#### Helping the Police

The Hampshire Polices rural focus is clearly working and there have been successes. However one of the farmer/ rural dwellers criticisms is that post codes do not work and police response units take too long to arrive or get lost. The mapping system employed at the Call Centre is outstanding, but it lacks your local knowledge - road names some wood names or building names.

Country Watch have previously asked members to send in their information relating to local common place names but there has been a limited response to this request.

Please send in the following details:

- Common Place name
- Nearest Road, (access Road to location)
- Postal Town.
- Longitude/latitude.

Please send the details to the Country Watch Mail box with 'Mapping Northern Country Watch' in the subject box. These details will assist Police units to get to the right place should you be unfortunate enough to need their assistance. **The ball is in our court.** 

NB:- If you do not know how to find the Longitude/latitude for the location all you need to do is find the location on Google maps. If you place your curser over the location, right click on the Mouse and select 'what's here' option. This will give you a reference number in the location box at the top. This will be the Longitude and Latitude for the location.

# Motorcycle Security Warning

For those horse owners or family members who have motor cycles be aware that the north of Hampshire (particularly the Fleet area) is experiencing a different kind of horse power theft!! Motor cycles are being stolen on a regular basis. Please check the security for these machines if you have one, or tell others to do so.

Bedfordshire Police is warning motorcycle owners to take extra precautions to secure their vehicles after recording a rise in the theft of scooters, mopeds and low powered motorbikes. The bikes taken have included brands such as Piaggio, Yamaha, Gilera, Kawasaki and Honda. Most of the thefts have taken place during the hours of darkness and on some occasions the vehicles have been located having been abandoned after possibly being used by joy riders.

Here is some security advice to help motorbike owners keep their vehicles safe:

- Don't make it easy for thieves make sure you secure your bike with a strong, good quality security device and make sure this is also attached to a well anchored point.
- Thieves don't like to be seen if you park on a road make sure you do so in a well-lit area.
- Don't leave your ignition key where thieves can gain access to it keep all keys out of sight and never leave them with your vehicle.
- Keep your vehicle out of sight if you have a garage use it and secure it with a good quality locking system.
- Fit your vehicle with an alarm and use it.

# **OPERATION QUEBEC - UNAUTHORISED ENCAMPMENTS**

This operation is designed to display a responsive approach to unauthorised encampments within the area of Hampshire and the IOW, to help prevent the long term encampments where environmental anti social behaviour tends to occur which impacts on the local community.

Hampshire Constabulary will identify and work with landowners to target-harden those sites that have previously been used for such encampments. Traveller sites will be actively policed and evidence gathered of the condition of the land when groups leave. This evidence will be used to aid further police decision making around future removals.

We will continue to ensure that all our activity is considered within the context of the European Convention on Human Rights both for the travelling and local community. A balance will need to be achieved in all cases.

Country watch Members may be aware of ongoing police action regarding members of the travelling community in the Farnborough area, which are currently in a farmers field in Hawley Lane. Police response to this unauthorised encampment is being implemented through Operation Quebec. Hampshire Police have been aware of this group since mid April. We are actively involved with the land owner to secure the removal of this group from private land.

# For Dog owners who live on the Surrey border area

Two dogs have died after they were believed to have eaten rat poison at Heathlake near Crowthorne on Friday 20 April. Pet owners have been warned to keep dogs on a lead when walking at Heathlake, while Surrey police and council staff investigate the deaths. It is understood several other dogs have also been taken ill after visiting the beauty spot. Tests carried out by the vets indicated rat poison was the cause. Indeed, subsequently four empty packets of rat poison were found around the site.
