It is in everyone's interest to look at second tack and equine property carefully and sad to say view every item with suspicion.

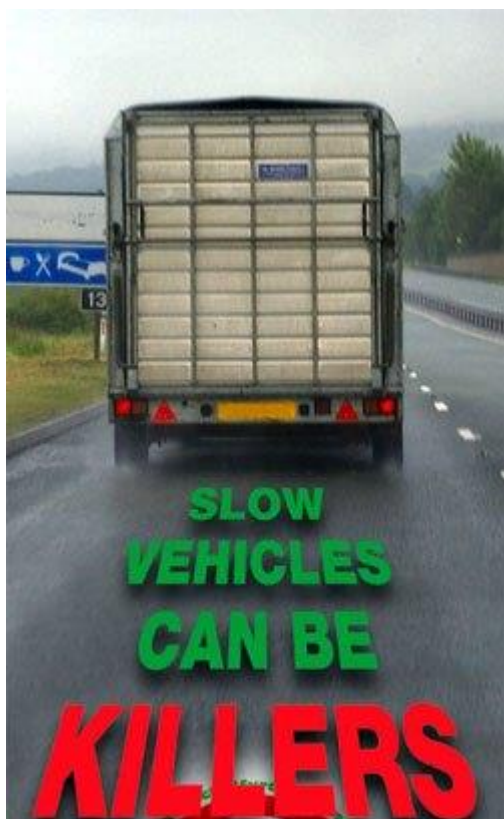

SUSSEX HORSE WATCH

Advice for Drivers of Slow Moving Vehicles



All road users have a responsibility for their own safety and the safety of others.

The risk to drivers of slow moving vehicles and their passengers, and other road users and their passengers, increases if visibility is limited or the intentions of the vehicle's driver are not made clear.

The offence of dangerous driving not only refers to the way a vehicle is driven, but also to the condition of that vehicle.

In general, agricultural vehicles and trailers only are exempt from lighting regulations when used only during the hours of daylight. However, this type of vehicle and any trailer must display the appropriate lights if on the road before sunrise or after sunset. Failure to comply with this requirement is an offence and could lead to two years imprisonment and/or a fine, disqualification and a compulsory re-test.

Some vehicles are required to display flashing amber beacons on unrestricted dual carriageways, but it is recommended that ALL slow vehicles have flashing beacons on roads carrying fast traffic.

Summary of advice for drivers of slow moving vehicles

- Vehicles and trailers must display appropriate lights between sunset and sunrise.
- Reflectors and lights should be kept clean.
- Showing a white light to the rear is an offence when the vehicle is travelling forwards.
- Both the owner and the driver (who may be an employee) have responsibility for the condition of a vehicle and any towed trailer being driven on the highway.
- Driving a vehicle on the highway that does not comply with the regulations can lead to a charge of dangerous driving.
- The penalty for dangerous driving can be a maximum of two years imprisonment.

Please note horse trailers must have working lighting whenever they are on the Public Highway.

Message from Barclays Bank Fraud Team

Recent fraud cases have seen farmers and agriculture business being targeted. Fraudsters are calling or writing to people impersonating the bank's fraud team or police. Their aim is to dupe you into believing your bank account has been compromised and that you are a victim of fraud. The fraudster will tell you that to protect your money, you need to transfer all your funds into a new account that has been set up in your name. The money is actually going to a fraudster's account.

Please remember:-

Banks and the police will never contact you to ask you to transfer funds or hand over your cards or money:-

- If you get an unsolicited phone call, be on alert
- If you are suspicious of the caller, end the call and call back on the number of the back of your card or from one of your statements. Be aware that the phone line can still be open when you've put down the receiver. Call back from a different phone or call someone you trust first to ensure the call was disconnected

Crime Prevention

There appears to be a rash of horse theft taking place, not of epidemic proportions but enough create concern and for the owners of horses stolen a lot of upset and misery.

Now is a good time to remind people of how effective freeze marking is as a theft deterrent and the fact that horses are more accessible to thieves in the Summer.

Freezemarking your horse ensures that it has a visible identification mark. It will assist in proving ownership much in the same way as a microchip will. As always, documentation to back up ownership will be required.

All horses born after the 1st July 2009 must be micro chipped within six months of birth and before the end of the year.

WAKE UP TO THE DEADLY RISK: SMOKING IS THE BIGGEST HOUSE FIRE KILLER

Smokers are being warned that they must wake up to the deadly dangers of smoking - especially when tired. North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service (NYFRS), part of the Fire Kills campaign, highlights that a third of all deaths in fires in the home are caused by cigarettes.

Smoking is the single biggest killer in accidental fires in the home, often because of careless behaviour such as smoking in bed or not taking care after drinking alcohol. Falling asleep with a lit cigarette in hand increases the smokers proximity to the resulting fire and seriously lowers their chance of escaping in time.

NYFRS is reminding smokers to 'Put it Out, Right Out' whenever they light up; to install smoke alarms on every level of the home; and, to test them on the 1st of every month. Without a working smoke alarm you are at least four times more likely to die in an accidental fire in the home.

These simple steps can help prevent a cigarette fire in the home:

Never smoke in bed. Take care when you're tired – it's very easy to fall asleep while your cigarette is still burning and set furniture alight

Never smoke when under the influence of drugs or alcohol. If your lit cigarette starts a fire you could be less able to escape.

Put it out, right out! Make sure your cigarette is fully extinguished

Fit a smoke alarm and test it weekly. A working smoke alarm can buy you valuable time to get out, stay out and call 999

Never leave lit cigarettes, cigars or pipes unattended – they can easily overbalance as they burn down
Use a proper, heavy ashtray that can't tip over easily and is made of a material that won't burn.

Every six days, someone dies from a fire caused by cigarettes or smoking materials. Despite a fall in the overall number of fires caused by these products, it's still the biggest killer in accidental fires in the home across the country. Every smoker should wake up to the risks they take every time they light up, and drop the habit of smoking whilst in bed or under the influence of alcohol. The risk of falling asleep before you 'put it out, right out' is just too great. Just two to three breaths of toxic smoke can render you unconscious, so invest in a working smoke alarm and test it monthly. It can give you the extra time you need to escape if the worst should happen.

GOOD NEWS STORIES

Officers from Hampshire Constabulary attended an unlicensed music event at 6.20pm on Sunday, March 16 at Ibworth near Kingsclere. On arrival at the scene, they discovered between 20 and 25 people gathered around speakers and music equipment and around 10 cars. A number of further cars on route to the location were stopped by police and turned around. Officers took steps to locate the organisers of the event, who were informed that the gathering was illegal. Action was then taken to disband the group and the site was cleared by 7.30pm. The music equipment located at the site was seized.

Two men from Basingstoke aged 19 and 22 were arrested on suspicion of organising an unlicensed music event. They have been bailed pending further enquiries until April 15. Inspector Jon Turton, who led the police response to this incident, said: "Hampshire Constabulary takes a robust stance to dealing with any unlicensed music events within our borders. These type of illegal gatherings cause disruption and distress to local communities and anyone organising or attending such an event runs the risk of gaining a criminal record."

Summary of reported rural crime in north and east Hampshire:-

- Non dwelling burglaries in rural Winchester this week include a break in at Otterbourne where a bicycle was stolen from a garage, the fisheries at Headbourne Worthy were broken into and a chain saw stolen, at Kings Somborne and Old Alresford there were attempts to burgle outbuildings but no entry was gained.
- In the Basingstoke rural area non dwelling burglaries include a green house in Burghclere which was broken into and a lawn mower stolen, in Wolverton a shed was broken into and several petrol driven power tools were taken. In North Symonton hand tools were stolen from a barn and in Oakley, out buildings on a farm were broken into and a chainsaw and a generator were stolen.
- In the Andover rural area a farm building was broken into at Fullerton and five propane gas cylinders were stolen.
- In the East Hants area a white van was seen to enter a building site in Liphook and is suspected to have taken property from the site. In Bentley the local store was broken into and cigarettes stolen, a silver Subaru is believed to have been involved.
- In the Hart rural area several small businesses on a farm in the Church Crookham area were broken into, small amounts of cash were stolen, in Rotherwick, lead was stolen from a garage that was under construction and a cricket club in the Hook area was broken into but nothing was stolen.

- In the South of Butser area an out house in the Horndean area was broken into, a chainsaw and a wildlife camera was stolen.
- Rural dwelling burglaries this week include a property in North Waltham where a laptop was stolen, an attempt burglary to a property in the Hurstbourne Tarrant area, entry was not gained and a property in Newton Valence was broken into and jewellery was stolen.
- Rural theft this week in the Basingstoke rural area includes a wood chipper stolen in the Herriard area, and lead stolen in the Little London area.
- In the Andover rural area scrap metal was stolen in Appleshaw.
- In the Winchester rural area an agricultural Mule vehicle was stolen in Swanmore, an Ifor Williams flat bed trailer was stolen in Alresford and in Curdridge a number of Laurel trees were dug up and stolen.
- In the Hart area a quantity of BT cable was stolen in Eversley, where unknown offenders have lifted road covers, cut the cables and pulled them from the ground.
- In the East Hants area Laurel trees were dug up and stolen, a white van was possibly involved. In Froxfield a quantity of lead was stolen and in East Meon a quantity of roofing tiles and ridge tiles were stolen from a house that is currently being renovated.
- Theft from motor vehicles have been reported in Appleshaw, where a wallet and cash was stolen, Old Basing where works vans were broken into and tools stolen, and in Medstead, on the A34 Whitchurch and Church Crookham, diesel has been stolen from lorries.
- Does anyone have any information on this dog? This dog was captured on camera in the Droxford area by a member of the public after it was seen attacking a deer. If you recognise this dog or you have any information on who the owner may be please let us know.



Warning from Hampshire Trading Standards

Rogue Traders are currently cold calling in the LOCKS HEATH area of Hampshire offering to carry out roof repairs.

Trading Standards would advise consumers not to agree to work that is instigated as a result of a cold call or via a leaflet drop. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotes from reputable businesses or traders who are either members of the Hampshire County Council Trading Standards Buy With Confidence Scheme or a recognised trade association.

Members of the Buy With Confidence scheme are fully audited to ensure their trading practices are legal, honest and fair. All members have been checked for trustworthiness and compliance with consumer protection laws. Details can be obtained by telephoning 01962 833620, emailing buy.with.confidence@hants.gov.uk or via the website www.buywithconfidence.gov.uk

Traders who agree work at the home of an individual or at a place other than their usual business premises are required by law to provide consumers with a Notice of Right to Cancel, which gives consumers a 7 day cooling off period. Work should not commence until this period has ended, unless written agreement is obtained from that consumer beforehand.

GOOD NEWS STORIES

- Officers from Hampshire and Thames Valley Police took part in Operation Festive on Wednesday night, tackling cross border rural crime. 45 officers conducted high visibility patrols in the rural border areas between Hampshire and Thames valley, conducting stop checks to disrupt criminal activity.
- Thank you to the Country Watch members who took time to attend the CLA Event at Sparsholt College on Thursday this week. There were talks from various people and partner agencies including Hampshire's Chief Constable Andy Marsh, the Police Crime Commissioner Simon Hayes and Crime stoppers to name but a few. There were stands from exhibitors advising on rural crime prevention and Country Watch officers were also present to speak with our members and offer advice.
- Officers from Petersfield have been working with the RSPCA in respect of horses being kept in two locations south of Petersfield in appalling conditions. As a result of the condition of these horses, two had to be put to sleep, and the remaining horses have been seized by Police and handed into the care of the RSPCA. The owner has been identified and the RSPCA will be pursuing a prosecution.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Summary of reported rural crime in north and east Hampshire:-

- There have been three non dwelling burglaries to farm buildings reported in the Alton rural area this week, in each location entry has been gained by the offenders but nothing has actually been stolen.
- At Cole Henley, a farm building was broken into, two Stihl chainsaws and a Honda generator were stolen. In East Anton a whacker plate was stolen from a building site and in the Whitchurch area, a shed on an allotment was broken into and ten Tumbler Pigeons and their eggs were stolen.
- An out building in Headley Down was broken into and a lawn mower was stolen and in Churt, a shed was broken into, a lawn mower and tools were stolen, the offenders also attempted to steal two bronze statues of deer in the garden by trying to dig out the underground fixings but were unsuccessful.
- In the Curdrige area, a container on a secure builders yard was broken into and £6000 worth of power tools were stolen.
- Rural theft this week includes the theft of garden furniture from a property in Ecchinswell, tools were stolen from a secure yard in the Nately Scures area, and a Kubota mini digger was stolen from a rural premises in Bighton.

- Two trailers and £3000 worth of chicken wire were stolen in the Alresford area, one trailer was later recovered in woods nearby.
- In the Fareham area, £10,000 worth of solar panels were stolen from a solar farm.
- A JCB telehandler has been stolen from a building site in the Church Crookham area and in the Medstead area, offenders were disturbed by the house holder whilst attempting to steal a digger from a rural premises.
- Theft from motor vehicles continue to be reported in the North Hampshire area, in Eversley, fuel was stolen from a lorry in a locked compound, In Andover, the catalytic converters from three Mercedes Sprinter vans were stolen, in Fullerton a car was broken into and a hand bag was taken, in Cholderton a purse was stolen from a car and in Hartley Wintney a works van was broken into and tools were stolen.
- Four males with dogs were seen on farm land in the Wootton St Lawrence area, suspected poaching activity, no vehicle was seen.
- Rural criminal damage reports include the locks to a shed in the East Cholderton area, no entry was gained but this could have been a failed attempt to break in. In West Tytherley, a tractor had it's window smashed and in Frensham, the padlocks to a field gate was damaged.

FRAUD & SCAM WARNING

Hampshire residents have been receiving calls from a man claiming to be a police officer from Bournemouth Police. Those receiving calls were told that someone was either attempting to access their bank account or that someone has been arrested for doing so. They were then asked for personal details including their PIN numbers and to hang up and call their bank. When the victim has picked up the phone to call the bank, the original caller hasn't hung up the phone, staying on the line and it is the offender the victim speaks to, not the bank. On some of the occasions the caller has told the victim to withdraw large sums of money from their accounts which have then been collected by courier, or they are told to hand over their bank cards to the courier.

Police warn that these calls are not genuine and no police officer or bank would operate in this manner. Anyone who receives a suspicious call is urged not to give out any details to the caller and report the matter to the police immediately.

People are reminded of the following advice:

Never give out personal information about your bank account to anybody over the phone.

- If someone calls claiming to be a police officer, ask for their identification number and police force. Advise that you will call them back to verify who they are, then hang up. A genuine police officer will not mind waiting while you check. Call them back using the police non emergency number 101, either using a different phone or waiting at least 10 minutes before making the call.
- If you have given out information which could compromise your bank account security in any way, call your bank to cancel your cards as soon as possible.
- Never hand over money to someone at the door to be sent off elsewhere.
- If someone comes to your door claiming to be a police officer or staff member, always ask for identification and make a note of their identification number. Ask them to wait whilst you verify their identity, close the door and call 101.

Control of Dogs

Now that the lambing season is upon us, please can we remind all dog owners to keep their dogs under control at all times. We usually see a rise in dog attacks on sheep at this time of year, these incidents are easily avoided but can cause immense distress and suffering when they happen. Farmers have a right to shoot a dog that is found in the act of attacking livestock.... Don't let it be your dog!

With spring well on its way we all start thinking about all the jobs in the garden that need doing, such as hedge trimming and tidying, please remember that birds will be nesting at this time of year, be on the look out for their nests and try to avoid disturbing them.

Attached is a leaflet which is aimed at raising awareness surrounding the legalities of accepting illegally obtained salmon and sea trout and how to recognise a fish that has been taken in this way.

Summary of reported rural crime in North and East Hampshire

As you will all hopefully be aware, there has been a spate of plant and agricultural machinery thefts this week. These offences have mainly been in the East Hampshire area.

It is not uncommon that the offenders seem to know what is on site and where it is kept. This suggests they may have visited the site before, often, with a spurious excuse for being there. Please be vigilant and report any suspicious activity to the Police on 101. If possible please make a note of the make, model, colour and registration number of any vehicles seen in suspicious circumstance. Please do not leave keys to vehicles, equipment or store rooms on site.

- A red Honda TRX500FM Quad bike HX07WFT was stolen from East Meon during a burglary at a farm building.
- A red Honda TRX 500 Quad bike HX07THK and a Graham Edwards twin axle trailer were stolen during a burglary to a farm building in the West Meon area.
- A Case C15 Mini Digger/excavator was stolen from a building site in the Otterbourne area.
- A Bomag mini roller HX53BVZ was stolen from a building site in the Eversley area.
