Theft of Anglo Saxon Stone Sculpture

North Yorkshire are dealing with an unusual theft of a unique Anglo-Saxon stone sculpture. Why thieves would want to steal such an item is best for them to answer. Disposing of the stone sculpture may create problems for the thieves.

Please bear the stone sculpture in mind when visiting antique sales, car boot sales, looking on Ebay etc. If you should come across something like the sculpture contact the police straight away. Remember the national dialling number for the police anywhere in England, Wales and Scotland is 101. This is for non-emergencies. The automated 101 voice informs you what to do.



Appeal following Theft of Unique Anglo-Saxon Stone Sculpture

Police are appealing for information after a unique stone artefact was stolen from a church in Hovingham, near Malton. Sometime between 23 May and 6 June 2015, offenders entered All Saints Church in Hovingham and stole a carved stone which was on display in the recess of a window. The statue, originally part of a stone cross, dates from the late eighth or early ninth century, and is likely to be contemporary with the shrine panel still preserved in the church. It is particularly notable for its ornate and accomplished carving. The stone itself is a sandstone from the quarries at Aislaby near Whitby, demonstrating the links between the Anglo-Saxon church at Hovingham and Whitby Abbey, which owned the quarries and exported stone for sculptural monuments to sites across North and East Yorkshire. The piece measures 51 cm high, 23.2cm at its widest, and 12.8cm at its deepest. It is very heavy and will have required a vehicle to remove it.

PC Nick Durkin, of Scarborough Police, said: *“Experts have described the stolen sculpture as unique in its form, layout and the quality of its carving. We are making extensive enquiries to return this important historic artefact to its rightful location, and I would urge anyone who knows its whereabouts to get in touch straight away.”*

Stolen Horses

At the time of circulating this bulletin these horses are still to be considered as stolen; the circulating Police Force have confirmed that there has not been any development.

West Mercia Police – Horse Theft Alert

A horse is believed to have been stolen from a field in Shiffnal. This happened on Saturday 5th September between 12.30 - 2pm. It is believed offenders have walked across a cornfield to reach a 17 acre sized field that is rented by the owner. They have then removed posts supporting the fence and have walked the horse across the corn field to a waiting vehicle, possibly a 4x4 with a trailer.

The horse is an 18 month old Cob, 13.2 hands, black and white with a grey patch on the side of its neck with four white socks. Its face is Black and White with a flash down the centre of its face. At the top of the flash there is a black spot.

Police are releasing images of a month old pony that was stolen in Aldenham in an attempt to locate him and identify those who have taken him. The Shetland pony called Cecil was stolen from a stable at a property in Summerhouse Lane sometime between 7pm yesterday (Thursday, August 14) and 7am today (Friday, August 15). PC John Phelan is investigating the burglary and said:

“Cecil is very small and would be very distressed to be away from his mother and the safe environment the stable offers. Likewise, Cecil’s owner is absolutely distraught with worry. Cecil is a very distinctive pony and I would urge anyone who believes they know of his location to contact me immediately. Anyone who remembers seeing anything unusual or suspicious between yesterday evening and this morning in the area of Summerhouse Lane should also contact me as they may have information that can assist our investigation.”

Fifield, Maidenhead, Berkshire

It appears that the offenders have gain entry to the farm through the main entrance gates. This occurred between 23:00hrs 12/06/15 - 08:00hrs 13/06/2015. They targeted a number of farm outbuildings, breaking locks to the buildings in order to enter. At this time the only item that appears to have been stolen from the out buildings is an old chainsaw. A vets' surgery located on the farm was also broken into - the entrance door was forced open causing damage to the door frame and lock. Once inside the building the offenders stole £50 from the cash draw of the till and some dog worming pills.

Fifield, Maidenhead, Berkshire

Between 12/06/2015 and 13/06/2015 offenders entered the farm via a metal gate which is accessed from Forest Green Road. The gate is a metal gate; the metal chain and padlock were removed and the gate was lifted off its hinges. The offenders then walked across a number of fields to access the main farm yard. Once on the farm yard they looked in a number of insecure out buildings and forced entry to the locked feed room - they have broken a padlock to access the store. Once inside the offenders ignored any high value items and only stole a crate of apple juice.

Didcot, Oxfordshire

Between 13/06/2015 and 14/06/2014 unknown offenders stole a John Deere Gator model 885D OU13CFK from a new housing estate and subsequently abandoned it in a field off Reading Road, Harwell. Upon police attendance it was apparent vehicle been hotwired.

fields and after cutting through a boundary fence. The property is situated on 32 acres of land. From the garage they stole a John Deere tractor (valued at around £26,000), a quad bike and a large sit-on mower. There are no further details for the stolen plant at this time. CCTV may be available.

Chesham United Football Club, Amy Lane, Chesham, Buckinghamshire

Overnight unknown offenders accessed a Kubota B2100 tractor stored on the site, and appear to have unsuccessfully attempted to jump start it. They also forced open containers belonging to the cricket club, although nothing was stolen.

Farol Ltd., Rycote Lane, Milton Common, Thame, Oxfordshire

At approximately 02:11 hours CCTV shows a yellow and green John Deere tractor index OU59AYO being stolen from the site (which is an agricultural dealership). The vehicle is not thought to have a tracker installed, and it has not activated ANPR in the Thames Valley.

Hanslope, Milton Keynes, Buckinghamshire

Overnight 14/06/2015 – 15/06/2015 unknown offenders accessed the farm by cutting fencing (and releasing sheep). They then forced their way into a shed and stole a yellow and green John Deere LT180 ride-on mower.

Ivinghoe, Leighton Buzzard, Buckinghamshire

Overnight 14/06/2015 – 15/06/15 offenders have entered a field adjacent to the solar farm in a vehicle via an insecure gate. They then cut a chain securing a gate on to the farm and made their way to the site manager's cabin, which they broke into via an insecure window. From here storage container keys were stolen; two storage containers were then accessed and a quantity of electrical cable and tools were stolen.

Warfield, Bracknell, Berkshire

At 02:51 hours the aggrieved was awoken by banging noises coming from the barn. He attended to see two males dressed in dark clothing on his driveway; they then made off in a vehicle described as a gold or bronze coloured Audi A6. A heavy duty strimmer had been stolen from the barn.

1. Horse-drawn vehicles (47 to 48)

47

Horse-drawn vehicles used on the highway should be operated and maintained in accordance with standards set out in the Department for Transport's [Code of Practice for Horse-Drawn Vehicles](#). This Code lays down the requirements for a road driving assessment and includes a comprehensive list of safety checks to ensure that a carriage and its fittings are safe and in good working order. The standards set out in the Road Driving Assessment may be required to be met by a Local Authority if an operator wishes to obtain a local authority licence to operate a passenger-carrying service.

Safety equipment and clothing. All horse-drawn vehicles should have two red rear reflectors. It is safer not to drive at night but if you do, a light showing white to the front and red to the rear **MUST** be fitted. Law RVL R 1989 reg 4

Safety equipment. Children under the age of 14 **MUST** wear a helmet which complies with the Regulations. It **MUST** be fastened securely. Other riders should also follow these requirements. These requirements do not apply to a child who is a follower of the Sikh religion while wearing a turban. Laws H(PHYR) Act 1990, sect 1 & H(PHYR) Regulations 1992, reg 3

Other clothing. You should wear

- boots or shoes with hard soles and heels
- light-coloured or fluorescent clothing in daylight
- reflective clothing if you have to ride at night or in poor visibility.

At night. It is safer not to ride on the road at night or in poor visibility, but if you do, make sure you wear reflective clothing and your horse has reflective bands above the fetlock joints. A light, which shows white to the front and red to the rear, should be fitted, with a band, to the rider's right arm and/or leg/riding boot. If you are leading a horse at night, carry a light in your right hand, showing white to the front and red to the rear, and wear reflective clothing on both you and your horse. It is strongly recommended that a fluorescent/reflective tail guard is also worn by your horse.

Before you take a horse on to a road, you should

- ensure all tack fits well and is in good condition
- make sure you can control the horse.

Always ride with other, less nervous horses if you think that your horse will be nervous of traffic. Never ride a horse without both a saddle and bridle.

Before riding off or turning, look behind you to make sure it is safe, then give a clear arm signal.

When riding on the road you should

- keep to the left
- keep both hands on the reins unless you are signalling
- keep both feet in the stirrups
- not carry another person
- not carry anything which might affect your balance or get tangled up with the reins
- keep a horse you are leading to your left
- move in the direction of the traffic flow in a one-way street
- never ride more than two abreast, and ride in single file on narrow or busy roads and when riding round bends.

You **MUST NOT** take a horse onto a footpath or pavement, and you should not take a horse onto a cycle track. Use a bridleway where possible. Equestrian crossings may be provided for horse riders to cross the road and you should use these where available (see [Crossings](#)). You should dismount at level crossings where a 'horse rider dismount' sign is displayed.

Avoid roundabouts wherever possible. If you use them you should - keep to the left and watch out for vehicles crossing your path to leave or join the roundabout - signal right when riding across exits to show

Dogs. Do not let a dog out on the road on its own. Keep it on a short lead when walking on the pavement, road or path shared with cyclists or horse riders.

When in a vehicle make sure dogs or other animals are suitably restrained so they cannot distract you while you are driving or injure you, or themselves, if you stop quickly. A seat belt harness, pet carrier, dog cage or dog guard are ways of restraining animals in cars.

Animals being herded. These should be kept under control at all times. You should, if possible, send another person along the road in front to warn other road users, especially at a bend or the brow of a hill. It is safer not to move animals after dark, but if you do, then wear reflective clothing and ensure that lights are carried (white at the front and red at the rear of the herd).

Report:

I would like to report an incident of fly tipping in Stonehouse Lane, Arley. I arrived at my stables on Saturday morning 13th June to find my driveway and gateway totally inaccessible due to the amount of conifer trees and hedge cuttings, which had been dumped there the previous night.

The stables and field house four horses. Two of them were due to compete at a show on the Sunday so I needed to gain access. More importantly I have a 30-year old retired horse that has not been in good health recently. It is imperative that I have access to allow the vet onsite.

I was going to phone the council but decided that would be a waste of time as there would not be anyone there and they would not move it for me on a weekend. Therefore, I had no choice other than to pay a waste removal company Â£180.00 to remove the waste, which amounted to two, skip loads.

After speaking to a neighbour she tells me she heard a vehicle reverse into my gateway and tip the load. This was at approx. 22.30 on the Friday evening. She cannot be sure of the vehicle as it was so dark and they acted very quickly.

This is an ongoing problem in Stonehouse Lane with the same waste being tipped in various gateways and a lay-by. I would like people to look out for neighbours who have a tipper/flatbed vehicle, which is full of conifer and hedge cuttings, but then leaves late at night and comes back empty. This person is clearly running a garden maintenance business and probably charging customers for waste disposal.

I have phoned North Warwickshire Council who have logged this case and I will be reporting this to the Police.
