Horses that go Missing.

I expect many of you will have been reading about a horse called Arrius reported stolen from North Devon. The response from the equine community was excellent with circulation of details being widely made, utilising media and Facebook. The support being expressed to Arrius's owners was very gratifying and I sure a great comfort.

The outcome has been a happy one. Last night (5TH September) Arrius was found in the proximity of his field. I am unsure exactly when he was discovered missing from his field as the theft report is recorded as 22nd August but I am also led to understand that he had been missing for two weeks, although this is unconfirmed.

What this incident once again shows is the value of undertaking a thorough search of the immediate and wide area around the missing horse's field. Theft of horses remains very low and if a horse goes missing from its field the first course of action is to undertake a thorough search. Horses have a habit of getting lost in woods, copses, thickets, and fall into ditches. They don't always remain standing. A search can take days, maybe weeks. I accept this is a monumental task but it has to be done. If the horse is not found within 24 hours it may be worth considering asking for assistance from a wider group of people in order to widen the search parameters. Whilst the search is taking place circulations can be made utilising all available social and media outlets.

The photograph below is an example of a horse that escaped from its field and got lost in a thicket. It was found lying down.

Information circulated by Suffolk Horsewatch but it applies to everyone everywhere

There have been a number of incidences over the past few weeks at equestrian / farm establishments and in remote rural areas where vehicles have been entered and items stolen from within. In some cases the vehicles have been left insecure or locked, but with valuables on display. On some of the crimes (in the IP7, IP8 and CO7 areas) males on quad bikes have been a common feature.

When leaving your vehicle be sure to remove all your valuables (put them in the boot) and lock all the doors. Keep your keys with you – don't be tempted to leave them lying around the yard. At some riding schools keys can be left in the office, but make sure that the office is attended or locked at all times.

At shows and riding clinics it is very easy to be complacent and trust everyone at the event. It is easy to assume that you're with like-minded people and drop your guard, but that's when you're vulnerable and thieves take advantage.

Don't leave your saddle resting against the horse box or the bridle hanging off the wing mirror – when unattended lock your tack away. Don't leave your handbag, mobile phone or wallet lying on the front seat of an unlocked lorry. Remain vigilant and if you see anyone lurking around the lorry park that seems suspicious or out of place, immediately contact the police and a show

Bogus solicitors

Received from Sussex Horse Watch

The Solicitors Regulatory Authority (SRA) has recently posted several warnings of e-mails and letters being circulated from bogus solicitor and law practices. The e-mails in particular are using names of bone fide companies however these e-mails do not originate from them.

The scams take the form of unsolicited emails, text messages, telephone calls or direct mail. They will promise you something unlikely in return for a "small fee", or try to get hold of your personal details such as

- o bank account details
- o your full name
- o your date of birth; or
- o login details to bank accounts and other sensitive online accounts.

If you have been targeted by such scams, **do not give out any money or personal details**. However, if you think there's a good chance someone approaching you may be genuine, ask lots of questions—just don't give them any money or personal details up front. Most scammers will not answer your questions or will just continue to pester you for money or personal details.

Remember, if it seems too good be true, it probably is. Your money may disappear, but the thing you were promised won't appear.

It is a criminal offence for someone to call themselves a solicitor or act as a solicitor if they are not on the roll of solicitors.

You can check if someone is a solicitor by searching <u>Find a solicitor</u>, the Law Society's online directory of solicitors. This directory contains details of almost all of the solicitors that are regulated by the SRA —the

only genuine ones not on there are those who have requested their removal from the database.

If you would like to double-check that a solicitor is genuine, or if you think you are dealing with a bogus solicitor, <u>contact the SRA</u> immediately.

Check the SRA's scam alerts for details of recent and ongoing scams.

If you see animals being loaded into a vehicle try and take full details of the vehicle and people involved. Remember wherever you are in England and Wales you can contact the police in the county you are in by phoning 101 for non emergency calls and 999 for emergencies. Your information may be vital in the prevention of crime as well as instrumental in securing evidence to arrest and prosecute. Once you have made your observation and called the police with your information it is down to the police to react and respond.

Thieves, whether stealing livestock or plant from road works, will be brazen and work on the assumption that people will not challenge them or pay them any attention. Prove them wrong!

Travelling with Your Horse anytime, any weekend? – then read this advice from the NFU

Recently, we have dealt with distressing situations where people break down and do not have any water on board for their horses. We have seen a sudden increase in breakdowns - particularly tyres - since the weather has turned particularly hot. According to PRP, who handle the equine rescue part of our breakdown service, over 62 percent of recent breakdowns were tyre-related. We are also seeing many vehicles overheating and with clutch problems. With the RAC estimating that more than 11 million motorists are planning to hit the road this weekend and a predicted spike in weather-related breakdowns, the welfare of horses being transported by horsebox or trailer is of paramount importance. High temperatures and humidity, particularly sudden changes in conditions, can pose a major threat to animal welfare. Horse owners should also be aware that roads are busier over the weekend at the moment as people head out for the day to enjoy the sunshine – particularly roads heading towards the coast – there have been some horrendous traffic jams on the road networks recently. Obviously this could affect their own journey time, but will also affect the speed of any assistance they might require. Even more important is to carry at least twice as much water as might normally be needed. Breakdowns involving horseboxes and trailers transporting horses are of particular concern and delays, which might be relatively insignificant under normal conditions, can become critical very quickly. If left standing in a horsebox or trailer in the current heat, horses can easily become overheated or dehydrated and in some circumstances this can lead to serious illness and even death. To help, we have put together the following checklist :-

Stay safe this summer - check your horsebox or trailer!

The best way to avoid a breakdown is to ensure your horsebox or trailer is properly maintained and that coolant levels, oil levels, tyres and batteries are checked on a regular basis (as these can lead to problems during hot weather)

- high temperatures aggravate any existing damage to tyres.
- Under-inflation adds to the problem causing friction and more heat which can prove too much for weak spots, causing punctures and blow-outs
- high temperatures can aggravate cooling system problems too. Low coolant level, leaking hoses and broken electric cooling fans can all result in overheating and expensive damage
- avoid transporting horses during the hottest part of the day if at all possible carry plenty of extra
 water for horses in case of a breakdown or traffic delays at least twice as much as you would
 normally need remember the estimated recovery time for a horsebox breakdown is 60-90 minutes
- make sure you carry the details of your horsebox or trailer recovery service in your vehicle
- if you breakdown and have horses on-board, make sure you tell your breakdown provider that you have animals on-board
- always carry a fully-charged mobile phone and charger in your vehicle it is important you can keep in touch with your breakdown provider and inform them if any of the animals you have on-board are becoming overheated or distressed
- bear in mind that horses which are young, old or overweight are more prone to overheating and should be carefully monitored

Crime Prevention

There have been reports of horses being let out of fields by persons unknown. Here are some notes that may benefit horse owners:

- Ensure that gates cannot be lifted off their hinges either reverse the top hinge or weld metal plates over the hinges.
- Access should be restricted on a commercial yard make sure that visitors report to reception on arrival and consider provision of visitors' badges so that legitimate visitors can be easily identified.
- Adequate lighting on the yard is essential for both security and safety. Consider security lights which come on automatically when they detect movement.
- Closed circuit television, although quite expensive to install, is an excellent investment as it will help to identify intruders. Similarly it may be possible to have an alarm fitted to the yard, which could be audible in the house as well as on the yard.
- If there is not always someone present at the yard, do not always arrive and leave at the same time. Try to vary your routine in order that your movements are not predictable for a thief.
- Whilst horses should not be locked into their stables because of the risk of fire, the yard itself can be made secure, with provision for suitable exit points in case of emergency, into fields adjoining the yard which should have secure fencing/hedging with padlocks on any exit points in the boundary.

Note: Although you may not be able to implement all the ideas above, if you follow the suggestions as best you can, this will help to keep your horse secure.

This week we carried out another CESAR marking day for agricultural equipment. Several of you brought items of plant and machinery to be marked. We have now sold all of the kits we were able to offer at a subsidised price. During the four days that we carried out this initiative we estimate that we have security marked over £1 million of agricultural equipment across the New Forest District. Our thanks go to the New Forest Community Safety Partnership for providing funding to support this initiative. We may consider repeating the initiative in the future if there is sufficient appetite for it.

I have been busy supporting our training department in developing a Rural Awareness Course that will be delivered to over 1000 front line Officers working in rural areas throughout Hampshire and the Isle Of Wight. The pilot for the course will take place early September, and training will start at the end of September 2013 with Officers receiving a two day package. Over the coming months Officers will receive an input on areas including Countryside management, lawful shooting activities, traps/snares, firearms, poaching, wildlife crimes, travellers and gypsies (Operation Quebec), Automatic Number Plate Recognition technology, Terrorism in rural communities, Plant/agricultural equipment theft, Metal theft (Operation Tornado), Fly tipping and nuisance vehicles. This will provide increased awareness of the issues rural communities face, and will provide officers with the confidence and knowledge they need to deal with rural crimes. Thank you to the Country Watch members who have assisted in developing this package. It should benefit us all in the long term.

I have been busy trialling some different security marking products over the last couple of weeks and hope to have some updates on them soon. Watch this space......

Editor's Note

Occasionally Suffolk police receive reports of horse owners finding their horses' manes or tails have been cut or plaits woven into their manes. Some people consider this to be a marker for theft; however this has never been substantiated. The belief that the cutting of hair or insertions of plaits are a marker for the theft of the horse is the reason that causes the most concern for horse owners. If the marking is a sign for possible theft then it is reasonable to believe that we would have an increase in horse thefts because horses whose markers were not discovered would have been stolen and we would have seen a surge of numbers taken. However this is not the case.

This does not mean horse owners should drop their guard. They should always remain vigilant and

continue to report any unusual activity concerning their horse. The usual advice is to report the matter to the police and your local Horsewatch. It would be useful if owners took photographs of the cut hair (or plaits) with the horse in full profile showing its mane or tail when it is discovered.

What can you do to minimise the risk of your horse being stolen?

- Freeze-mark the horse an external identification is your best deterrent against theft.
- Ensure fencing is in good condition.
- If practical, padlock the field gate and/or padlock and chain both ends to avoid the gate being lifted off its hinges.
- Mark the horse's rugs with the freeze-mark ID.
- Avoid leaving head-collars on horses or on the gate or fence where horses are kept.
- Report suspicious activity to the police such as, unknown vehicles or people showing undue interest in your horse or property, particularly if it is on several occasions. It is important that you make note of the following to pass to the police
- Vehicle type, make and colour.
- Vehicle registration number.
- Any vehicle markings, such as a business name/livery or damage.
- Description of occupants.
