

Iron-on lettering can be made from T shirt transfer sheets sold in stationers. Use the dark material type so you can match or contrast the rug colour. A good bright colour combination will make the postcode easy to see even when the rug is muddy. You can also add a freezemark to show the horse is protected that way.

Be sure to test that the rug will stand the hot iron needed to seal the transfer to the material, follow the maker's instructions carefully and only print with an inkjet (a laser printer will melt the transfer). Three postcodes will fit across an A4 sheet using PowerPoint or Word to set them out in your colours.

Mane Plaiting

The following message was received from Phil Ball of Sussex Horsewatch

Recently I have had several reports from members right across East and West Sussex reporting that their horse/s have again had plaits put in their manes. Having gone over the many cases reported to me and or the police over the last two years what stands out to me is that either the same horses, or horses kept in the same field, or horses kept in close proximity are being targeted. I have said many times that although we do not have categoric evidence, it is widely believed that mane plaiting is a ritual of "White Witchcraft". It strikes me that as all the cases seem to be taking place either at the same farm/yard or properties within 1 mile of each other. To me this suggests that sects of witches operating in their own coven's proximity.

I have had lots of photographs of plaits sent to me and in most cases it is obvious that they have been put in by human hand, but I have to admit that they have been questionable and may have been caused by rubbing against a hedge, fence or gate.

Message from Phil Ball, co ordinator of Sussex Horsewatch

Early December last year I reported on the theft of 'Cookie' a 12.2hh bright bay pony from Suffolk, the little mare is now home safe. As you can imagine her owner and young handler are over the moon.

The return of 'Cookie' to her owners is thanks to her being microchipped; without this important identifying feature they might never have been reunited as her appearance had been altered in the weeks she was missing. A big thank you went out to everyone involved who helped get 'Cookie' home.

If you are an owner of an equine and you have not already done so, could I please urge you to consider getting your animal microchipped and / or freeze-marked. The moral of this tale is that it really does work.

A couple of week ago I also reported on the theft of 'Rosie' a coloured cob from Lincolnshire. It's also good to report that 'Rosie' is also home, being found by her owners some ten miles away.

If you have any scrap metal or vehicle batteries hanging around your yard, take it to a scrap metal merchant. Not only will this make some money for your self but it will also reduce the risk of someone helping themselves and giving them the opportunity to snoop around your property and see what else is worth taking.

To reduce the risk of becoming a victim of theft, make sure your property is well secured and marked so it is identifiable. Time after time theft of property is reported to police, but the owner is unable to give us any serial numbers or identifying features of the items. Keep a note of the serial numbers etc in a safe place or even better record it on Immobilise - a police approved FREE database for any type of identifiable property. Post Coding of Rugs Advice as provided by Horsewatch Scotland

There are several ways to mark your rugs depending on the material they are made from.

For light coloured indoor fabrics a black permanent marker pen is a quick solution.

Turnouts and thick quilted rugs can have your home postcode painted on. A neat way for marking by hand is to draw around a stencil with a ball point pen and just fill in the letters afterwards.

Iron-on lettering can be made from T shirt transfer sheets sold in stationers. Use the dark material type so you can match or contrast the rug colour. A good bright colour combination will make the postcode easy to see even when the rug is muddy. You can also add a freezemark to show the horse is protected that way.

Be sure to test that the rug will stand the hot iron needed to seal the transfer to the material, follow the maker's instructions carefully and only print with an inkjet (a laser printer will melt the transfer). Three postcodes will fit across an A4 sheet using PowerPoint or Word to set them out in your colours.
