### Information & Advice

#### **Crime Prevention Advice and Self Preservation Advice**

In previous bulletins advice on crime prevention and security has been given. It is for the individual to take on board and put in to practice the advice. In Hampshire a Horsewatch member has acted in a very proficient way and passed on her own advice and comment.

"We've rigged up solar powered security lights, and these were very inexpensive from Maplins and work very well. Also, I have threaded welded chain through the battery and electric fence energiser and round a fence post which has made these items pretty safe. I've also had rugs taken off the horses backs at night and will paint my post code on all of the rugs now, it might spoil the look but it keeps them on the horses! It's the old adage ..... if it's not bolted down or locked up it will go walkies!"

In addition the member is also post coding her energiser by melting the code into the casing.

On the subject of self preservation the following incident in Sussex serves to remind all riders of the need to carry contact telephone details on their person as well as their horse.

In East Sussex a bay horse wearing a racing saddle was found without its rider!! There was nothing on the horse to give anyone a clue as to who it belonged to or where it had come from. Word went out that POLICE ARE WORRIED FOR THE RIDERS SAFETY!! Fortunately a short while later there was good news, the missing rider of the horse was located, evidently the rider was on her mobile when she dropped it, she got off to retrieve it and the horse bolted.

Which now leads onto the next self preservation piece of advice. The practice of using mobile phones, whether it is to talk or text, whilst riding should not be undertaken. It is not good practice to do so. As with driving a motor vehicle you will not be in full control of your animal nor will you be paying attention to what is happening on the road in any direction. If out riding you are the cause of a Road Traffic Collision because you were distracted, not in control of your horse and/or carriage, then you may be subject to legal proceedings; criminal, civil or both. The same applies to motorists when driving a motor vehicle. Drivers seem to think that using a hand held device such as a mobile phone makes them invisible, that no one can see them......wrong they are very visible!!

#### **Been Seen**

It is sad to still see horses and riders making use of roads and other areas without wearing reflective clothing. Now that the evenings are drawing in and light is reduced it makes sense to ensure you and your horse can be seen.

#### **Stolen Tractors**

If you see large agricultural vehicles being removed from land or being transported at night please take a note of the vehicles being used to effect the transportation. Registration numbers, make, model and any writing on the transporting vehicle are also invaluable pieces of information. Direction of travel is equally important. When safe and legal to do so, please contact the police and inform them of your observations. The operator may ask why you feel the sighting is suspicious. Advise the operator that you have been told by the police that there is an increase of theft of agricultural vehicles and to report sighting and movement especially when seen at night.

The same applies to horse trailers. Most horse trailers are stolen at night. If seen treat the observation in the same way as for agricultural vehicles.

Not to be forgotten is plant machinery used for road repairs of similar. Again if you see such items on the

move at night or being manhandled at unusual hours call the police. Thieves will work on the assumption that no one will be suspicious of "workman" working later at night especially if they are wearing the "right clothing". Far better to be enquiring rather than find out later that there was a theft.

The information below refers to theft along the M3 corridor however these thefts can occur anywhere so wherever you are in the country bear in mind movement of agricultural vehicles/trailers. Remember wherever you are in England and Wales to telephone the police for non emergency calls dial 101.

## **Theft of Agricultural Vehicles**

There has been a sudden marked increase in the number of large agricultural vehicles stolen on the M3 corridor. Over the last week 4 large machines have been stolen totalling in excess of £200K.

#### **Crime Prevention**

Can I make you all aware of the increase in quad bike, tractor and horse trailer thefts in Hampshire area.

- Do not leave agricultural vehicles in fields overnight
- Do not leave vehicles parked out of signs (behind buildings or barns etc)
- Store agricultural vehicles in barns or yards. Block valuable vehicles in with other vehicles. If not possible, consider chaining them together and securing them to a floor-mounted securing point.
- Identify and register plant/agricultural vehicles with the DVLA or, if not appropriate, with a property register such as CESAR.
- Ensure plant/agricultural vehicles have a unique/single key (this could be the immobiliser key)
- Ensure the vehicle cab is fitted with lockable windows.
- Fit an immobiliser
- Consider GPS and VHF tracking systems, eg; tracker

#### The mane attraction.....

In the past week Suffolk police have received a few reports of horse owners finding plaits or unusual tangles in their horses' manes. There are occasions where the plait may have been "man made" but frequently the cause can be attributed to natural phenomena. Most reports of the plaits materialise around this time of year and is frequently attributed to the mane getting tangled by wind, mud, and dried/dying plants such as thistles. The opinion on the cause of plaits is varied; a search of the internet will bring up many theories from fairies, witchcraft and a marker for theft. None of these causes have been substantiated. The rumour that the 'plaits' are a marker for the theft of the horse is the reason that causes the most concern for horse owners. If the plaiting is a sign for possible theft then it is reasonable to believe that we would have an increase in horse thefts because horses whose plaits were not discovered would have been stolen and we would have seen a surge of numbers taken. However this is not the case.

This does not mean horse owners should drop their guard. They should always remain vigilant and

continue to report any unusual activity concerning their horse. The usual advice is to report the matter to the police (by calling 101) and your local Horsewatch. It would be useful if owners took photographs of the plaits and of the horse in full profile showing its mane with the plait in place when they are discovered. These should then be e-mailed to horsewatch@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

Reporting these incidents will allow us to pick up any trends or patterns and photos will help us to collate the different appearance of the plaits and identify any similarities. What can you do to minimise the risk of your horse being stolen?

- Freezemark the horse an external identification is your best deterrent against theft
- Ensure fencing is in good condition
- If practical, padlock the field gate and/ or padlocked and chained both ends to avoid the gate being lifted off its hinges.
- Mark the horse's rugs with the freezemark ID
- Avoid leaving head collars on horses or on the gate or fence where horses are kept.

Report suspicious activity to the police, such as unknown vehicles or people showing undue interest in your horse or property, particularly if it is on several occasions. It is important that you make note of the following to pass to the police:

- Vehicle type, make and colour
- Vehicle registration number
- · Any vehicle markings, such as a business or damage
- Description of occupants

Regular readers of this bulletin will be aware of our regular overnight cross border operations with Sussex & Hampshire police, where teams of officers target hot spots of rural crime.

## Death of Foal – Waverley Rd, Farnham

A THREE month old foal has been found dead after suffering extreme, unusual injuries in a field in Waverley. The animal discovered on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> August in a field with other horses including its mother. The foal which is described as being white with brown patches, had been safe and well 48 hours previously. It has been left with injuries to its face, neck and chest in a field near Waverley Abbey House, Waverley Lane, Farnham. Surrey Police Rural Communities Officer, PC John Hockley said; "This has been particularly distressing for the owner, it cannot be established how the foal died and I am appealing for anyone who may have any information which could help solve the mystery surrounding the unusual demise of this poor foal."
