Don't let fire ruin festive cheer this Christmas

Christmas dinner, wrapping presents, decorating your home . thereqs lots to think about this Christmas. While fire safety is important throughout the year, the extra distractions of Christmas make it especially important to be vigilant during the festive season and North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service would like residents to put Fire Safety on their Christmas lists this year and take extra care to ensure that their families and loved ones are protected from fire.

Fire statistics show that in December, 20 people a day are either killed or injured in accidental fires in the home in England and in December 2013, there were around 2,700 accidental fires . more than any other month of the year.

Here are some simple tips from Fire Kills to help you and your family enjoy the joys of Christmas safely:

- Ensure you have working smoke alarms installed on all levels of your home. A working alarm can give you the vital time needed to escape in a fire. Test your smoke alarms regularly and never remove batteries! Do something good this Christmas, test the smoke alarms of someone you know who may need help such as an older relative or neighbour to ensure their safety too.
- Never leave cooking unattended. The majority of fires start in the kitchen so this is a high risk area. Many of us enjoy a merry tipple over the festive season but be sure to avoid cooking whilst under the influence of alcohol. Always turn off kitchen appliances when you have finished cooking.
- Never leave burning candles unattended. Keep candles out of the reach of children, and away from decorations, cards and wrapping paper, fires, lights and heaters.
- Put your cigarette out, right out. Make sure your cigarette is fully extinguished and take care
 when under the influence of alcohol or tired. Ites very easy to fall asleep while your cigarette is
 still burning and set furniture alight.
- Dong overload sockets. Ensure only one plug per socket. Always turn off plugs when they are not in use, except those that are designed to be left on, like freezers.
- Ensure you switch off fairy lights and unplug them before you go to bed, or leave the house.
 Check your Christmas tree lights conform to the British Standard (BS EN 60598) and are in good working order before use. This video shows how fast a Christmas Tree fire develops http://youtu.be/hMtiGfr0tYs
- Always use an RCD (residual current device) on outdoor electrical equipment. This safety device
 can save lives by instantly switching off the power if there is a fault and can be found in any DIY
 store.
- Make sure that everyone in your home, including visitors, knows what to do in a fire. in the event
 of fire you should get out, stay out and call 999

Contact your local Fire and Rescue Service to see if they offer free home fire risk checks, providing advice, checking existing smoke alarms, and in certain cases they may be able to supply and fit new smoke alarms for free.

On the Sunday morning, a head-collar had been cut in two places, and the mare in the field had bleeding behind the ears, suspect that the thieves had tried to put the head-collar on and she had put up a struggle. Over the weekend, a suspicious white flat bed lorry was seen cruising around and the passengers were very interested in looking around the yard area. When asked, they said they were trying to sell gravel. The witness said they had strong accents, not local. Two other males were seen acting suspiciously on the lanes on the estate on 14th.



Theft from farm : Hill Wootton Incident 292 of 22 October

Between 6pm on 20 and 6pm on 22 October, offenders entered a secure shed in the rear garden of a farm premises in Hill Wootton, Warwick. The offenders removed hinges from the shed door and then stole a Stihl pressure washer from inside.

Theft of trailer: Priors Marston Incident 379 of 22 October

Between 8.15 and 11.30pm last night, 22 October, offenders stole a metal Ifor Williams trailer from a farm premises in Priors Marston, Rugby.

Suspicious incident : Rowington Incident 323 of 6 November

At just after 4pm yesterday afternoon, 6 November, a white Ford Transit van, with a registration beginning AY, drove up the driveway of a farm premises in Rowington. The resident of the farm went out to investigate and the male driver stated that he was there to look at their quad. The residents of the farm do not have a quad bike for sale and have reported this activity as suspicious.

Warwickshire Police need your help to prevent and detect rural crimes - message from Sgt Bob Shaw: Police are requesting help in detecting the rural crimes described below as well as urging our rural communities to take steps to avoid them being victims of similar crimes.

Overnight 3-4/11/2014 there were two rural **B**urglary Otherqoffences which are believed to be linked due to location, both occurring sometime overnight: - First, a farm close to Priors Hardwick was attacked. Offenders drove across fields to access farm buildings and removed red diesel and chain saws.

The second offence was at a farm in Napton where offenders entered a secure farmyard and removed a stock trailer by cutting a fence and dragging it through. A dog started barking at 02:00hrs so that may well have been the time of the offence.

A suspicious incident at 11:15pm on the 3 November, may be connected relates to two suspicious vehicles driving up a dead end lane in Priors Marston and turning around quickly when they realised someone was behind them. The first vehicle was described as a blue pick-up, possibly a Mazda. No description given of the second vehicle. Venue is an historic house and gardens managed by English Heritage. The grounds are set in 10 acres of land in a rural location just off the A443 near to Great Witley. Between the 1.15 and 1.50am on 21 November, CCTV captured several persons on the site. The offenders forced their way into part of the building which houses a stonemasonry. The door lock was forced open and whilst there is evidence that the offenders entered the workshop (a lump of stone has been moved), nothing is missing from within. CCTV is not of evidential quality but the footage suggest that several persons were on the site, some carrying torches and that two unknown vehicles were used by the offenders, described as possibly in their late teens/early 20s.
