Can You Help?

Approximately 3 years ago one of our members put their 12 HH Section B Welsh Pony "**Hollyoak Jasmine**", known as Polly, on loan with a lady on a farm in Scaynes Hill (near Haywards Heath).

Unfortunately the loan was done verbally and no contract was signed.

Cutting a long story short, about a year ago the loanee asked permission of the owner if it was in order to move Polly to a large field in Fox Hill Village which is situated between Wivelsfield Green and Haywards Heath. Contact was then lost with the loanee but after investigation it was found that the loanee was keeping horses on a farm in Plumpton Green. The owner made contact with the loanee who said she no longer had Polly and had passed her onto someone else but was unable to give a name for this person.

Crime Prevention Advice

The below crime information comes from Sussex Horsewatch. The information informs about a recent theft of gates but, as important, gives advice on how to put into place a simple crime prevention measure which may deter a theft.

Theft of Stable Doors – Copsale, Horsham - Crime Ref: 0198 – 16/10

Sometime between 1800 hours on 15/10/12 and 0710 hours on 16/10/12 some doors were removed and taken from a stable in Broadwater Lane, Copsale, Horsham. The only description is that they are large wooden doors and would have been pulled off the hinges. They would have then needed to be carried to a nearby lane in order to transport them.

Advice:- To help prevent this type of crime please rotate the top hinge to stop them being lifted off, the same can be done with field gates, see picture below.



Scam Advice

Please be aware of the following type of scam and please forward to other horse owners or potential horse owners. Information has been received concerning a "scam" which involves dealers, or those of a similar disposition, who will sell a horse to individuals. The horse is sold on an instalment basis. However at some stage of the instalment period the seller will demand more money or additional payments. The person who is purchasing the horse will have pressure applied for the additional payment or threatened that the horse will be removed.

As with all matters concerning the purchase of property, only buy from a trustworthy source. Never buy a

horse without another experienced horse owner present, someone you can trust. If you want to own a horse there are several horse charities who want to home horses in their care. These charities, such as World Horse Welfare, will do what they can to match your requirements with horses in their possession.

Western Country Watch Weekly – 07/11/12

Following the heavy rain this week Emergency Services were called on three occasions to assist drivers who had become stranded whilst attempting to navigate flooded roads. Two people had to be rescued, one vehicle lost control and ended up on its' roof and another vehicle tipped onto its' side in the water trapping people inside. Please remember that some roads may become impassable during such weather and it may be necessary to find an alternative route. Just because you have a 4x4 doesn't mean you can go anywhere....

On Tuesday I attended Netley Headquarters for a meeting to discuss the content of the Rural Awareness Course. This will be a two day course for Police Officers and Staff working in rural communities. Key areas have been identified and the Force Training Department will now produce a training package. It is hoped that the course will be rolled out early 2013 to over 1000 Police Officers and Staff throughout the Force area.

On Wednesday the Country Watch team spent the morning working with VOSA conducting vehicle stop-checks on vans, flat-beds, 4x4's, trailers, plant machinery and horseboxes. 34 vehicles were examined and all diesel tanks were checked for red diesel. Nine prohibitions for various offences were issued. Please ensure that you have the correct number plates displayed on any trailers being used, and check that all lights are working correctly.

On Thursday I am off to Kettering for the National Rural Crime Conference. The programme includes machinery theft, Rural crime, Partnership working, Livestock theft and metal theft. I am hoping to obtain some ideas from other Police Forces that can be replicated within Hampshire.

Thursday evening sees the launch of the local Women In Rural Enterprise (Hampshire WIRE) network. WIRE offers support to businesswomen in rural areas providing skills, inspiration, knowledge and support. I am hoping to get back from Kettering in time to attend the launch, and I wish our local NFU Mutual branch every success with the new initiative.

An incident involving theft of horse rugs took place this week. Nine horses were kept in the field. Four of them had their rugs stolen. Interestingly, the ones not stolen had postcodes sprayed on with yellow

paint. This obviously acted as a deterrent to the thieves. Please make the effort to postcode or mark rugs. They are not a fashion item.

We have had a few good results this week.....

A male has been arrested and charged with theft from vehicle after being caught siphoning diesel from plant machinery. He will appear in court on the 5th December 2012. A second male has been arrested on suspicion of handling stolen goods and is currently on Police bail.

On Wednesday the Country Watch team conducted a pro-active operation targeting vehicles travelling through rural areas. Fifty-four vans, flat-beds and 4x4's were checked. Six speeding motorists were caught, with three drivers being referred to driver awareness training courses and three Fixed Penalty Notices were issued. Three Fixed Penalty Notices were issued in relation to MOT offences, and five vehicles were issued with prohibition notices due to their condition and road-worthiness. All vehicles had their diesel tanks dipped and one transit van was seized as a result of being run on red diesel.

In May 2012 a burglary took place involving the theft of macaws and African Grey Parrots. The defendant appeared at Crown Court today and was sentenced to 20 months in prison.

I.O.W. RURAL ACTION GROUP

Our Rural Action Group meeting was held on the 19th of November and the following items were discussed. We were informed about vehicles being driven on bridleways and places where they are not meant to be driven, for example along Tennyson Down. If you see any vehicles being driven where they shouldn't be driven please contact us. Under the section 59 Police Reform Act 2002 we are able to stop a driver of a mechanically propelled vehicle driving carelessly or inconsiderately or under section 30 of the Road Traffic Act driving otherwise than on a road. We are able to give a warning to anyone we catch committing these offences and then if they drive the vehicle in this same way again within the next twelve months we are then able to seize the vehicle.

A matter was raised in regards to controlled burning. Premises are doing this legally but the concern was raised that phone calls were being received from concerned members of the public. It was concluded during the meeting that if people did wish to report such incidents of burning then they would be advised to call the IW Fire and Rescue Service during office hours Monday – Friday 0900-1700. Please contact 01983 525121 for further information. Alternatively contact the Country Watch team and we will pass on the information.

There are companies attending premises and offering a service whereby they will take away your waste oil and dispose of it for you at a reasonable price. We would like to encourage people to say no to this service and to report the matter to us, the Police. It is highly unlikely that any such company would have

the legitimate transfer license to carry out this service. Also of concern to us would be the location of where oil would be deposited by these companies and the potential environmental harm it may cause. Also please be on the look out for people thinking that they can help themselves to piles of logs that have been cut down and awaiting collection in fields or forest areas especially at this time of the year.

INCIDENTS THAT HAVE OCCURRED WITHIN THE PAST MONTH

Occurrence 44120440052 – This relates to an incident on a farm whereby horse owners have attended their yard and on arrival they have witnessed a male and a female running from the yard with two stolen horse saddles. On seeing the owner the male and the female offenders have dropped the saddles and ran away.

The descriptions we have been given for the male and female are as follows:

- Male white late 20's slim build with short light blond hair wearing blue jeans dark blue sweatshirt and green body warmer and heeled trainer style shoes which the informant recognised as being horse riding style shoes
- Female white early 20's shorter than the male dark coloured jodhpurs dark coloured top and dark hat.

Horse owners in the Ryde please be on the look out for anybody matching the descriptions given or any suspicious activity, if in doubt please call 101.

Occurrence 44120427106 – This relates to a suspicious van in the Rookley area, described as a Blue Fiat Ducato, vehicle registration number WPO8 YDT. The occupants of the vehicle were collecting scrap metal on the island. If anybody has any information in regards to the above incidents please call 101 and quote the occurrence number shown.

Occurrence: 44120446162 – Unknown persons have taken logs from a field in the Ventnor area. The logs belonged to the National Trust and weren't for people to help themselves.



Nuisance Calls

If you receive a phone call by someone claiming that they are working with Hants Community Police Team and ask for money for an advert to be placed in a farm watch magazine please hang up! This is a scam.

The national ACPO (Association of Chief Police Officers) Rural Crime Seminar was held in Kettering during November and was attended by Country Watch Officers. The aim of this seminar was to learn
