All that is known about A. Bevan is that she is a youngish woman, possibly with a young child or children and she owned horses. She was living in rented accommodation in the Woodley area of Berkshire. All show/class records have been deleted so any other information is not forthcoming..

The cup in question is known as the Gilby Cup. Its description is Silver two handled cup, scrolls, gryphon and acanthus handles. Reed rim to bowl, stepped trumpet foot on a black plinth. It is engraved "Sir Walter Gilbey Memorial Cup". It is 23 cms overall. It has a Birmingham Assay 1923, weight 22ozs. The cup also has further engraving of "Royal East Berks Agricultural Association"

Warning for 4x4 owners – brought to us by Sussex Police

Catalytic Converter Thefts . there has been a sharp increase in thefts of catalytic converters across the county in the past week. Sussex Police recommend catalytic converter marking for all 4x4 and commercial type vehicles as well as the following steps to keep your vehicle safe .

- Private vehicles should be kept in a well-secured garage where possible, and if no garage is available, in a well-lit, public area.
- Vehicles can be parked in such a way as to make access to the catalytic converter difficult or parallel with another vehicle if you own one.
- Commercial vehicles should be kept in a locked building or compound.
- Use appropriate alarms, lighting and CCTV to deter thieves.
- Remove items of value from your vehicle whilst unattended and keep it secure at all times

Crime prevention

Recently there has been a number of thefts in the New Forest area from rural sheds which are equine related, where horse rugs, equipment and hay has been stolen. The following standard crime prevention methods are once again repeated for your consideration. These suggestions are circulated to the New Forest equine community but are relevant to all.

- Do not leave any items of value within these isolated buildings.
- Either place a security lock (where bolt croppers cannot be inserted) or alarm lock on the shed. Alarm locks will be available from all information offices of New Forest District Council within the New Forest ie, Hythe, Lymington, Ringwood, Fordingbridge, New Milton.
- If hay is to be kept in sheds a suggestion is to cut the strings to make removal more difficult.
- Make sure all rugs, whether stable or turnout, are clearly marked with the owners postcode.
- Postcode any other large items such as trailers and wheelbarrows.
- Report any suspicious vehicles at the time they are seen.
- Report any incident to the police, however small or unimportant you believe it to be.

Recovered equine property

Thames Valley Police have made arrests in Banbury.

Two men and a woman were arrested in the Grimsby area of Banbury for saddlery and rug thefts. Large quantities of equipment have been recovered after links were made with stolen tack being sold on eBay. The recovered saddlery will be on display at the Banbury Police Station and invited persons, who have had tack items stolen in the area, are being invited to attend to view the property. In time if there is still property unidentified the officers dealing with the enquiry will seek to invite others to come and view the remaining items

The recovery of stolen property is very much a matter in your hands. If you have had property stolen make the time to search on social web sites where property is offered for sale or any other outlet where items are advertised. You know your property, what it looks like. When it comes to tracing your stolen property you are the best investigators. Take time, make the time

to research and look. Get family and friends to help you. If you have suspicions about a seller or site tell the police. Thieves and handlers have to advertise property in their possession in order to sell it. They will use media sites such as Ebay as the Banbury arrests indicate.

Proposal to increase HGV speed limit on single carriageway road

A generally unknown proposal by government which could impact on our safe riding of the country roads has appeared, as follows:

The DfT has opened a consultation on increasing the speed limit for HGVqs on single carriageway roads. The consequences to horse riders, cyclists and other vulnerable road users is obvious and we only have until 1 Feb to fill in the on-line consultation at: https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/examining-the-speed-limit-for-heavy-goods-vehicles-over-7-5-tonnes-on-single-carriageway-roads

The questionnaire is mainly aimed at haulage contractors, but it is still possible to make your views known about safety issues.

He said he was working nearby and had some left over tarmac available if the householder wanted their driveway resurfaced at a discounted price.

Trading Standards would advise consumers not to agree to work that is instigated as a result of a cold call or via a leaflet drop. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotes from reputable businesses or traders who are either members of the Hampshire County Council Trading Standards Buy With Confidence Scheme or a recognised trade association.

Members of the Buy With Confidence Scheme are fully audited to ensure their trading practices are legal, honest and fair. All members have been checked for trustworthiness and compliance with consumer protection laws. On Friday 11 January 2013 between 0900 - 1830 hours a stable block/livery yard in the Ropley/Four Marks area was the subject of criminal activity. Electric fencing was up-rooted and horses have been let out of their stables allowing them to escape the security of their field/stable which could have lead to all manner of accidents.

Please report to the police any unusual activity in an around your stable areas or fields. All crimes, no matter how trivial, must be reported to the police. This allows the police to see how many crimes are being committed, where the crimes are being committed to evaluate crime trends and see if there is linkage. If you don't report crime then you are enabling the criminal to get away with it!!

At present the reported incident appears directed to the one yard albeit there have been several incidents there over the past three months but only the most recent has been reported. The regular request to get your property post coded is repeated. This form of crime prevention and crime deterrent remains a Hampshire Horsewatch priority for 2013.

White Defender charges horses – Uffington, Nr Wantage

On Sunday 13 January at approx 1215hrs a member and companion were riding on the road at Sower Hill, Uffington, near Wantage. A white Land Rover Defender fitted with a roof cage deliberately drove at the pair at a speed estimated to be 40-45 mph. The rider signalled to the driver to slow down but he took no notice and came within inches of the two horses causing one of them to % pook+. The registration number could not be read because of the speed of the vehicle, but it had a cover on its spare wheel marked % James French+. Similar incidents have occurred several times in the area. Be sure to report any similar happenings to the police.

Warning for 4x4 owners

Catalytic Converter Thefts . there has been a sharp increase in thefts of catalytic converters across the county in the past week. Suffolk Police recommend catalytic converter marking for all 4x4 and commercial type vehicles as well as the following steps to keep your vehicle safe.

- Private vehicles should be kept in a well-secured garage where possible, and if no garage is available, in a well-lit, public area.
- Vehicles can be parked in such a way as to make access to the catalytic converter difficult or parallel with another vehicle if you own one.
- Commercial vehicles should be kept in a locked building or compound.
- Use appropriate alarms, lighting and CCTV to deter thieves.

First, Happy New Year and I hope that you had an enjoyable festive period. There have been 2 recent incidents I would like to draw to your attention.

Attempted theft of 2 quad bikes - farm in the Parbroath area

Two padlocks were overcome giving access to 2 quad bikes that were pushed a distance before being abandoned and subsequently discovered.

It may be the time spent overcoming the security around the quad bikes delayed the thieves long enough that they abandoned their attempts. However I would advise that padlocks should be of a high standard, designed to limit access for bolt cutters and, where possible, protected by steel covers only allowing access to lock/unlock the padlock.

Attempt theft from vehicle – Lutherie area

2 males disturbed attempting to remove the plastic wheel-arch trim from the front of a Ford Transit van

Ensure that any vans/vehicles with trim/parts that may be targeted are either secured in buildings or parked in such a manner to make access difficult.

*** Update on stolen mare - Dalry, Ayrshire *** Crime Ref: UA0488 1212

Regarding the theft of Elise (the mare below) from Dalry, Ayrshire . she has been recovered safe and well and is being returned to her rightful owner.

Theft of tack from stables - Longidge, Nr Whitburn, West Lothian
