Information & Advice

The below information about Crime Prevention was received from Sussex Horsewatch. Putting aside to horse theft concerns the general theme of crime prevention is good for everyone.

Horse theft appears to be minimal around the country. This is not to say it can't happen and as with any property all owners must be crime prevention and security minded.

Sussex information as follows:-

Over the past few weeks Sussex Police have received reports of suspicious activity around rural establishments and fields. Discussions on internet forums and social media are speculating that horses are being targeted for theft.

Farm and horse owners should take this opportunity to review the security of their stable yards and paddocks. Anyone who observes suspicious activity around horses should note down as much detail as possible and report it to the police on 101. Time, date, vehicle registration details and descriptions of any persons involved are particularly helpful. Number plates of vehicles may be cloned, so a full description of the vehicle involved should be taken.

Sussex Horse Watch gives the following advice to protect your horse:

- Freeze marking is well known and proven as the most• effective theft deterrent. The reason is because it is visible it will deter thieves, but on the rare occasions when freeze marked horses go missing, it provides an excellent tracing facility, with no need for any expensive equipment to read the marks.
- Change your routine regularly and visit your horse at irregular times.
- Check perimeter fencing daily to ensure it has not been tampered with.
- Gates are often the weakest points in the perimeter and, as• such, need careful consideration (field gates themselves are valuable and often stolen). Metal gates tend to be more secure. Gateposts should be securely cemented into the ground. Gate hinges need to have the tops burred over or welded to prevent the gate being lifted off. The gate should be kept padlocked at all times. A good heavy-duty chain (motorcycle security chains can be useful) and the best quality close-shackled padlocks (to resist bolt croppers) that you can afford need to be used.
- Ask residents of neighbouring properties to look out and report any vehicles / people loitering or taking undue interest in your paddock or yard.
- DO NOT be tempted to lock your horse in a• stable.
- If someone intends to steal your horse it makes it all that much easier, with the horse being in an enclosed area.
- It puts your horse at risk in the event of a medical or fire emergency.
- Report to the police anything out of the• ordinary.

then make a claim with PayPal, whereas Family & Friends payments are not covered.

Scammers are using this technique along with bank transfer payment to sell goods that don't exist & giving various reasons, i.e. cheaper price as there are no PayPal charges, so don't be fooled, you will lose your hard earned cash.

1: If you can't collect in person, only use PayPal GOODS & SERVICES payments.

2: If the goods don't arrive, make a claim with PayPal well within the 45 day limit.

4: The scammers set up new identities daily, new names, Email & Facebook profiles & use all sites & groups.

3: DON'T accept any excuses or reasons to use other payment methods such as 'PayPal Family or Friends' or 'Bank Transfer', no matter how genuine the reasons

Country Watch Western Weekly: -19th June 2014

Colleagues,

Since my last newsletter I had the privilege of escorting a group of Junior PCSO's together with PCSO Scott Walker from Totton neighbourhood team who is running the scheme. We took the group to Beaulieu Estate where the head keeper, Pete Stagg, did an excellent job of showing them around the estate and explaining different elements of the countryside and workings of the estate to them. A very informative visit for all concerned and we are grateful for the assistance given by Pete and Beaulieu Estate.

This week I held a meeting for colleagues and partners in the Blashford Lakes area, all interested parties including Angling Clubs, Water Companies, Environment Agency, Estates officers and the Wildlife Trust were in attendance to come up with a strategy to help deal with an increase in poaching of fish in the area, particularly on the Nature Reserve where there is no fishing permitted. The response to the meeting was excellent with all partners keen to help address the problems and all felt the meeting had been worthwhile. We now have a situation where all parties can look out for each other and warn their neighbours of any problems or issues – a bit like a neighbourhood watch scheme for the lakes.

The team had a visit from the HM Revenue and Customs, Road Fuel Testing Unit this week following on from the joint operation we ran with them a couple of weeks ago. They came and showed us their state of the art testing kits which are fitted into their vehicles. These kits can test and show up red diesel even when the diesel has been tampered with to remove the dye. The offender who was caught running a van on red diesel at our last operation, ended up having to pay £533 on the spot to be permitted to remove the vehicle – not to mention the need to have the fuel filter changed and the fuel system flushed through to remove all traces of the red dye. I'm sure you will agree it's not worth taking the risk. We will continue to run the joint operations both with HMRC and with DVSA as we have done in the past.

Of particular concern this week is the incident detailed below where a young lady walking her dog was followed and then approached by a male asking about her dog. When she returned to her car, a van with another male was parked so that she could not access her boot to put the dog away. She believes the males were intending to steal her dog, luckily, an NFDC van entered the car park at that moment and the males drove off in their van. Please be vigilant when walking your dog. Always take your mobile with you and call police if you think you're being followed in this way. I have heard a number of reports from other counties where peoples

dogs are stolen whilst out walking - generally when they are off the lead though.

Two dogs have gone missing, believed stolen, from a property in Oxford. The two dogs, both male, are 16 week old liver and white Sprocker Spaniels. Both the dogs are chipped and were wearing blue collars with tags. Anyone with information regarding these dogs should contact 07746308179.

2. ATTEMPTED BURGLARY ON RURAL PROPERTY?

On 23rd June there was an attempted burglary on an isolated rural property in Knowl Hill Common, Maidenhead, at around 4.35 p.m.

While the owner was cutting the lawn outside, two offenders are believed to have entered the house through an insecure door. There was someone else in the house who heard footsteps on the landing outside their bedroom, but thought it was a family member.

They called out several times, but there was no answer, so they went to investigate. They looked out of a window and saw two men, walking away up the drive. Nothing had been taken, but the owner was sure they had been inside the house.

CCTV footage from another isolated house nearby, shows two men approaching that house through the garden at 4.12 p.m., but the owner was alerted by the family dog which barked. The owner then challenged the two men who said that they were 'Looking for somewhere that sells animal feed'. The descriptions of the two men, given by both owners are identical.

The police carried out an extensive search for the two men and received other reports of two men, who also matched the descriptions given, that were also seen in similar suspicious circumstances, at another rural property, not far away in Burchetts Green Lane, Maidenhead at 3.45 p.m.. When challenged on that occasion, they said they were 'Looking for my Poodle'.

The descriptions are as follows:

1. A white man in a white shirt, approx 40 years old, bald with pointed ears.

2. The second white man was wearing a red t shirt, much younger - approx 25 years old, wearing red trainers.

The police have CCTV pictures of the 2 men. Were you visited by two men, matching these descriptions who were acting in a suspicious manner? If so, the police would like to hear from you, however insignificant you feel the information might be. To be in those rural locations, they would have needed a car. Did you see two men matching these descriptions getting into, or out of a car ? It doesn't matter if you did not get the index, if you saw the make model or colour, the police can trace it back via the ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) cameras across the area.

I would urge residents to consider security marking tack, which can act as a deterrent to any would-be-thieves. Thieves are less likely to steal valuable tack that can be traceable to an owner".

Suffolk Horse Watch Bulletin – 9th July 2014

Over the past week Suffolk Police have received reports of suspicious activity around rural establishments and fields in the IP10 and IP11 area. Discussions on internet forums and social media are speculating that horses are being targeted for theft.

Last week Police received reports of two white males in a white van with blue writing acting suspiciously at an equestrian establishment. The purpose of these males is not known. Overnight on 6th July it was reported that a pony had been moved from one area of a farm and had been secured in a nearby field.

Farm and horse owners should take this opportunity to review the security of their stable yards and paddocks. Anyone who observes suspicious activity around horses should note down as much detail as possible and report it to the police on 101. Time, date, vehicle registration details and descriptions of any persons involved are particularly helpful. Number plates of vehicles may be cloned, so a full description of the vehicle involved should be taken.

The reason is because it is visible it will deter thieves, but on the rare occasions when freeze marked horses go missing, it provides an excellent tracing facility, with no need for any expensive equipment to read the marks.
- Change your routine regularly and visit your horse at irregular times.
- Check perimeter fencing daily to ensure it has not been tampered with.
- Gates are often the weakest points in the perimeter and, as such, need careful consideration (field gates themselves are valuable and often stolen). Metal gates tend to be more secure. Gateposts should be securely cemented into the ground. Gate hinges need to have the tops burred over or welded to prevent the gate being lifted off. The gate should be kept padlocked at all times. A good heavy-duty chain (motorcycle security chains can be useful) and the best quality close-shackled padlocks (to resist bolt croppers) that you can afford need to be used.
