Attempt theft of horses – West Yorkshire

Crime Ref: 326 16/12

Please be on the look out for a plain white van/lorry about 5+5m not coach built, but the back inside was set up for horses etc, it had no windows so looks like a delivery van (possibly an ex Royal Mail Parcel lorry). Believed there was an attempt to take horses from a field in Norland, near Sowerby Bridge, West Yorks at 8.30am on 16/12 . offenders were disturbed and the horses ended up on the road.

A Reminder.

Today's news is tomorrow's history!! Thieves will work on the assumption that people have short memories and will forget what crime has taken place, what has been stolen. As a consequence they are likely to not get caught and those moving stolen goods on are equally not likely to get caught in possession.

Purchasers of stolen property can be found though!!!

One way of defeating thieves and handlers is not to buy stolen property. Remember what is stolen has to surface again to make money for the thieves and handlers. Buy second hand goods but before you do ask searching questions about who is doing the selling. Examine the items you are thinking of buying. Look for post codes, other identification marks.

If you have doubts about the seller, take their details (descriptions), vehicle registration numbers (if possible), and telephone numbers. Inform your local police of your concerns and, if in place, your local Horsewatch scheme.

Below is a large item stolen in Hampshire in November 2013. It is out there somewhere waiting to be erected or has been erected.

An interesting point and something to consider – the thieves actually took the trouble to unscrew the haynet rings from the walls. As the aggrieved said why would they do that, why take the trouble and time to do that? She thinks that maybe the thieves won't use the shelter to keep a horse in.

The shelter was constructed by the aggrieved. It is 16' x 12.' The back of the shelter is constructed in 3 sections and has louvre windows made out of different wood than the sides. The roof is made of Onduline material/covering.

Please keep a look out for any new constructions in fields or rural locations. Does what you see look like the field shelter in the photograph? It may be that the shelter will be advertised for sale. Please bear in mind anything similar being offered for sale. If you have doubts or concerns or information which could assist in the recovery of this field shelter contact your local police. Missing/theft of a colt - Argyll, near Dunoon but closer to Strachur

Sunflower is an 8 month old colt. He went missing on Monday 28 October night or Tuesday 29 morning leaving his companion in the field. A gate secured with strong wire was opened to the field, the wire is gone but the gate was left flat on the ground.

Sunflower is a skewbald cob with feathers and a big mane, about 13 to 13.2 hands, is quiet friendly and well handled but could easily get a fright or get scared. His microchip number is 958000002472597. It is not clear if the colt has gone off by himself or if he has been stolen.

The offender damaged a section of fence to access the field, where a number of Shetland ponies are kept. One pony was taken - an elderly black Shetland pony. 35 years old. Has a greying face, with a

scar on its neck. Freeze-marked with number 4 9 0 E on its side. The rug the pony was wearing was removed and left at the location. The remaining ponies were left unharmed.

Crime prevention advice:-

- Be aware of any suspicious vehicles and people in yards and around horses.
 - Keep valuables secure. Avoid leaving tack or equipment at yards where they can be seen from the road.
 - Mark all property. Use a visible marking for machinery and equipment, such as etching or engraving.
 - Secure all vehicles in the yard. Do not leave keys with vehicles.

GOOD NEWS STORIES

- You may remember that three males were arrested in October in the Chilbolton area in possession of three ferrets which were suspected to have been stolen. The investigation into this incident has been completed and all three males have been charged with theft and bailed to attend court.
- Two males were arrested for burglary to a non dwelling in the Ball Hill area and had their Subaru vehicle seized after they were stop checked by a patrolling officers in the area. Enquiries are ongoing.
- Three males were arrested in Tadley after being stop checked by police in the area of a dwelling burglary. Enquiries are ongoing.
- Three males who were arrested for illegal metal detecting in the Curdridge area were cautioned for the offence.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Summary of reported rural crime in north and east Hampshire

- Reports of burglary to non dwellings have been reported across the area. In the majority of these offences power tools have been targeted. In Tufton a red Honda TRX350FMS quad bike was stolen along with power tools. Two ornamental stuffed pheasants were stolen in the Durley area and in the Privett area a quantity of Keymar roof tiles worth £2000 was stolen. In a few of the burglary reports it would appear nothing has actually been taken.
- A grey Daihatsu Fourtrak M399 XCR was stolen from the Clanville area.
- Several thefts from motor vehicles have been reported in the rural areas. Fuel from the tanks of two lorries was stolen at Sutton Scotney, catalytic convertors were taken from vehicles in Bishops Waltham and Yateley, power tools stolen from a work van in Headley and a car was broken into at Broadmarsh, Havant, but nothing appears to have been stolen.
- There have been poaching offences reported in Whitchurch, Warnford, Lovedean, Chidden, Hambledon and Bramdean. Damage was caused to crops and fencing in some of these incidents. At one incident at Warnford a vehicle was seen, a purple Jeep N598 UPF, which made off from police officers and was unfortunately lost when the occupants shone a high powered

torch at the following officers. Enquiries are ongoing to try to trace the vehicle and its occupants.

- Other property damaged has included CCTV at Pitt, Winchester, locks to a compound in Leckford were damaged, a vehicle was scratched all along the side in Hambledon, a van in Owslebury had damage to its door, possibly an attempt to break into the vehicle and fencing to a stables was damaged in the Waterloo area.
- There is a reduction in the number of reports of rural theft across the area during this week. Red diesel was reported stolen from a container on the A3 at Clanfield, and also from a site in Shedfield. At Coopers Hill there would appear to have been an attempt theft of fuel from some lorries on a site, fuel caps were removed, but all lorries had been left empty by the owners and in Kings Worthy fuel was siphoned from a fork lift on a farm. In Steep a pallet of tiles was stolen, at Pitt Hill several horse rugs, a pair of boots and a wheel barrow were stolen.
- We have also received a report of the theft of three Ryeland rams from a pen in a field at Bramley. Two of the rams had pink colouring over them and the third had it on its under belly from breeding paint. This is an isolated theft and livestock theft is a rare occurrence in the Hampshire area.
- We have received a report in the Froxfield area of three gundogs missing from their kennel between 1830hrs and 1915hrs on Sunday evening. The owner was alerted by a neighbour when he saw one of the dogs out running around in the road. The owner checked the kennel that the dogs were kept in and found all three dogs had gone. There was no sign of any forced entry and the door to the kennel was still shut and bolted. If you live in the area please can you be on the look out for these dogs who may be lost. One is a brown and white Springer spaniel and the other is a black and tan Cocker spaniel.
- Please be aware of rogue traders operating in the rural areas. Cold callers offering tree work have been operating in the Hambledon area. These people give an initial quote but once the work is done they grossly inflate the price and try to intimidate the victim into paying.

Warning from Hampshire Trading Standards

Rogue traders are currently cold calling in Fair Oak and surrounding areas of Hampshire offering to resurface driveways. It appears they may be making false claims to be connected with roadworks being carried out nearby or to be working for the Council.

Trading Standards would advise consumers not to agree to work that is instigated as a result of a cold call or via a leaflet drop. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotes from reputable businesses or traders who are either members of the Hampshire County Council Trading Standards Buy With Confidence Scheme or a recognised trade association.

Members of the Buy With Confidence scheme are fully audited to ensure their trading practices are legal, honest and fair. All members are checked for trustworthiness and compliance with consumer protection laws. Details can be obtained by telephoning 01962 833620 or by emailing buy.with.confidence@hants.gov.uk or via the website www.buywithconfidence.gov.uk.

Traders who agree work at the home of an individual or at a place other than their usual business premises are required by law to provide consumers with a Notice of Right to Cancel, which gives consumers a 7 day cooling off period. Work should not commence until this period has ended, unless written agreement is obtained from that consumer beforehand.

Combating Rural Crime

1. Suspected poachers caught

A silver Subaru Imprezza was seen in suspicious circumstances in two incidents in Surrey and a registration number was passed on to the police. The VRN was circulated and the following night ANPR cameras in Newbury alerted officers to it.

Five men were caught stealing pheasants and arrested. The vehicle and other items were seized. This is a great example of cross border co-operation in the fight against rural crime.

2. Stolen dog recovered

On Saturday 30 November at midday, a Cocker spaniel dog was stolen from a garden in North Hinksey Lane, Oxford. A white male was seen by a witness running away with the dog. A description of the suspect was given to the police. As a result of police activity a 31 year old male and a 21 year old male, both from Bloxham, near Banbury, were arrested on Saturday (30/11), in relation to the offence, but were later released with no further action. The dog was later recovered near the A34 Oxford, on Sunday (01/12) and returned to its owner.

3. Pheasant poaching

Overnight between the 7/8 December offenders gained access to farmland on Rag Hill, Aldermaston. They drove around the field causing damage to crops and shot and stole roosting pheasants.

Overnight between the 9/10 December offenders shot and killed 15 pheasants and stole others from a wooded area in Ashampstead.

Combating Rural Crime

1. Suspected poachers caught

Thames Valley Police has arrested three men on suspicion of hunting act offences in Ewelme, Wallingford. Two men aged 63 and 20 from Gerrards Cross, and a 40 year old man from Bellewstown, Country Meath, Ireland, were arrested on suspicion of hare coursing in a field in Ewelme, on Wednesday 18 December, at 2.20pm. The three men were released on bail with conditions until Saturday 28 December.

In a separate incident, overnight between the 14/15 December offenders drove over a field belonging to a farm near Ambury Road, Aldworth, Reading. They were possibly hare coursing.

2. Suspicious vehicles
