Kindly brought to our attention by Sussex Police Protect your mobile phone

Although the advice is directed towards Sussex residents the advice and warning is generic and should be read and considered by everyone.

During May there were several thefts of mobile phones across Sussex. Most of these occurred due to careless owners leaving them on tables in public places, then being distracted by someone whilst the phone is stolen, normally by an accomplice.

This message is just a reminder to all those who carry a mobile phone regularly. Crowded public places such as shopping areas and restaurants are ideal environments for pickpockets and thieves to operate. They can dip in and steal items without you even noticing. Read our advice below and make sure you dong give them the opportunity.

- Do not leave your purse or phone in trolleys or baskets. This makes it an easy target for thieves.
- When paying for goods try not to expose large amounts of cash or place your phone, wallet or purse on the counter.
- Do not carry phones, wallets or purses etc. in easily accessible places. Ensure they are at the bottom of bags or pockets.
- When eating in restaurants or cafes, place bags under the table between your feet or thread the strap through the chair leg.
- If you do leave your phone on a table whilst out and someone you do not know approaches you, ensure you have hold of it.
- We also recommend registering your phone on **Immobilise.com**, a national property database which makes it easier for your phone to be returned to you if stolen or lost. The database is FREE and used by all Police Forces in the UK. We also recommend security marking your phone with a UV marker pen, which Police can supply free of charge. Alternatively, come along to one of our security marking events (Operation Marker) to have your property marked. Wed even register you to Immobilise. Keep an eye on our website to find out when our next event is, we will also send out one of these messages to let you know.

Western Country Watch Weekly – 24 May 2012

Please be aware of a national emerging trend involving the theft of Row Crop wheels. These wheels are thinner than standard wheels but allow tractors to be fitted easier into curtain sided lorries. The theft of these may be going unnoticed due to their seasonal use and the fact that some farms have several sets that can be left unused for long periods. Their theft may also be seen as trivial or unreported but it may be fuelling more serious and organised crime. Please take the opportunity to check that yours are still where you left them.

On Wednesday I attended the Force-wide Rural Issues Group which aims to provide a forum for practitioners to meet and discuss best practice ideas. It was clear from the meeting that over the last twelve months Hampshire Constabulary has made huge advances in terms of service delivery to rural communities. Thank you all for your assistance in reporting incidents that previously would not have been reported.

Also at the above meeting discussion took place relating to the deployment of cameras on private land. I know many of you are interested in this area and there has been much confusion previously about what the Police can and cand do. A request has been made for clarification surrounding Force Policy as there seems to be slight differences in its interpretation by various officers across the Force area.

As the weather improves and people take advantage of the great outdoors, please be mindful that the criminals will also be making the most of opportunities presented to them. It is very tempting with the warm weather to leave windows open whilst away from home. This is an open invitation to a would-be-thief. Please ensure windows are left locked on the latch so they cannot be opened wide enough for someone to climb through. The majority of burglars gain entry to houses through insecure doors and windows.

For those of you who live in the Basingstoke rural area you will be please to hear a replacement for PC Lee Coleshill has now been recruited to the team. PC Steve Rogerson was selected to take on the role. He will be leaving his current role as a rural safer neighbourhood officer in the Tadley area to join our team in a couple of weeks. We look forward to welcoming him.

WITH YOUR HELP

- After a non dwelling burglary to a farm building in the Tadley area where farm equipment was stolen, local targeted patrol officers located the vehicle that had been seen during the offence at Paices Hill caravan park and the offenders made off on foot. The property from the burglary was recovered from the vehicle, subsequent enquiries have identified possible offenders and arrests are imminent.
- A Transit van spotted on the A31 by the Country Watch PCSOs, towing a 4x4 vehicle was stopped by targeted patrol officers. The Transit driver was fined for no insurance and the person in charge of the 4x4, who was a provisional licence holder, was reported for no insurance and driving otherwise in accordance with a licence.
- A male suspected of stealing fuel in the Weyhill area of Hampshire has been arrested in Wiltshire. Enquiries by Hampshire officers are still ongoing at this time.
- As many of you will be aware, the Wickham horse fair was held over the weekend. This event is
 held annually in May and dates back to the 13th century when it was granted a royal charter.
 Country Watch officers and Equine Liaison officers were involved in the policing operation for this
 event. There were a few minor incidents which are currently being investigated. However,
 generally the event passed off peacefully and was enjoyed by all. It was well attended by
 members of the travelling community and local Hampshire residents. It was nice to see so many
 Country Watch members attending and supporting this historical event.

- Theft of Poultry For those of you who keep poultry, please be aware we are receiving reports of chickens and cockerels being stolen across the northern area of Hampshire from gardens and small holdings. On some occasions it is just the birds being stolen but it has also been known for the poultry houses to be taken as well. Please be vigilant, try to place the houses and birds in a location where they are not visible to the public, in an area that will be easily monitored from your premises. Please report any suspicious activity to the police via the 101 number.
- Theft of staddle stones Over the weekend we have had several reports of staddle stones being stolen from rural residential properties. Although they are heavy, they can be easily and quickly removed and difficult to identify once stolen. If you have staddle stones in your garden, please consider security marking them. It is possible to postcode them by etching your postcode on the underside of the base and the top, which would not spoil the ascetics of the item but make it identifiable if it is stolen.
- Bank holiday weekend rave prevention with the bank holiday coming up please be aware of the potential of raves being held across the area. Please be vigilant, report any rave related activity to the police on 101. It is easier to prevent the raves from happening by early intervention than it is to stop them once they have started. Prevention is always better than cure.
- Animal poisoning there have been recent reports in the surrounding counties that food laced with poison is being left in areas frequented by dog walkers. It is believed this is intended to

poison wildlife but reports of dogs being poisoned have also been received. So far the reports have all been in surrounding force areas and we have not received any such reports in Hampshire, but we ask that you remain vigilant when walking your dogs in rural areas, particularly heath land, and report any suspicious activity to the police on 101.

NORTHERN COUNTRY WATCH WEEKLY – 30 May 2012 NORTHERN COUNTRY WATCH AREA EXTENDED

It has been accepted that there are pockets of rural areas in Fareham, Gosport, Park Gate and Hayling Island which should be included in the country watch scheme. Due to the geography of Hampshire these areas have now been taken on by the northern Hampshire country watch team. This does make our area even larger than before. Therefore we have recruited four other officers, on a part time basis, who are based in each of the areas. These officers will continue in their current role on a day to day basis but will also assist with any Country Watch matters which occur within their areas. The Hayling Island area will be covered by PCSO 12626 Jane Peacock, the Park Gate area will be covered by PCSO 14474 Tammi Ley, the Fareham area will be covered by PC 3753 James Heath and the Gosport area will be covered by PC 1882 Joseph Sankey. We welcome them to our team and look forward to extending our membership in these areas.

WITH YOUR HELP

- You may recall from last weeks email we reported on the male arrested by Wiltshire Police for theft of fuel in the Weyhill area. After an extensive investigation by Andover Targeted patrol officers, Andover CID and CSI the male has been charged with Conspiracy to Steal from Motor Vehicles from 1 January 2012 to 20 May 2012 and remanded in custody. A good job well done by all involved!

This has been another busy week for the Country Watch team. On Friday Alan and I visited Dorset Police for liaison/networking meeting to discuss rural policing. We shared many ideas of good practice and have identified ways that the two forces can better work together to target rural criminals.

We were a little late arriving for the above meeting as I came across an injured deer on the way to work. It had been hit hard by a vehicle and left injured at the roadside. Concerned members of the public stopped to assist and a humane dispatcher was called. Anyone found guilty of such a hit and run incident will be prosecuted for causing unnecessary suffering.

I have also had a meeting with Hampshire and IOW Air Ambulance this week. Funding has been secured through partnerships to support the Equine Rider Safety Campaign. Leaflets are in the process of being printed for distribution throughout the area.

On Wednesday evening I took a group of Junior PCSOos from Totton to a Nature Reserve. They undertook a nature walk with a conservation officer and sat in bird hides watching avocets and their chicks, swans and cygnets, great black backed gulls, coots, pheasants, hares and a roe buck resting in

Warning – rogue traders

Rogue traders are currently cold calling in the Farnborough and neighbouring areas of Hampshire, offering to conduct roof inspections and any subsequent repairs which are deemed necessary.

Information received would indicate that false and misleading claims are being made by the trader in order to secure work. In particular, the trader is falsely advising homeowners that due to changes in the law, any house built before 1970 must have a roof inspection carried out. The trader explains that although the inspection is free of charge, any repair work which is necessary will obviously attract a fee. Trading Standards want to assure residents that any claims being mentioned about the legal requirement to have a roof inspected are completely untrue and should be disregarded.

Trading Standards would advise consumers not to agree to work that is instigated as a result of a cold call or via a leaflet drop. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotes from reputable businesses or traders who are either members of the Hampshire County Council Trading Standards Buy With Confidence Scheme or a recognised trade association.

Members of the Buy With Confidence scheme are fully audited to ensure their trading practices are legal, honest and fair. All members have been checked for trustworthiness and compliance with consumer protection laws. Details can be obtained by telephoning 01962 833620, emailing buy.with.confidence@hants.gov.uk or via the website www.buywithconfidence.gov.uk

Traders who agree work at the home of an individual or at a place other than their usual business premises are required by law to provide consumers with a Notice of Right to Cancel, which gives consumers a 7 day cooling off period. Work should not commence until this period has ended, unless written agreement is obtained from that consumer beforehand.
