## Information and advice

The article below has been widely circulated amongst the equine community and I dare say much debate has taken place. The article is reproduced for those who may not have heard of the incident.

I am sure many would like to know what advice cyclists, engaged in races, time trials on the highway, are given should they come upon horses and their riders in similar situations. Somehow, I doubt they are going to dismount and walk past or slow down to ride at a snail's pace.

Any use of the highway encompasses elements of danger and all road users should be fully aware of their surroundings and apply common sense to whatever activity they are engaging in. Sadly, all road users will at times fail to use common sense.

After the article below, there is another example of what can happen on the roads involving riders, their horses and other road users. This occurrence occurred in the New Forest, Hampshire.

As individuals, we must be responsible when using the highways.

With incidents, involving riders and horses, seemingly on the increase there is much merit in riders wearing head or body cameras. Use of such equipment may prove invaluable in proving or disproving allegations. Such devices can be purchased easily from the internet. Research on the internet can quickly identify makes and models available to purchase at affordable prices. From the experience of Hampshire Horsewatch members who have purchased 'head cams' it is advisable to get a memory card with a minimum of 16 GB.

#### Fletching ride ends in tragedy

(Report from Sussex Express, Daleham Lane is in Fletching near Maresfield, East Sussex.)



A mother and daughters quiet morning ride along country lanes near Fletching ended in violent tragedy.

On Sunday, 23 June Jo Flew and her daughter Joanna, 20 were out riding their two horses along Daleham Lane. But their morning ended in shock and terror when a group of about 20 cyclists streamed

past, causing Jocs horse to kick out in panic.

Jo said: We knew a cycle event was taking place but we had no idea what time. On our way home it became apparent that it was happening.

% few bikes raced past which was OK as our horses were used to them. But then looking behind us there was suddenly a large number in groups of about 20, but only seconds apart.

%s they came past our horses became very frightened. We felt like we were being swallowed. This caused my horse to kick out at the bikes but instead it kicked my daughters horse, Willow, in the leg.+

Jo described her agony as she saw Willowos leg was broken and was hanging by the skin. Joanna was screaming.

She went on: %could not believe the bikes were still pushing through! Two very kind ones stopped, dismounted and came to help. I was in so much shock I couldnot work out even how to use my phone.+

Joanna, who works with horses, managed to use hers and called someone from the yard where she kept Willow. But Jo said: Whe girl had huge difficulties getting to us as she was coming head on into the path of the cyclists who, again, had no respect for other users. She asked them to let her through as she was going to an accident but was verbally abused.+

When she arrived, three separate vets were called and it was almost an hour before they found one from Uckfield who was willing to come out. Whey then had the horrible job of putting our lovely horse, Willow, to sleep at the side of the road. This has to be the most horrific thing I have ever witnessed.+

Jo now feels these cycling events should be better organised, with the participants staggered from the start. %And cyclists should have more respect - they are in racing mode, nothing else seems to matter.+

Rupert Rivett, from SRS events which staged the Etape de Sussex event, said: Whe always tell our cyclists to slow down if they see horses, and they nearly all do. Whe last thing I want to do is add fuel to the flames, and I desperately want to say that horseriders and cyclists should work together to ensure safety on the roads. Everyone is entitled to use these roads; cyclists, motorists, walkers and riders. I would not like to say either way who was to blame.

\*One of our riders was a policeman and he gave us a clear-eyed view of what happened. What we do not want to do is get on the bandwagon accusing cyclists or vice versa.+

He insists riders did not abuse the driver and believes they called out to indicate an accident. Cyclists are advised to make a noise - he recommends a clicking sound - well in advance of passing a rider so the horse can hear it. %Fuelling the anti-cycling or anti horse brigade does no good. We should work together.+

New Forest Incident. Week commencing 6 July 2013

This week a road traffic collision occurred when a car driver stopped to ask directions from a horse rider on a road. They were on opposite sides of the road in an area of dappled shade and bright sunlight. The horse was struck from behind by another vehicle, the driver of which didn't see the horse and rider in the shade. The horse had to be destroyed and the rider sustained broken ribs and vertebrae. An investigation is ongoing at this time. Please consider wearing high-visibility clothing when riding a horse on a road. In fact common sense dictates that the rider and or horse SHOULD wear high viz.

It has been slightly quieter over the last week in the rural areas, although several non dwelling burglaries have been reported, the reports numbers have been lower than previous weeks. There have been two reports of dwelling burglaries to rural properties across the northern area of Hampshire, and only two reports of theft from motor vehicles at beauty spot car parks.

We are currently receiving quite a few reports of livestock, particularly horses, escaping out onto the highway due to poor fencing. Often, this ties up police officers for a long period of time, trying to capture the animals to prevent any accidents and then trying to identify the owners of the animals and where they have actually come from. Luckily, so far, we have managed to prevent any serious accidents. Please keep your fencing in tip top condition to prevent your animals straying.

#### Warning from Trading standards

Rogue Traders are currently cold calling in the Basingstoke and surrounding areas of Hampshire offering to power wash drives and in some cases to put down insulation. No paperwork is being given.

Rogue Traders are currently cold calling/leaflet dropping in the Waterlooville area of Hampshire offering to provide hedge/tree cutting services.

Trading Standards would advise consumers not to agree to work that is instigated as a result of a cold call or via a leaflet drop. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotes from reputable businesses or traders who are either members of the Hampshire County Council Trading Standards Buy With Confidence Scheme or a recognised trade association.

Members of the Buy With Confidence scheme are fully audited to ensure their trading practices are legal, honest and fair. All members have been checked for trustworthiness and compliance with consumer protection laws. Traders who agree work at the home of an individual or at a place other than their usual business premises are required by law to provide consumers with a Notice of Right to Cancel, which gives consumers a 7 day cooling off period. Work should not commence until this period has ended, unless written agreement is obtained from that consumer beforehand.

Country Watch membership continues to increase and stands at just short of 1,700, and if anyone had doubts about the impact of such a scheme, just check out the headlines:

- The NFU Mutual have just awarded rural communities officer PC Mark Trezise & me a **national** ±ocal bobbyqrural crimefighters award, of which, Country Watch plays an integral part. We will be using the £1,000 prize money to fund more initiatives in the County.
- Rural crime in Surrey is down nearly half in the past two years.
- Tack thefts are down 75% the past year (free saddle marking scheme)

Our Crime Reduction Advisors (CRAs) and Rural Communities Officers (RCOs) can take a great deal of credit for this success as they work tirelessly to promote crime prevention with a simple ethos -keep them outq and consider security as an investment and to mark your valuables. After all, why go through the cost and stress related to crime when it can be prevented in the first place.

Many of you have done just that, but it is the combined strength of the membership that really makes this work. Your calls to report crimes, suspicious incidents and supply often high grade intelligence is what matters most, so 'take a bow' and please keep it coming.

The negative in this story (there usually is one), is that over 1,300 crimes were committed in this period, and if you were one of those victims, these figures are little comfort to you. Despite continuing stresses on police budgets and cost saving reorganisation, the battle to deal with the tiny minority of insidious criminals, that commit disproportionate amounts of crime, **will continue relentlessly**.

#### Good news:

The good news continues with some quality arrests since the last update. They include:

- Three men have been arrested by the Metropolitan police for a series of rural burglaries in Surrey, Sussex and Hampshire
- Two well known offenders arrested for burglaries in Waverley
- Several arrests have been made for plant machinery thefts, many enquiriesqto do
- Persistent and prolific rural crime offender (not long out of prison) arrested in Waverley following a long pursuit when he tried to ram police vehicles
- A vehicle Peugeot 306 was seized having damaged gates and fences at Mole Valley

There have been several reports of a male, sometimes accompanied by a very young child, going to homes where building work is being carried out. He will wait until he is sure there are no builders present then approach the householder and convince them that he works for the building company and that he needs some cash to get more materials. Of course, he is not seen again. The message is simple, be sure you **know** the person you are dealing with, or check them out before parting with any money. Report any suspicious behaviour and note registration numbers, descriptions and call us in the usual way.

Yes, you've guessed it long going to finish by banging on again about improvements in technology that can save you from being another number q

- Advancements in tracking devices are bringing down costs and increasing practical options that include small portable units with personalised customer settings to suit you lifestyle or business
- Many big name insurers offer discounts for fitting approved devices that include the excellent Datatag/Cesar marking service for machinery from wacker plates to diggers
- Land Rover owners can purchase a locking device that covers the pedals tailored to your model, for less than £100, and fitted in less than 30secs.
- GPS technology can now protect your tanks of heating oil or fuel storage

Of course, I cannot recommend products not accredited by the Home Office, but a simple search on the internet will reveal all, the time taken could be well worth the effort.

# Possible attacks on horses - Forton and Over Wyre areas The reference number is log LC-20130613-0180

An initial report was received about 2 weeks ago from the Winmarleigh area where a solitary horse was believed to have been targeted and received two small cuts to it's legs. This has now been followed up by a report of further suspicious marks being discovered on 4 mares in the Over Wyre area. All the marks are in similar locations and appear to have been caused deliberately by some unknown bladed or sharp instrument.

Please be vigilant across our area, particularly at night which is when we believe the activity is taking place. If you are a horse owner please keep checking your horses and contact us if you notice anything out of the ordinary - from what we have seen so far it is fairly clear that the cuts are clean from a blade, rather than accidental from a barbed wire fence, etc.

The police will do everything they can to try to find the offender for this totally needless offence but the reality is, that we will really need your help with this to find them.
