Advice received from Thames Valley Horsewatch WARNING TO HORSE AND DOG OWNERS

A 4 month old puppy was seen at a veterinary practice this morning with sudden onset blindness. It turns out that she had probably licked from a bucket containing Ivermectin horse wormer. Obviously the strength of the wormer means even a small amount can be a toxic dose for a small puppy. Please take care with your horse wormers, and wash out any buckets straight after you have administered any medication. Keep your dogs away from horse feed with medication in, and hopefully we can avoid this happening again.

Attempted Break Ins & Theft

This may be for poaching, coursing, using the filelds to access properties, raves etc Please keep an eye open and report any suspicious activities to the police on 101 and ask the operator for a URN number when you make the call.



The male is described as approx. 35-45 years 5ft 6in messy brown hair and has front teeth missing. He was believed to have talked with a local accent. At the time he was stopped he was wearing dark clothing and appeared to have streaks of paint on it.

Advice on post coding some of your equine equipment -

Horse tack/equipment can be marked by using a stamp kit, this can also be done on stirrups if the saddles are Synthetic. Bridles can also be security marked using the kit. This can assist officers if property is ever recovered from Warrants or when suspicious vehicles have been stopped and property has been seized.

Power tools and other items i.e. Lawnmowers/strimmers can be marked by either -

- UV Marker Pen– Postcode and property name/number is written on the property. It is invisible to the naked eye. But is clearly seen under UV light.
- Forensic coding Smart Water This item contains a unique code

Please ensure pictures are taken of your property, including serial numbers.

Bikes can be post coded using Security marking strips that have the postcode written down on. These are then wrapped around the frame of the bike making it very hard to remove. Bikes can also be security marked with either Smartwater or by using a UV marker pen on the frame.

Equestrian related crime has been low recently, however thefts of power and gardening equipment from rural establishments continue. In many cases the thefts are from insecure out buildings or items have been left out in the open. Most burglaries are committed by opportunist criminals who happen to see insecure premises where they can help themselves to the property inside. In most cases the burglary could have been prevented. By following a few simple precautions, you can reduce the chance of you becoming a victim of burglary.

- Fit secure locks to all doors. Always leave garages and sheds and outbuildings locked
- Be alert to strangers loitering; if in doubt call the police
- Never leave spare keys in a hiding place such as under a doormat, in a flowerpot or inside the letterbox
- Ensure valuables are suitably security marked; if not practicable, take photographs of valuable items and keep a note of any serial numbers. Register all items with serial and / or identifiable marks on www.immobilise.com
- Visible burglar alarms make burglars think twice; consider fitting an alarm to outbuildings and possibly a perimeter alarm. Get specialist advice and consult your insurance company.
- Keep any ladders locked
- Keep expensive garden equipment and furniture locked in a shed overnight or when you are away. Tools such as spades and forks can be used to lever open doors
- Provide good lighting and fit movement detectors
- Ensure trailers are immobilised with a good quality hitch lock and wheel clamps.
- Keep keys to ride on mowers, quad bikes etc secure in at home.

Warwickshire Rural & Horsewatch Bulletin – 23 July 2014

Please be aware of the following incidents, which have occurred at rural premises across Warwickshire over recent days:

Incident 292 of 18 July – Curdworth

Between 11.30am on 17 and 5.10pm on 18 July, offenders forced open a ground floor stable door at a farm premises in Curdworth and entered the property. Once inside, the offenders carried out an untidy but thorough search before making off with small electrical items including a notebook pc along with a rose gold engraved watch and items of jewellery. The burglary may have occurred between 3 and 4pm on 18 July as a neighbour heard a house alarm sounding at that time.

Incident 106 of 19 July - Fillongley

During the night of 18 into 19 July, offenders broke into tool sheds and containers at a farm premises in Fillongley. The offenders also entered a barn and caused damage to a shed door and doorframe. Several tools and other items were stolen.
