The below has been received from Suffolk Horsewatch. Although the crime prevention message is for Suffolk readers the advice is equally applicable to anyone, anywhere......

Competitors are being warned to be on their guard at equestrian events following thefts from horse lorries at two separate equestrian venues last weekend (15 – 16 March 2014). Cash was stolen from the unlocked and unattended vehicles.

Suffolk Police urges competitors at horse shows to use common sense and ensure they are not easy targets.

It is easy to assume that you're with like-minded people and drop your guard, but that's when you're vulnerable and thieves take advantage.

- Don't leave your saddle resting against the horse box or the bridle hanging off the wing mirror – when unattended lock your tack away.
- Don't leave your handbag, mobile phone or wallet lying on the front seat of an unlocked vehicle.
- Remain vigilant and if you see anyone lurking around the lorry park that seems suspicious or out of place, immediately contact the police or a show steward.
- If possible leave someone guarding the trailer/horsebox . Remember that this does not mean you can leave property insecure....whilst distracted the "guard" may not see the sneak thief removing property!!

GOOD NEWS STORIES

Joby HUGHES, 18yrs, from Totton pleaded guilty in court on the 15th January 2014 for an offence of theft after he was arrested in October 2013 with two other males for the theft of ferrets in the Chilbolton area. He was fines £300, ordered to pay costs of £400 and a £30 victim surcharge. The case against the other two males was discontinued when HUGHES pleaded guilty to the offence.

Two males have been arrested for the theft of diesel from a number of lorries in the Bishops Waltham area which occurred earlier this month. Both males are currently on police bail pending further enquiries.

Summary of reported rural crime in north and east Hampshire

(Incorporating Information From Around The Country)

Date 13th March 2014

Reported burglaries to non dwellings have been fewer over the last week, There were three burglaries to outbuildings in the Greatham area, bicycles and fishing equipment were stolen. Two reports of barns being broken into in Upton (Andover) and Pamber End, in both incidents, entry was gained to the barns, machinery moved around but nothing was stolen. In Church Crookham two garages were broken into, nothing was stolen from one, from the other a blue and silver Sherco 290 trials bike and a jet washer were stolen. In Bishops Green a shed was broken into, nothing was stolen but a vehicle at the same location was also broken into and had a jacket and mobile phone charger stolen from it. In the Itchen Abbas area a workshop on an isolated rural property was broken into and a blue Ford Focus HV55YNJ was stolen, along with an Autel diagnostics kit, a Halfords jump pack and a Redsport weld puller. Other items stolen in other non dwelling burglaries included garden tools and petrol driven power tools.

Rural burglaries to dwellings include a property in Bishops Waltham where jewellery was stolen, Farley Chamberlayne, where an Ipad and mobile phone was stolen and in Oakley there was an attempted burglary, no entry was gained to the property.

Rural theft this week has also been reduced to previous weeks. In Weston (Petersfield) heating oil was stolen from a storage tank on a rural premises. A bag of horse feed was stolen from a stable in Curbridge, a gas cylinder and generator was stolen from a caravan in a locked compound in Sherfield on Loddon. In Bramley, an aerial was stolen from a caravan stored on a farm, and in Bighton a quantity of York stone has been reported stolen. A golf club in the Shedfield area has had a flag post stolen, greens and other posts damaged by unknown offenders.

The usual reports have been received of handbags and valuables being stolen from vehicles in the areas of Butser Hill and Exton. In Eversley a cement mixer was broken into, the cab was searched but nothing was stolen. Catalytic convertors have been reported stolen from a vehicle in Crux Easton and in Stoke (Andover). At the latter location the offender tied a rope between the vehicle and the door of the house, thus preventing any likelihood of the owner coming out of the property to disturb the offender. In the Crondall area, it was reported that a Ford Fiesta had fuel stolen from it after an unknown offender drilled the fuel tank. Both these last two incidents are unusual in their modus operandi.

There has been a report that fencing along the Harrow Way at Dean has been damaged. In Waltham Chase there has been a report of arson, where unknown offenders have set fire to a pile of rubbish and a horse box, on separate occasions at the same stable yard.

A disturbing report has been received from horse riders in the Bucks Horn Oak area. Whilst riding on a road in the area they were approached by a small light cloured vehicle, which slowed down as it approached the horses, as it got along side the horses an occupant in the vehicle threw a banger out of the window. Luckily, on this occasion, no one was injured. This was a mindless act that could have ended in tragedy.

With all the wet weather we have been experiencing, we have been receiving a higher level of calls regarding livestock, particularly horses, getting out of their fields and onto the road. Please ensure you regularly check your fencing to ensure it is secure and not becoming loose in the sodden ground.

When Police get called to incidents of horses loose on the road, they are usually faced with panicking terrified horses, that are at risk of being seriously injured or killed, or causing an accident or damaging property. These incidents are resource intensive, needing a lot of officers, who may not be used to handling horses, let alone frightened horses, to try to contain the animals. Once they have contained the animals they then have the problem of trying to find where they have come from, and if this cannot be ascertained, finding somewhere to put the horses where they will be safe. The Police do not have facilities to keep horses when we cannot trace where they have come from or who thy belong to, we usually have to rely on the good will of someone with a field, or, as has happened in the past, someone who is willing to keep the horses in their garden until the owners can be located. When this happens, we usually find that the owner reports their horse stolen when they next visit it, because it is not where it should be.

To try to alleviate this problem, Hampshire Horse Watch are collating details of where horses are kept and the owners contact details, so that the control room can contact them to assist with returning their horses to where they should be, and to repair any fencing to prevent the horses escaping again.

GOOD NEWS STORIES

- Three men have been reported for Summons for peddling without a license in the Basingstoke and Basingstoke rural area after trying to sell goods door to door without the correct paperwork.
- A male has been warned for not providing the appropriate paperwork regarding a 'cooling off' period to carry out work in the Whitchurch area. This came to light when Officers saw a man from the back of Whitchurch Police Station stood on a neighbouring house roof, power washing it with no safety equipment! Suspicion led to them attending the address and getting further information.

Summary of reported rural crime in north and east Hampshire

- There has been a series of non dwelling burglaries to sheds in the Ecchinswell area in recent weeks. Garden tools and bikes have been taken from garages and sheds, with other sheds being entered but nothing taken. There has been a theft from motor vehicle in the same area with cosmetics and clothes stolen and also a set of gate lanterns unscrewed and stolen.
- A selection of Stihl tools were stolen from a workshop at a golf club in Winchester and an
 unlocked shed had chainsaws taken from the Shawford area. A shipping container on a
 farm in Petersfield was broken into, with various items stolen including power tools,
 copper, lead and timber and in Over Wallop, a rural vehicle maintenance workshop was
 broken into, with numerous power and hand tools taken. A quad bike was stolen from farm
 buildings in Ludgershall and there was also a bag of lead taken from a scrap yard in
 Appleshaw.
- In Warnford, a rural company that repairs garden machinery was broken into, but an alarm sounded which is believed to have scared the offenders away and nothing was taken.
- Around £150 of diesel was taken from four different horse lorries at a livery yard in Eversley, oil thefts have been reduced, however there was almost a full tank stolen from an address in Alresford between 21st-22nd February.
- A dark blue twin axle RICE horse box was stolen from Petersfield and a green RICE double horsebox was taken from Tangley. In Headley over £30,000 of cabling was taken from a pumping station.

- Thefts from motor vehicles have seen a rise this week, with a jacket and wallet taken from a van in Overton, a laptop from Kingsclere and cash from Church Lane, Exton. A handbag was taken from a car at Farley Mount, Winchester and in Buriton a briefcase was taken from a back seat. This is a good reminder to make sure that all valuables are hidden out of sight when your vehicle is parked, particularly in rural locations.
- In Micheldever a vehicle was broken into, moved and then it had its wheels, bonnet and light clusters removed and in Hartley Witney, a Red and Green Clancy Docwra JCB3X was stolen from a building site and enquiries are ongoing into this.
- Other incidents of note, a young black dog was found dead in Owslebury and details
 passed to the RSPCA. Items had been moved around at a stable yard in Petersfield
 although nothing was taken and there have been further reports of rogue traders targeting
 the elderly in rural locations.
- There has also been a report of fly-tipping in South Warnborough, but again these incidents are reducing.

Every so often we get reports of horse owners discovering a plait put in their horses mane or tail, this can be quite distressing as there are lots of stories regarding the horse being marked to steal. Although horse theft sadly does take place, it is rare in Hampshire and each of these incidents is unique. Most of the time, the plait is made from horses 'necking' or rubbing themselves against a tree or post, however there are occasions when person made plaits are discovered. It is important that these incidents are reported to Police and even more important that photographs are taken as normally an Officer can distinguish what sort of plait it is, so before brushing them out, please photograph it and contact - equine@hampshire.pnn.police.uk.

2. Success in Fight Against Rural Crime

Two High Wycombe men have been sentenced a total of 40 months imprisonment after pleading guilty to a number of thefts and burglaries in Wycombe.

Paul Horwood, age 33, from Oldhouse Close, and Jed Shurety, aged 44, from Inkerman Hill, each pleaded guilty at Oxford Crown Court on Tuesday (25/2), to one count of handling stolen goods; one count of burglary non-dwelling; and five counts of theft.

Horwood was sentenced to 22 months imprisonment, and Shurety was sentenced to 18 months.

The charge of handling stolen goods relates to a mini digger stolen in Studley Green on 15 August 2013. The burglary non-dwellings relate to an offence on 25 July 2013 in EJ Churchill Shooting ground.

Thefts - Holywell Row (IP28)

Police are linking a number of crimes committed between 7th March and 10th March in the Holywell Row (IP28) area. Electric fence energisers, batteries and gardening equipment have been taken. Overnight on 6/7th March a lock and chain was removed from a field gate in the same area. It is not known if it was an attempted theft of a horse, but it was found running loose by a member of the public.

Electric fencing and energising units are naturally vulnerable to theft due to the remote location they are frequently used.

- If you are not using the unit and fencing for sometime, e.g over the winter months, remove it all and store in a secure place. At very least you should mark your energiser unit with your postcode by either engraving or using an indelible marker pen or paint.
- It is possible to purchase a specialist box, which may be locked and electrified. To deter
 vandals and opportunistic thieves, the box can be connected to the energiser, making the
 energiser box itself live. Access to the box is gained using an insulated key, so you don't
 have to give yourself a shock every time you wish to open it.

Protect Your Horse

- Make sure you have a good selection of summer and winter photographs from all angles
 and a correctly completed passport drawing. You should also ensure your horse can be
 positively identified by anyone. Even if he only escapes from the field there must be way to
 trace him back to you.
- Freeze branding is a visible mark that allows easy identification and can quickly be linked
 to the registered owner, usually by phone. It is a lifetime identifier that is supported by a
 registration pack, transferable to subsequent owners. A freeze brand can also be read
 from a distance, even if the horse cannot be caught. There is an excellent record of
 recovery for freeze branded equines, unmarked they are sometimes never found.
- **Microchips** contain a unique number but they rely on the correct scanner being available to read the chip. This registration number then has to be checked on a database before an owner can be traced. Unfortunately they are not a visible deterrent against theft.
- Hoof branding usually involves a home postcode but has to be regularly repeated by your farrier. It can also be difficult to read from a distance or if hooves are muddy.
